GOOD MORNING. WELCOME TO THE LEE COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MEETING. TODAY IS MAY 7TH, 2013. AT THIS TIME, I'D LIKE TO INVITE PASTOR JIM TO LEAD US IN THE INDICATION AND PLEASE REMAIN STANDING FOR THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE.

GOOD MORNING, EVERYONE. JUST BREATHE DEEPLY WITH ME AND TURN GENTLY INWARD TO FEEL THAT CONNECTION WITH THE ONE THAT IS THE CREATOR OF ALL. THIS IS A GOOD DAY, GOD'S DAY, A BLESSED DAY. FOR GOD IS PRESENTING A PROPOSAL TO US. WILL YOU WORK IN PARTNERSHIP WITH ME? I'LL BE WITH YOU; WHATEVER YOU HAVE TO DO I WILL HELP YOU. CAN WE BE PARTNERS TODAY? AND SO IN PRAYER, SILENCE, A SIMPLE ANSWER IS GIVEN, YES OR NO. THIS IS A GOOD DAY, GOD'S DAY, A BLESSED DAY. AND SO IT IS, AMEN.

AMEN.

I PLEDGE ALLEGIANCE TO THE FLAG OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA. AND TO THE REPUBLIC FOR, WHICH IT STANDS, ONE NATION UNDER GOD INDIVISIBLE WITH LIBERTY AND JUSTICE FOR ALL.

THANK YOU, PASTOR. THIS MORNING, WE HAVE FOUR CEREMONY PRESENTATIONS. AND WE'D LIKE TO BEGIN WITH COMMISSIONER HALL.

THANK YOU. I HAVE THE PRIVILEGE OF READING THE INTERNATIONAL COMPOST AWARENESS WEEK RESOLUTION. I HAVE SEVERAL FOLKS, IF THEY'D COME UP TO THE PODIUM. BOBBY ROBERTSON, ROY BECKFORD. STEVE HOTVOY. CHRISTINE BAILEY. KEITH HOWARD, LEE COUNTY SOLID WASTE. ANYONE ELSE I DIDN'T MENTION WHO'S ASSOCIATED. CHRIS, I DIDN'T EVEN SEE YOU THERE. GOOD MORNING. OUR PRESIDENT, THANK YOU FOR JOINING US THIS MORNING. ANYONE ELSE? IT'S CERTAINLY MY PRIVILEGE AND PLEASURE TO READ.

WHERE COMPOST IMPROVES SOIL STRUCTURE, REDUCES EROSION, DECREASES THE DEPENDENCE ON CHEMICAL FERTILIZER AND REDUCES WATER CONSUMPTION WHEN USED AS AN AMENDMENT TO SOIL. WHERE AS THIS YEAR'S NATIONAL THEME, COMPOST, NATURE'S WAY TO GROW IS A GREAT WAY TO PROMOTE COMPOST AND ITS MANY BENEFITS TO THE SOIL IN LEE COUNTY.

GOOD MORNING, COMMISSIONERS. MY NAME IS BOBBY ROBERTSON. I AM A MASTER GARDENER AND I AM THE DIRECTOR OF THE SUN COAST COMMUNITY GARDEN IN NORTH FORT MYERS. IT STARTED TO TEACH LOCAL CHILDREN THAT THEIR VEGETABLES DO NOT NECESSARILY COME FROM THE PUBLIC SUPER MARKETS. AND TO HAVE THEM PLANT, WATER AND HARVEST THE VEGETABLES AND CONTRIBUTE THEM TO OUR LOCAL FOOD -- AND ORGANIC LEAD COMPOST. WE GREW HERBS AND VEGETABLES UNTIL LAST MARCH WHEN WE WERE GIFTED TEN RAISED BEDS WITH IRRIGATION. THEY WERE FILLED WITH SOIL AND COMPOST. AND THOSE BEDS GREW A VARIETY OF HERBS AND VEGETABLES. WHICH WE HAVE BEEN ABLE TO SHARE WITH OUR LOCAL FOOD PANTRY. USING COMPOST HAS BEEN AN ADDED VALUE TO OUR SOIL AMENDMENT. SHOW THE PUBLIC THAT THERE ARE VERY MANY WAYS OF GROWING VEGETABLES AND HERBS IN SOUTHWEST FLORIDA. WE HAVE ALSO SHARED THIS PRODUCT WITH OUR NEIGHBORS WHO HAVE BEEN ENCOURAGED TO START THEIR OWN GARDENS. IF I COULD HAVE BROUGHT SAMPLES OF OUR PRODUCE, I WOULD HAVE. BUT AS THEY SAY, ONE PICTURE IS WORTH A THOUSAND WORDS. AND I OFFER THIS FOR YOU TO VIEW. THIS IS ONE CABBAGE AMONG MANY THAT WAS GROWN. IT FED 10 PEOPLE FOR EASTER DINNER.

DID LINDSAY GROW THAT? [LAUGHTER]

THIS IS WHAT I OFFER YOU. OUR GARDEN IS OPEN AND YOU ARE ALL INVITED TO COME AND HAVE A TOUR. AND I THANK YOU FOR YOUR ATTENTION.

THANK YOU.

THANK YOU VERY MUCH. [APPLAUSE]

COMMISSIONERS, GOOD MORNING. THANKS SO MUCH. INDEED AN HONOR TO COME HERE. ROBERT, FORESTRY RESOURCES. AS REPRESENTING THE PRIVATE SECTOR, I JUST WANT TO SAY YOUR PRODUCT -- WE'VE BEEN DOING THIS FOR TWO YEARS NOW. AND IT'S FANTASTIC. YOU HAVE THE BENEFIT OF THE PERFORMANCE IS TRULY A GOOD EXAMPLE OF PRIVATE AND PUBLIC WORKING TOGETHER. WE RECOGNIZE JUST EVERYONE THAT WE UTILIZE AND SOLD YOUR PRODUCT TO. WE'VE GOT A LIST NOW. IT'S WORKING GREAT, PEOPLE LIKE IT, THEY LIKE THE CONSISTENCY. AND THE SERVICE. BOTH LINDSAY AND KEITH HAVE BEEN REALLY WONDERFUL FOR US TO WORK WITH. WE JUST APPRECIATE IT AND WE WANT YOU TO KNOW THAT IT'S DOING WELL. THANK YOU.

THANK YOU, BOB. [APPLAUSE]

THANK YOU, COMMISSIONER HALL, COMMISSIONER MANN?

MR. CHAIRMAN, THANK YOU VERY MUCH. I WILL DEMONSTRATE MY GREEN THUMBS. I WAS REALLY ENTHUSIASTIC FOLKS. BUT WHEN YOU CLAP, I DON'T KNOW YOU'RE CLAPPING. IT'S MUFFLED HERE. HAVE YOU GOT ANYMORE BICYCLE FANS OUT THERE? BRING ALL THE BICYCLE FANS UP HERE. WE'RE GONNA TALK ABOUT HOW GOOD A THING BICYCLING IS AND HOW IT CAN HELP OUR BELOVED COUNTY.

THIS LIST JUST ISN'T LONG ENOUGH. [LAUGHTER]

IT IS MY PLEASURE TO READ THIS RESOLUTION STATING WHEREAS, MANY LEE COUNTY RESIDENTS OWN BICYCLES AND SURVEYS INDICATE THAT A MAJORITY OF SOUTHWEST FLORIDA DRIVERS RIDE A BICYCLE AT LEAST ONCE A YEAR AND OVER A THIRD RIDE A BICYCLE ONCE A MONTH. AND WHEREAS A BICYCLE IS RECOGNIZED AS A VEHICLE AND AS A VIABLE MEANS OF TRANSPORTATION FOR MANY TYPES OF TRIPS AND DESTINATIONS. AND WHEREAS NATIONAL HEALTH ORGANIZATIONS, ENVIRONMENTAL AGENCIES AND PHYSICAL FITNESS ACTIVISTS BELIEVE INCREASED BICYCLING TO BE OF NATIONAL INTEREST FOR HEALTH PURPOSES AND WHEREAS AN INCREASE IN THE USE OF BICYCLES IN PLACE OF MOTOR VEHICLE USE WILL CORRESPONDINGLY DECREASE GREEN HOUSE GAS EMISSIONS IN LEE COUNTY AND WHEREAS LEE COUNTY HAS AN INTEREST IN ENCOURAGING THE USE OF BICYCLES, INCREASING EDUCATION AND AWARENESS OF BICYCLE SAFETY AND WHEREAS SINCE 1998, LEE COUNTY AS INVESTED MILLIONS OF DOLLARS TO CONSTRUCT APPROXIMATELY 450 MILES OF BICYCLE FACILITIES AS PART OF ROAD WAY IMPROVEMENTS AND RETRO FITTING EXISTING ROAD WAYS. AND WHERE AS THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS ADOPTED A COMPLETE STREETS RESOLUTION ON NOVEMBER 10TH, 2009. AND WHERE AS THE MONTH OF MAY IS BEING PROMOTED BY THE LEAGUE OF AMERICAN BICYCLISTS AS NATIONAL BIKE MONTH WITH WEDNESDAY, MAY 8TH, 2013 AS BIKE TO SCHOOL DAY AND THE WEEK OF MAY 13-17, 2013 AS BIKE TO WORK WEEK. YOU'LL SEE ME BIKING IN FROM ALVA 18 MILES ON A BICYCLE. AND THE WEEK WITH FRIDAY MAY 17TH, 2013 AS BIKE TO WORK DAY IN LEE COUNTY. THIS RESOLUTION IS DATED THIS VERY DAY AND SIGNED BY OUR CHAIRMAN IN HIS ABSENCE, BUT WITH A FULL HEART AND TOTAL SUPPORT BY THE GOOD MAN. AND WE CONGRATULATE FOR BRINGING ATTENTION TO WHAT COULD MAKE THIS AN EVEN BETTER COUNTY. THANK YOU GUYS VERY MUCH. COME GET YOUR PICTURES DONE.

GOOD MORNING, COMMISSIONERS. THANK YOU. I'VE BEEN RIDING A BIKE TO SCHOOL SINCE I WAS IN 1ST GRADE. THAT'S HOW I GOT THROUGH ELEMENTARY SCHOOL RAIN OR SHINE. MIDDLE SCHOOL I EVEN ROAD RAIN, SHINE, AND SNOW. HIGH SCHOOL, I TOOK THE BUS. COLLEGE, I ROAD A BICYCLE TO WORK AND SCHOOL. THEN I TOOK A FEW YEARS OFF, MOVED TO LEE COUNTY AND STARTED RECREATIONAL RIDING INSTEAD OF RIDING WITH A CAUSE, I WAS RIDING JUST TO RIDE MILES. IT WAS A CHALLENGING THING BACK IN THE 80S, BUT I SURVIVED IT. AS TIME WENT ON, I STARTED SAYING WELL GEE I CAN SAVE \$50 A MONTH IN GAS MONEY JUST RIDING MY BIKE TO WORK. IT'S ONLY 12 MILES EACH WAY. SO I RIDE MY BIKE TO WORK. AND IN THE TIME I'VE BEEN RIDING MY BIKE TO WORK, LEE COUNTY HAS ADDED FACILITIES MAKING IT MUCH SAFER. WE HAVE MARKED UNDESIGNATED BIKE LANES AS BIKE LANES. I REALLY LIKE GOING DOWN OFF THE SIX MILE EXTENSION DOWN THAT OVERPASS ON THE WAY HOME NOW. I PICK UP SOME SPEED. EVER SIPS YOU -- SINCE YOU ALL ADOPTED THE COMPLETE STREETS -- IF WE ONLY HAD MORE MONEY WE COULD EVEN DO MORE. BUT ON BEHALF OF ALL THE CYCLISTS IN LEE COUNTY, I THANK YOU. AND WE WOULD LIKE TO DO ANYTHING WE CAN DO TO FACILITATE YOU ALL TO RIDE YOUR BIKES TO WORK ON BIKE TO WORK DAY. WE WILL FIND YOU BIKES, HELMETS, SAFE ROUTES AND PEOPLE TO RIDE WITH YOU. SO JUST GIVE ME A CALL AND WE'LL WORK IT OUT. THANK YOU.

THANK YOU. [APPLAUSE]

WE'RE GONNA HAVE TO START THE DAY BEFORE.

YOU'RE COMING ALL THE WAY FROM THE BEACH. GOOD FOR YOU. THANK YOU, COMMISSIONER MANN. COMMISSIONER MANNING?

THANK YOU, MR. CHAIRMAN. IF I COULD ASK SUSAN MOORE TO COME FORWARD. IF THEY ARE IN THE HOUSE. THIS RESOLUTION IS REGARDING CELEBRATING NATIONAL PUBLIC GARDENS DAY. IF YOU WOULD PLEASE COME TO THE PODIUM. WHEREAS THE LAKES PARK AND RICHMOND FOUNDATION CELEBRATING NATIONAL PUBLIC GARDENS DAY TO RAISE PUBLIC AWARENESS ABOUT THE IMPORTANCE OF PUBLIC GARDENS ON MAY 10TH, 2013. WHEREAS THE FOUNDATION'S MISSION IS TO SUPPORT LEE COUNTY PARKS AND RECREATION THROUGH PHILANTHROPIC AND VOLUNTARY EFFORTS IN SUPPORT OF RECREATIONAL AND EDUCATIONAL VALUE OF THE LAKES PARK AND IT'S CONTINUING EVOLUTION. TO INCLUDE A BOTANIC GARDEN. FOR THE BOTANICAL GARDEN IS A PARK THAT IS HIGHLY REGARDED AND ENJOYED BY THE

COMMUNITY FOR ITS BEAUTIFUL NATIVE FLORIDA ENVIRONMENT. IT'S PROGRAMS AND SERVICES, AND ITS CULTURAL EVENTS IN CONTRIBUTION. AND WHEREAS PUBLIC GARDENS PLAY A VERY SIGNIFICANT ROLE IN SUSTAINABLE -- BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS IN LEE COUNTY, FLORIDA ON BEHALF OF THE CITIZENS IN OUR COMMUNITY TAKE GREAT PRIDE IN RECOGNIZING MAY 10TH, 2013 AS NATIONAL PUBLIC GARDENS DAY. A DAY OF SPECIAL IMPORTANCE AND WORTHY RECOGNITION OF THE CITIZENS OF LEE COUNTY, FLORIDA. THANK YOU VERY MUCH. [APPLAUSE]

COME GET YOUR PICTURE TOOK FIRST.

PLANTS ARE VERY EASY TO TAKE FOR GRANTED BECAUSE THEY'RE EVERYWHERE. AT THE SAME TIME, PLANTS ARE EXTRAORDINARY BECAUSE THEY TAKE THE MAGIC ENERGY FROM THE SUN AND TURN IT INTO SOMETHING USEFUL. PLANTS SUPPLY FOOD FOR THE HERBIVORES THAT THEN BECOME FOOD FOR THE CARNIVORES. PLANTS USE THE CARBON DIOXIDE WE BREATHE OUT AND PROVIDE US WITH OXYGEN THAT WE NEED TO BREATHE IN. WITHOUT PLANTS, WE'D ALL PERISH. SO WE CELEBRATE PLANTS AT THE BOTANIC GARDENS AT LAKES PARK. WE INVITE YOU ALL TO COME AND ENJOY THE DAY WITH US. IT WILL BE A WONDERFUL EVENT. THANK YOU SO MUCH.

THANK YOU, MR. CHAIRMAN.

THANK YOU COMMISSIONER MANNING. I'D LIKE TO INVITE ALL THE LETTER CARRIERS TO THE PODIUM.

WHEREAS ON THAT DAY -- NONPERISHABLE FOOD BY THEIR MAILBOX. THE FOOD WILL BE COLLECTED AND IN OUR COMMUNITY IT WILL BE DISTRIBUTED BY THE FOOD BANK OF SOUTHWEST FLORIDA. AND WHEREAS THE FOOD BANK OF SOUTHWEST FLORIDA WILL DISTRIBUTE THE FOOD TO OVER 150 AGENCIES THAT FEED PEOPLE IN NEED. NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LEE COUNTY FLORIDA DOES HEREBY PROCLAIM MAY 11TH, 2013 AS LETTER CARRIER'S NATIONAL FOOD DRIVE DAY. IN LEE COUNTY AND URGES OUR CITIZENS TO PARTICIPATE IN THIS WORTHY CAUSE. DUELLY EXECUTED MAY 7TH, 2013 SIGNED BY HONORABLE CECIL PENDERGRASS.

THESE JOBS, FOR THE MOST PART, I THINK EVERYBODY KNOWS PROBABLY ARE NOT THE HIGH PAYING JOBS THAT PEOPLE LOST FOUR AND FIVE YEARS AGO. A LOT OF PEOPLE GOING BACK TO LESSER PAYING JOBS AND MORE DIMINISHED CIRCUMSTANCES. WE REALLY HAVE TO GET THE WORD OUT AND JUST SHOUT

IT FROM THE HIGHEST MOUNTAIN. WE NEED THE GENEROSITY OF THE PEOPLE OF FLORIDA. AND SPECIFICALLY PEOPLE OF LEE COUNTY. AND PLEASE REDOUBLE YOUR EFFORTS TO FEED THE MANY PEOPLE WHO ARE, IN FACT, HUNGRY. AND WE WANT TO THANK YOU ALL FOR THIS OPPORTUNITY.

THANK YOU. [APPLAUSE]

MR. CHAIRMAN, I JUST FEEL COMPELLED TO SAY THIS. THE U. S. POSTAL SERVICE GETS A LOT OF INK OF LATE. BUT IT'S IMPOSSIBLE TO OVERSTATE THE COMMITMENT OF THE U. S. POSTAL WORKERS AND WHAT THEY DO AND WHAT THAT MEANS TO THIS COUNTRY. SO I SAY GOD BLESS YOU AND ALL YOUR COLLEAGUES OUT THERE.

ABSOLUTELY. AND GEORGE DID A GREAT JOB. HE STOLE MY SPEECH. [LAUGHTER]

HE'S ABSOLUTELY RIGHT. COMING INTO SUMMER, IT'S EVEN MORE CRITICAL THAT WE HAVE THE FOOD SUPPLIES THAT WE NEED TO GET OUT TO OUR AGENCIES. EMPHASIS IS ALWAYS ON CHILDREN, AND SENIORS. A LOT OF SENIORS MOVE HERE AND TWO SOCIAL SECURITY CHECKS, MAYBE A PENSION. ONE SPOUSE PASSED AWAY, AND THEIR INCOME IS CUT IN HALF. THEY'RE VERY PROUD THEY'RE GONNA PAY THEIR BILLS. AND FOOD IS SOMETHING THAT THEY'LL PUT ON THE BACK BURNER AND THEY'LL GET A LITTLE SOMETHING. WE PUT A LOT OF EMPHASIS ON FRESH PRODUCE. COMMISSIONER MANN BRINGS US ORANGES AND TANGERINES, GENTLEMAN FARMER. BUT THE LETTER CARRIER FOOD DRIVE IS CRITICAL IN GETTING THE CANNED GOODS, THE DRY GOODS, THE NONPERISHABLES THAT WE CAN USE TO GET THROUGH THE SUMMER AND TO PROVIDE TO FAMILIES. THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE ALLOWING US TO UTILIZE THEIR PROPERTY FOR THE FOOD DRIVE. WE HAVE HUNDREDS OF VOLUNTEERS WORKING SATURDAY AT THE DIFFERENT POST OFFICES. LETTER CARRIERS WILL BRING IT IN AND THE WONDERFUL VOLUNTEERS WILL HELP SORT IT INTO CATEGORIES SO THAT IT'S PROTECTED AND KEPT IN GOOD SHAPE UNTIL WE GET IT OUT TO THE AGENCY. SO IT REALLY IS A JOINT EFFORT. AND THANK YOU SO MUCH FOR HELPING TO GET THE WORD OUT. PUT YOUR FOOD BY YOUR MAILBOX. THANK YOU.

THANK YOU. [APPLAUSE]

DISCUSSION? OBJECTIONS? ALL RIGHT, NEXT WOULD BE COMMISSIONER ITEMS. MR. MANNING?

NONE TODAY, SIR.

I HAVE NONE. ON BEHALF OF COMMISSIONER PENDERGRASS HE'D LIKE THE BOARD TO DISCUSS THE INTERVIEW DATES FOR THE COUNTY ATTORNEY POSITION. IT'S SCHEDULED FOR JULY 9TH. WOULD YOU PREFER TO CONDUCT ON JUNE OR AUGUST?

EITHER ONE JUNE OR AUGUST. I'M NOT GONNA BE HERE.

JUNE OR AUGUST AND NOT JULY. IS THERE A CONSENSUS OF THAT?

YES.

I HAVE RECORD OF THAT. I'D LIKE TO REQUEST THAT STAFF SCHEDULE THE VACANT PROPERTY -- IN THE JUNE M AND P. EVERYBODY ALL RIGHT WITH THAT?

MR. CHAIRMAN, IF I MAY, I BELIEVE THERE WAS A TASK FORCE THAT IS BEING FORMED PARTLY BY THE HORIZON COUNCIL AND BRINGING ALL THE STAKE HOLDERS IN. FROM A STATUTORY PERSPECTIVE, COUNTIES ARE NOT ALLOWED TO SET UP LOCAL ORDNANCES THAT HAVE BEEN BROUGHT FORTH BY MR. BECK. AND I DID NOT REALIZE THAT QUITE FRANKLY. SO WE'RE GONNA SWITCH WITH THOSE ISSUES. IF THE JUNE TIME FRAME IS DOABLE, THAT'S FINE. BUT I JUST WANT TO LET MY COLLEAGUES KNOW THAT THERE IS A TASK FORCE THAT'S BEING SET UP.

WHEN DO THEY EXPECT YOU TO REPORT BACK IN, MR. CHAIRMAN?

I DON'T KNOW. I JUST MET WITH THEM THIS MORNING, COMMISSIONER. AND THEY'RE GONNA TRY TO GET THIS OUT AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE.



THERE'S BEEN A LOT OF MOVEMENT. SO REGARDLESS OF WHAT THE TASK FORCE IS DOING, I THINK THERE'S OTHER BIGGER ISSUES FOR US. IF THEY MAKE IT BY JUNE, I THINK THAT'S GREAT. BUT I'D LIKE TO HOLD IT. OTHERWISE THAT PUSHES IT TO AUGUST. AND I THINK THERE'S INFORMATION THAT WE NEED TO HEAR FROM COUNTY ATTORNEY'S OFFICE AND STAFF.

IF THERE'S A CONSENSUS TO TARGET JUNE TIME FRAME AND THAT IF YOU'D BE KIND ENOUGH TO GIVE US A STATUS ON THAT, ON OUR MEETINGS AND MAKE SURE THAT WE'RE ON TARGET OR IF THERE'S GONNA BE SOMETHING DIFFERENT YOU'LL LET US KNOW AND MAKE SURE THAT STAFF HAVE TIME TO WORK WITH THIS.

IS THAT ALL RIGHT WITH EVERYONE?

YEAH, PERFECT.

I HAVE A NEW APPOINTMENT TO THE BOCA GRAND DISTRICT.

SECOND.

OBJECTIONS? COMMISSIONER MANN? COMMISSIONER HALL? DO YOU HAVE ANY APPOINTMENTS?
