The Lee County Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) approved the funding of the Small Quantity Generator (SQG) Program using an Occupational License Surcharge on May 3, 1995, as allowed under Florida Statute 4033.7225(12). The surcharge has not increased since its adoption although there have been a number of rule changes and modifications related to the definition of hazardous waste and the management thereof. In order

continue to meet the SQG program mandate, the program is being revised to better assess, verify and notify all potential generators of hazardous waste conducting business in Lee County.

Most businesses activity has the potential to generate hazardous waste according to the recent revisions to the rule(s) defining hazardous waste. As such, the SQG program's educational materials benefit all businesses in Lee County. These educational materials along with program information are distributed directly to the business community through program efforts, and indirectly using the internet, public events, and trade shows.

### 7. **BACKGROUND**: (Continued)

The increase in the number of businesses covered by the definition of potential generators of hazardous waste benefiting from program activities requires additional staff to meet the 20% annual assessment required by state mandate. Exhibit "A" (Options for Enhanced Pollution Prevention Program) provides several options for staffing and funding. The recommended option would classify all of businesses as potential generators of hazardous waste and automatically provide them beneficial materials related to proper management of hazardous waste or alternate materials/methods to use reducing or eliminating the generation of hazardous materials from the waste stream.

The selected alternative will result in four additional positions, one limited enforcement position to prepare documentation for enforcement actions, two additional Senior Environmental Specialists to perform on-site assessments and one additional counter person to assist in telephone interviews, database management, web page management, etc. The surcharge is proposed to be \$20 per year for all businesses, modifying the occupational license fee to include \$20 per license to directly fund SQG Program activities.

Staff estimates minimum revenues of Option #4, Attachment A, providing the SQG program an additional \$400,000. The proposed position and operating enhancement has been made accordingly:

# INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN LEE COUNTY TAX COLLECTOR AND LEE COUNTY REGARDING COLLECTION OF SURCHARGE FEES ON OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE OF POTENTIAL HAZARDOUS WASTE GENERATORS

This Agreement is entered into this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_\_, 2005, between the office of the LEE COUNTY TAX COLLECTOR, hereinafter referred to as "Tax Collector", whose address is Lee County Tax Collector's Office, 2480 Thompson Street, Fort Myers, Florida 33901; and LEE COUNTY, a political subdivision and Charter County of the State of Florida, by and through its Board of County Commissioners, hereinafter referred to as the "County"; collectively, "the Parties" hereto, for the collection of the potential hazardous waste generator notification and verification surcharge (hereinafter "surcharge") authorized by Florida Statutes 403.7225.

- 1. This Agreement is made pursuant to Florida Statutes 403.7225(12) (2004).
- 2. Lee County has duly and lawfully adopted Resolution No. 94-07-14, authorizing the imposition of an annual potential hazardous waste generator notification, assessment and verification program surcharge of \$20.00 to be paid by each firm or occupation.
- 3. The County has determined all firms or occupations are classified as potential generators of hazardous wastes obligated to pay the surcharge. The surcharge is an additional fee to be paid by the business or profession when obtaining an occupational license or renewal thereof. To minimize the cost to taxpayers, this surcharge is added to the occupational license; therefore, the occupational license ordinance and procedures outline the method for collection and distribution of the surcharge.

- 4. Information with regard to surcharge payors shall be furnished to the County by the Tax Collector in the same manner and frequency as occupational license information is furnished. The information required is account number, business name, owner name, qualifier name, business description, locations description, physical address, mailing address, and business phone.
- 5. The Tax Collector shall receive prior to distribution of collected surcharge fees to the County a fee for collecting the surcharge. The fee for collection of the surcharge will be included in the occupational license budget authorized by the <u>Amendment to Interlocal Agreement Between Lee County and the Lee County Tax Collector Regarding the Lee County Occupational License Tax Program</u>, dated September 29, 1998, as may be revised or amended from time to time. Distribution of net surcharge fees collected shall take place with the same frequency as distribution of occupational license fees.
- 6. The effective date of this Interlocal Agreement shall commence on January 1, 2006, and shall remain in effect until terminated by mutual agreement. During this Agreement, either Party may elect and upon ninety (90) days written notice by either Party, may terminate this Agreement.
- 7. This Agreement is made pursuant to Florida Law and Florida Statutes 403.7225(12). If any part of this Agreement is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the other parts of this Agreement, the parts of this Agreement being severable.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Parties execute this Agreement in their official capacities only and not individually, on the day and year first above written.

Option 1	Includes assessing 7000 new licenses projected annually, meets 20% annua assessment mandate w/ limited enforcement w/ 3 added Env Sr and One Admin. Does not meet the 100% assessment in 5 years criteria.
Option 2	This option moves the vehicle expenses to program reserves w/ same plus and minus as Option 1. Added staff the same as Option 1.
Option 3	This option charges all license holders a *fee (may be combined with the license fee). It may not be listed as a separate surcharge, but isincorporated into the license. Businesses would be screened and evaluated according to risk and potential. More general outreach efforts combined with Solid Waste's programs. Increase current staffing by 1 to facilitate screening and specific outreach efforts.
Option 4	This option charges all license holders a *fee (may be combined with the license fee). It may not be listed as a separate surcharge, but incorporated into the license. Businesses would be screened and evaluated according to risk and potential. Added emphasis is placed on enforcement with 1 with assistance from the Sheriff's Office. There will be less dependence on the enforcement specialist combined efforts of Solid Waste for outreach. This option adds 4 new staff, initial startup short-fall from program reserves.
