1. REQUESTED MOTION:

ACTION REQUESTED: Approve a resolution for the conveyance of a portion of the Deep Lagoon Preserve, to the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund of the State of Florida (TIIF); authorize the Chairman to execute the attached Resolution and County Deed; authorize the Division of County Lands to handle all documentation necessary to complete transaction.

WHY ACTION IS NECESSARY: To assist the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) in meeting the requirements of a grant awarded to them by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to acquire and restore 744.4 acres within the Estero Bay State Buffer and Aquatic Preserve.

WHAT ACTION ACCOMPLISHES: Approval of the requested motion provides for the donation of 34.4 ± acres of County owned land to TIIF, and provides a partnership with DEP for the protection of Estero Bay State Buffer and Aquatic Preserve. Conveyance will be conducted in compliance with F.S. 125.38.

7.BACKGROUND: In 1976 and 1977, Lee County acquired title to two parcels totaling 258± acres for the Fort Myers Beach Sewer District project (FMBSD). The improvements associated with the FMBSD project are located on the north side of Summerlin Road right-of-way, which bisects the property. The remainder areas, located on the south side of Summerlin Road right-of-way, consist of 34.4 ± acres and are part of the Deep Lagoon Preserve. The FMBSD project did not require use of the remainder areas since they were primarily wetlands and located in an historic flowway known as Cow Slough. DEP staff contacted Lee County staff in 1998, when they applied for the National Coastal Wetlands Conservation Grant program, administered by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, regarding the possible donation of this part of the Deep Lagoon Preserve to DEP as part of the match. Lee County staff indicated to DEP staff that they were in favor of the donation, contingent upon the approval of the Board of County Commissioners, as it would allow the preserve to be managed as part of the encompassing Estero Bay State Buffer and Aquatic Preserve. The benefit of donating the property includes the provision for the management of the site by DEP, through funding the DEP has established under a management grant, as a component of the Estero Bay State Buffer and Aquatic Preserve. DEP is willing to install a sign near the preserve acknowledging Lee County's dedication to the environment through the donation of the land.								
The grant requires the conveyance to be completed by December 31, 2003.

Dear Mr. Clark:

I am writing in reference to the Cow Slough land acquisition and restoration grant awarded to the Estero Bay Aquatic and State Buffer Preserves office by the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service, National Coastal Wetlands Conservation grant program. As you are aware, the grant included "match" from both the State of Florida and Lee County. The match to be provided by Lee County is the donation of 34.4 acres of land from two Lee County parcels to the State. The "match" parcels are each a part of two larger Lee County parcels that straddle Summerlin Rd. Neither of the parcels was purchased through the Conservation 2020 program. The pieces referenced here are the portions of land (30.3 from one parcel and 4.1 acres from the other parcel) located only south of Summerlin Rd (see included map). The parcels will be included within and managed as part of the Estero Bay State Buffer Preserve. As required by the grant, all other acquisitions and match have been completed, including acquisition of the 710acre Zemel parcel. Other than some restoration activities and the final report, the Lee County donation is the remaining step for the completion of this grant, the total of which is valued at \$4,105,155 (\$1,000,000 from USFWS, \$2,925,075 from the State, and \$180,080 from Lee County). The \$180,080 figure was the value placed on the Lee County land donation at the time of the grant submission. We realize the actual value will be less and will explain the difference to the USFWS in the final report.

This donation will benefit Lee County as well as DEP. Both agencies, as well as the South Florida Water Management District, are interested in conserving and maintaining the Cow Slough hydrological connection. It is critical in terms of protection for the State's first aquatic preserve, Estero Bay, and for the citizens of Lee County. This donation will allow us to work together to maintain the slough's connection from Lee County's land north of Summerlin Rd., including some lands purchased through Conservation 2020, to the Estero Bay State Buffer Preserve managed by DEP's Office of Coastal & Aquatic Managed Areas, south of Summerlin Rd. The donation makes sense in terms of cohesive management with DEP holding title to and managing all the public lands south of Summerlin Rd., and Lee County holding title to and managing those public lands north of Summerlin Rd.

Please accept this letter as my request to bring these donations before the Lee County Board of County Commissioners for their approval. We are certainly willing to work out details of any Lee County requirement for this donation including formal acknowledgement of the donation through signage and/or other means. I trust that this Lee county donation makes sense to you and that the Estero Bay Aquatic and State Buffer Preserves office and Lee County can work well in this partnership to preserve 744.4 acres for present and future generations.





WHEREAS, Lee County declares that the purpose of this Resolution is to convey 34.4 ± acres of a County owned land to the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund of the State of Florida pursuant to a request by the State of Florida Department Environmental Protection in order to allow the Department to proceed with the acquisition and restoration of 744.4 acres within the Estero Bay State Buffer and Aquatic Preserve and;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 125.38 F.S.,the Board of County Commissioners has authority to convey County property to the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund of the State of Florida without advertisement and without compensation or consideration because the said Board is an authority of the State of Florida, and;

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has determined and is satisfied that the property is not needed for County purposes and that by virtue of conveyance to the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund of the State of Florida, the property will benefit the public or community interest and welfare and will continue to be in public ownership.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LEE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board authorizes this conveyance of said land as described in Exhibit "A" to the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund of the State of Florida without payment of any consideration therefor, and authorizes the execution of the County Deed for and on behalf of Lee County for such purposes, with the forms attached hereto and made a part hereof.
