Dear Lee County Commissioners;

Dr. Phillip G. Buchanan has served the Greater Pine Island Community for over twenty two Years. He has used his talents as an attorney, orator and writer for the betterment of our Islands, and we want to remember him for his numerous contributions.

He has been in many leadership positions of the Calusa Land Trust; in land acquisition and serving as past President. He has served on the Lee County Conservation 20/20 Management Subcommittee and has served on the Density Reduction/Groundwater Recharge Committee. He was a pro bono legal advisor to the Greater Pine Island Civic Association. He has been a spokesman for the GPICA sponsored Pine Island Plan. He championed smart growth to promote development that preserves the natural environment and rural character of Pine Island. He fought for the rights of our agriculture and fishing businesses. He was a respected member of the Responsible Growth Management Coalition. Phil brought land owners, CLT, GPICA and County together to acquire lands contained within the current Galt Island Preserve area. He was editor of "The Nature Lover's Guide to Pine Island". He served as an animal rescue volunteer for C.R.O.W. He was active in the Garden Club and practiced native plant landscaping. He wrote and promoted the Pine Island Golf Cart Ordinance. He was involved in the fight to renew the quality of our surrounding waters, and restore the aquatic life that has been destroyed by inefficient storm water systems.

Dr. Buchanan has been a pivotal point in the network of people involved in these causes. When the call came from concerned citizens over issues of destroying the environment or excessive growth, Phil responded. He has given his time and contacted County, State and Federal agencies to plead the public's interest. He has spoken at public hearings, written articles and given interviews without receiving personal gain for the benefit of those who asked him. The beauty and character of Pine Island has been saved and our land values have been increased, thanks to Dr. Phillip G. Buchanan.

The following Civic and Community organizations wish to preserve his memory and request that the "Galt Island Preserve" be renamed the "Phil Buchanan Preserve".


