THIS CONTRACT, made this _______ day of _______ by and between the CITY OF SANIBEL, FLORIDA, a Florida municipal corporation, hereinafter called the "CITY", and Ronald W. Klebart, a commercial contractor, hereinafter called the "CONTRACTOR",

WITNESSETH: That for and in consideration of the payments and agreements hereinafter mentioned:

- 1. The CONTRACTOR will commence the mechanical removal of exotic vegetation from City managed properties on an as-needed basis. The CITY reserves the right to direct that only some portions of the work be done.
- 2. The CONTRACTOR will furnish all of the material, supplies, tools, equipment, labor and other services necessary for the successful completion of the work described herein.
- 3. The CONTRACTOR will commence the work required within fourteen (14) calendar days after date of the Notice to Proceed on assigned projects and agrees to be available on a continuous basis within the contract period to complete the work as specified in the document entitled "Scope of Work, Mechanical Removal of Exotic Vegetation on City Managed Properties", a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment 1 and incorporated herein.
- 4. The CONTRACTOR agrees to perform all of the work as more fully described in the Scope of Work (Attachment 1), as follows:

Exotic tree removal or land contouring by heavy duty tracked root rake/excavator (trackhoe) including one machine and one operator:

Price per acre for projects under 10 acres in size: \$750.00

Price per acre for projects over 10 acres in size: \$650.00

Price per hour for projects under 10 acres: \$100.00

Price per hour for projects over 10 acres: \$90.00

Land contouring by heavy duty front end loader including one machine and one operator:

Price per hour for projects under 10 acres: __\$75.00

Price per hour for projects over 10 acres: \$65.00

- 5. This contract will be in effect from the date of signage to November 15, 2006.
- Payment for work will under this contract will be based on the per acre price unless otherwise agreed to by the City.
- 7. Payment for work done shall be in accordance with the City's Prompt Payment Policy, Sanibel Code.
- 8. This Agreement shall be binding upon all parties hereto and their successors, and assigns. CONTRACTOR shall not assign this contract without written permission from the CITY.

Mechanical Removal of Exotic Trees on City Managed Properties Scope of Work

The City of Sanibel is assigning a qualified contractor(s) to mechanically clear multiple properties of both privately and publicly owned conservation land of Brazilian pepper and Australian pine on Sanibel Island. Such properties will typically be dominated by exotic trees, often with less than 15% of a project site supporting significant areas of native plants. Any areas within a particular project site that are dominated by native plants or open water wetlands will need to be avoided by the contractor. Vehicles that are track mounted are necessary for work in wetland areas so as to minimize rutting of soils. Tire mounted vehicles are acceptable in drier areas.

The City anticipates completing multiple projects in the near future using a contractor and/or contractors utilizing several different types of heavy equipment as funding is available. In particular, all funding and permitting is in place for the Sanibel Gardens Preserve Restoration Project which will be started in Fall 2001.

Part 1. Root Rake work for Brazilian pepper and small to medium-sized Australian pines

The work will be accomplished by large, heavy duty tracked and/or tire-mounted vehicles equipped with root rakes and all trees within the area to be cleared (including scattered additional exotic or insignificant native trees mixed in with the pepper) will be completely uprooted and stacked in separate piles (not windrows) as large and as far apart as practicable. Following initial clearing the contractor is responsible for completely clearing vegetative debris laying on the ground and stacking same on adjacent piles using a front-end loader. Due to extensive wetlands at most project sites, large trackhoes such as Komatsu #200-size or equivalent will be the equipment of choice. Any excessive rutting is to be re-graded prior to completion of work.

Price per acre for projects under 10 acres in size: \$750.00

Price per acre for projects over 10 acres in size: \$650.00

Price per hour for projects under 10 acres: \$100.00

Price per hour for projects over 10 acres: \$90.00

Initial mobilization fee for each project: \$200.00

Part 2, Land contouring by heavy duty front and loader including one machine and one operator:

Price per hour for projects under 10 acres: \$75.00

Price per hour for projects over 10 acres: \$65.00

Initial mobilization fee for each project: \$200.00

For all project parts:

The contractor will coordinate closely with City staff members in order to minimize environmental impacts of the project, to avoid any damage to private or public property and to save significant specimen native trees or stands of trees within the areas to be cleared. Any gopher tortoise burrows discovered during the work operation must be immediately flagged and reported to the City's project manager. The City and other public or private property owners will be responsible for all necessary herbicide treatment of exotic trees following clearing.

Additional Conditions:

- 1. The contractor will not be allowed any extra compensation for work conditions with which said bidder could have become fully informed, but failed to do so.
- 2. A City of Sanibel Occupational License is required of successful bidder prior to award of contract. All contractors and any sub-contractors must be fully licensed and insured. All contractors must have at least one on-site holder of a valid City of Sanibel Vegetation Contractor Competancy Card or sign-up for the course and test to attain said card within fourteen (14) days of contract date and successfully attain the card within 90 days of contract date.
- 3. Additional tree removal and other restoration work, such as fence construction, earth moving, pond construction and debris removal may be added to the project by mutual City/Contractor agreement as field conditions warrant and funds permit. The price for such extra work will be figured and agreed upon based on bid calculations for similar designated tasks.
- 4. Contractor must comply with the Florida Public Entity Crimes Act and file the required affidavit.
- 5. The City reserves the right to cancel this contract at any time if the contractor is not getting the work required on any assigned project covered by this scope of work done effectively and/or in a timely manner. Such determination of effectiveness and adequate progress shall be made solely by City staff.
