Frank: I've Got It Ready To Go. Take It Down And Give It To Him Already. Let's Look At The
Recap. I Need A Motion To Defer Item 7 Until Item One.

Brian: Second.

Frank: So Moved. Adopted. Just A Correction Note Correction For The 5:00 Hearing Which Was
Not Previously Posted Correctly, That's The Hearing On The Ldc Code Amendment, Tonight At
5:00 Instead Of Today After This Meeting.

That's The First Public Hearing Of Two, Correct?

Frank: Correct. I Just Was Told By The Board, Mr. Manning, You Have One. One By Hamman.
None There. Public Comment On The Ballots Of The Items, I Have Several People Wanting To
Speak To Item Number 5. Dori Hitsman. You Want To Start Off For Us This Morning. Say If You're
For Or Against It.

My Name Is Dori Hitsman, I'm The Executive Director -- Better? I'm The Executive Director Of The
Bailey Matthews Museum. I Want To Thank You For Your Support Of The Funding. It Helps Those
Of Us Smaller Nonprofits Get The Word Out. If You're A Visitor To Florida And Just Looking For A
Nice Beach, You Have A Lot Of Choices. But, If You Want To Go Shelling And A Huge
Percentage Of Our Visitors Do, You Have To Come To Lee County, To Our Beaches. Your Money
And The Museum's Money Makes A Wonderful Partnership To Convey We Are The Shelling
Capital Of The United States And We Partner That Our Message And Your Message Together

Can Go Farther, Can Be More Effective And Can Persuade More People To Not Only Come To Lee County But We Hope Stay An Extra Couple Days.

Frank: Thank You. Susan Bridges. Welcome Up.

Thank You. I'm The President For The Center Of The Arts And I Would Like To Thank You For Your Support And Looking Kindly On The Arts And Attractions Grant. We Do A Partnering Program That Encompasses, Multi Channel Marketing Aspect. We Were Asked To Speak, People Are Asking Where Do The Dollars Go And What Do You Do With Them And Achieve With Them. I Thought I Would Share Just A Little So You Understand What Each Of Us In Our Own Way Utilize In Lee County With That. We Have A Multi Channel Marketing Project, We Incorporate Hotels And Retail And Restaurants. We Have Our Own Visual Art Programming With Two For One Tickets And Opportunities For Packages. We Market Those Out To Right Now 10 Countries And 22 Different States. All Asking People To Come Here To Lee County And Spend Their Time Here And Encourage First Time Visits And Multi Stays And Length Stays. So We Have Representatives In Each One Of The Businesses And Nonprofits We All Have A Point Person And Those Point People Put Together Those Packages With Counter Cards And When People Stay In A Hotel For Example, They're Given An Opportunity To Extend Their Stay At A Discounted Rate And Take Advantage Of Discounted Entertainment Pricing So They'll Think About Us And Come Back And Visit And Stay Longer And Come Back More Often. It's A Great Opportunity. It Is A Huge Amount Of Work, But You Put Your Trust In Us When You Approve The Funding And It's Important To Us That We Do A Great Job With It. Thank You.

Frank: Trish Leonard. Good Morning.

Good Morning. I'm Trish Leonard, Representing The Everglades Wonder Gardens. We're In Bonita Springs. We Want To Thank You For Our Support This Year With The Grant Help Continue The History And Environmental Principles At The Gardens. We Have Been Working Tirelessly This Year To Bring Up To Code The Facility. You Know What We've Had To Do If You Have Been There. We Want To Say Thank You For Your Support And Continued Support And For The Arts And Attractions, Amenities And Please Come By And See Us. We're Located On Old 41 In The Beautiful Downtown Bonita Springs And Come Back And See Big Joe. He Is Back. I Encourage You All To Come Out For A Site Tour And Come Visit Us There. We Also Have A Natural History Museum And Opening Up The Children's Educational Facility. So I Just Was Here To Say Thank You.

Frank: Thank You. I Bet I'm The Only One In The Room Today That Can Say I Was Proud To Have Met Both Lester And Bill Piper Who Opened The Wonder Gardens Many Years Ago. I Was Not There When It Opened But Pretty Close Thank You Very Much. Give Big Joe Our Best. Lydia Black. Known For Many Hats And Jobs She Wears And Performs.

Good Morning Commissioners. Thank You For Your Service To Our Community And Helping Us The Arts And Attractions Community A Great Place To Live, Work And Play. Thank You For Over

A Decade Of Support For The Arts And Culture Community. I Represent An Organization That Stood Before You 10 Years Ago To Advocate For Arts Inclusion To Dollar Funding. We Are Grateful To See The Dollar Amount Increase Over The Years And In The Forefront Of The Commissioners' Minds. A Lot Of My Partners Are Going To Talk About The Amazing Work They Do, Bringing In Additional Tourists. I Think It Should Be Come For The Beaches And Stay A Bit Longer For The Art For The New Slogan. Something I Don't Think Is Brought Up More Often, The Leverage Our Arts Organization Have Because Of The Commitment Of The County. When We Can See Our National Partners That Our Cities And Councillors Are Committed, We Can Leverage The Funds And In The Past 12 Months, The Alliance For The Arts Has Received Grants Because They Can See That Our Community Is Invested In Integrating The Arts In Every Area, The Economy And Strategic Planning And Development And Economic Development And Transportation. We're Very Grateful For Your Forethought In Making Sure Arts And Culture Is At The Head Of The Discussions. We Appreciate Your Support At The Alliance. We Had Over 4,000 Young People At Our Annual Fall For The Arts Event. It Was Fantastic To See The Cultural Diversity Out, The Diversity In Our Arts. And Thank You For Your Service

Frank: Thank You For Being With Us. Are There Others In The Audience Who Would Like To Speak To Item 5 Alone? Number 5? Come And Introduce Yourself Or Reintroduce Yourself.

Hi, I'm Robert, Artistic Professor. I Like The Come For The Beaches And Stay For The Arts. I Want To Thank You So Much For Supporting This Grant And We've Received This -- This Has Been A Huge Boost To Florida Rep. It's Such A Huge Economic Engine For This Area. I Remember When We Got Our Original Support From The City Of Fort Myers, Veronica Shoemaker Said If This Works I'm Going Hear Ka-Ching. Now We See 80,000 People Come In And Out Of Our Programs. We Have A Full Time Staff Of 50 People Who Rent Houses And Own Houses And Raise Families Here. Our Budget Is \$4 Million. I Believe The Numbers Make Us The Largest Not For Profit Art Organization In The History Of Lee County And 52% Of Our Audiences Go To Dinner Downtown Or A Restaurant Before Going To The Theater. We Know One Out Of Five Are From Out Of Area, Contributing To Hotels, Restaurants And Other Attractions. And Florida Rep Has Been Able To Bring National Attention To Fort Myers And Lee County. We've Had Articles In "The New York Times," "The Boston Globe." In A Review, It Was I Wonder If The Citizens Of Lee County Know How Lucky They Are To Have A Theater Of This Caliber. And Another Review, Called One Of America's Top Regional Theaters. It's Really, Really Wonderful. And I Must Say Folded Into The Program, Three Years Ago We Reached 11,000 Children. Two Years Ago, 22,000. And Last Year 25,000. And A Lot Of It Is Our Ability To Market. And We All Know Marketing Is Changing And This Digital Marketing Is Where We're Going. Thank You So Much From Florida Rep. And Thank You For All The Arts Organizations. I Really Believe We Have An Economic Impact And You Help Us. Thank You.

Frank: Wait A Minute Robert. You Have To Give Us Your Autograph Before You Go. It's Going To Be Worth Millions Some Day.

I'm Going To Win A Tony.

Frank: We Are Some Of Your Biggest Supporters And You All Do A Great Job At Florida Rep. We're Proud To Know You. Others Want To Speak On Item 5? Keep Coming.

Good Morning. My Name Is Phyllis Blanchette, We Are So Grateful For The Opportunity To Have Received This Grant From You Folks Because It Enables Us To Go To The Next Level That Is Needed For The Society. Most Of You Don't Realize That We Are Just Run By A Small Group Of Volunteers, We Are Not For Profit Organization And With That Being Said, There's So Much Happening In The Old 41 Which Is Where We're Located. We're Happy For This Grant To Allow It To Bring To The Attention What Is Needed, To Give Us The Push That Is Needed In That Area. Therefore We Can Go Forth And Have The Progress That We Need In That Area. So We Thank You So Much.

Frank: Thank You For Coming Up This Morning And Being With Us. Last Call For Item Number 5. Seeing No Additional -- Let's Take An Item Out Of Motion By Commissioner Pendergrass And A Second By Commissioner Manning. Is There Discussion Or Objection? It Just Passed Anonymously. You're Not Allowed To Clap But It's Okay. We'll Let It Go.

Thank You For Everybody Who Came Down And Thank You For Our Community. We Thank You For All The Things You Do.

Frank: Last Chance For Any Items On The Agenda That Somebody In The Public Came Here This Morning To Speak To Or Have A Concern About? Okay. We'll Take It Back To The Board Commissioner Hamman, Do You Want To Address Your Item?

Brian: Item 1 Removes The Fee For State Licences With The County Office. This Is All Information They Register At The State Level And In The Last Session, The State Made A Change To Law To Prohibit Government Agencies To Charge A Fee To Register The Licence Information Locally. Before I Move The Item For Approval, I Know We Have To Take Public Comment, But I Want To Thank The Staff For The Hard Work They Did On Making The Change. They Have Taken Good Care Of The Job Creators To Create The Right Environment To Focus On Running Their Business And Hiring People And Creating Jobs. The Less Red Tape And Fewer Fees They Have To Deal With Helps By Creating Jobs And Investing Resources Back In Employees. If You Want To Take Public Comment, I'm Happy To Make Approval.

Frank: Thank You For The Reminder? Back To You Commissioner.

Brian: Move Approval Of Item One.

Larry: Seconded.

Frank: And Anonymous Accepted. Item 11, Compensation Of The County Manager And County Attorney. Their Contracts Call For, I Hope I Say It Right, Annual Adjustment Of Between 4-6% But The Commission Needs To State The Percentage. I'll Accept A Motion Now.

Move The Item With The 6% Mr. Chairman.

Frank: A Second?

Second.

Frank: I Have A Motion And A Second That It Be Approved With At The 6% Level. Is There Discussion, Objection? Show That Adopted Anonymously Also. Now, I Would Accept, I Should Have Called For Public Input. Was There Anybody Who Wanted To Speak To The Issue? I Didn't Think So. Thank You. I Need A Motion To Approve The Balance Of The Agenda.

So Moved.

Seconded.

Frank: I Don't Think We Have Done That Yet. Well They've Had So Many Chances To Speak. Anybody Want To Speak On The Balance Of The Agenda? Thank You. See, I'm A Mind Reader. Is There Objection Or Discussion On Motion. Who Made The Motion? Manning And Hamman. Objection? None, Approved. Public Hearings, The First One, Councillor, Come Talk To Us.

Good Morning Board Members. For The Record, Andrea Fraser. I Have Your Ad That Was Published In The October 12th, 2016, Fort Myers News Press, I've Had An Opportunity To Review The Affidavit And Find It Legal For Public Hearing At This Time.

Frank: Any Questions Of Staff Or Counsel. Members Of The Public Here This Morning To Speak To This Public Hearing Issue? That's The Purpose Of A Public Hearing, The Hearing Of The Public. Back To The Board For A Motion. I Have A Motion By Manning And Seconded By Hamman. Accepted. Commissioner Manning, Committee Appointments.

John: I Have Two Reappointments. First, Deborah Reardon To The Neighborhood District And Ian Cornell To The Same Group.

Frank: Seconded By Commissioner Pendergrass. Shows Adopted.

Cecil: I Have Richard Staff Of The Community Action Neighborhood District And John Garrett To The Community Action.

John: Seconded.

Frank: Show That Adopted. Commissioner Hamman.

Brian: The New One Is City Affordable Housing, Al Jackalonie. Amy Maclauchlan.

Frank: Seconded By Manning. Shows Them Adopted.

Larry: I Have One New Appointment And Three New Ones. Maryan Briggs To Affordable Housing And James Roger To Construction Licences, James Pocklington To The River Improvement And Rebecca Hines To The Community Action Neighborhood.

Frank: Seconded By Manning, Was First. Show Adopted Without Objection.

This Next Week, The Annual Meeting Here In Bonita Springs At The Hyatt Commissioner Mann Accepted To Do It, If Any Of The Board Meetings --

Frank: Commissioner Mann Finds He Can't Be There.

We Just Need A Two Minute Welcoming To The Group If Someone Is Available. I Will Be Out Of Town.

I'll Be Out Of Town.

In Case Someone Can Do It.

Frank: Thank You. Johnny, Did You -- We'll Work With Staff And Get Some Cracker Jack Person To Go Down And Make The People Feel Welcome. Usually They Meet Across The State. Saint Augustine. We'll Get Together After The Meeting And Work On It. Not A Big Deal. Local State Officials And Deligation To Speak On Behalf Of The Area. Thank You.

Gentlemen, I Need Your Help And Support On Asking The Staff To Look At A Creative Solution To A Problem We Have In North Fort Myers And Downtown Fort Myers. If You All Are Familiar With The Bridge That Has Cleveland Avenue And Carriers Folks Downtown, That Bridge Doesn't Have Any Bike Lanes Or Sidewalks On It. But Every Day On My Drive Into Work, I See Folks Walking Over That Bridge Or Taking Their Bike Over The Bridge. I Did A Little Research Into This, In Order To Add Bicycle And Pedestrian Facilities To That Bridge, We Would Have To Go Through The Process Because It's A State Bridge, Get Just The Study, The Pd And E Study And Go Through Design And Construction And Probably I Think Odot Would Look At Replacing The Bridge At That Point. Even Though The Bridge Is In Shape. They Have Done Maintenance. All Of That Would Cost Tens Of Millions Of Dollars And Take A Lot Of Time. I Thought How Can We Solve The Problem And Get People On Bikes And Who Want To Walk Across The Bridge To Work More Safely? I Would Propose We Ask Our Staff To Look Into The Idea Of Having A Boat Stationed Somewhere In The Area Of The North Shore Park At The Foot Of The Bridge, The Boat Would Take People Who Want To Bike Or Walk Across The Bridge, The Boat Would Take Them Across The River And Drop Them At Centennial Park Or Someone Appropriate. I Would Imagine The Cost Of Running The Boat Would Be A Fraction Of What It Would Cost To Add Facilities To The Bridge. So My Ask Today Is Simple. Can We Direct The Staff To Review The Feasibility Of Doing A Service Like That To Get People More Safely Across The River?

Frank: Let Me Clarify, The New 41 Bridge? Not The Old Edison.

Correct. New 41 Or Cleveland Avenue. The Newer Of The Bridges Has Bicycle And Pedestrian Facilities And Used Pretty Heavily.

Frank: That's The Big Tall One.

This One Right Over Here.

Frank: Any Thoughts?

Go Back About 15 Years Ago, We Had Issue Of Pedestrians Crossing The Bridge, At The Time Before Reconstructing The New Bridge, You Can Walk Across The Bridge And When They Rebuilt The New Bridge, They Had Places For Bikes And Running. My Job We Were Called Upon To Stop People On The Bridge And Write Citations On The Bridge. So The City Did Look About 15-18 Years Ago About Doing Transportation. But At The Time, For A Boat On They Yankee Beach, It Wasn't Deep Enough. It Was A Little Cheaper To Do Trolley Service But I Don't Remember The Outcome. That Was About 15-18 Years Ago. They Looked At The Boat Issue And There Was No Place On The North Side To Land The Boat. But At The Time Though, That Bridge Was Constructed 41 Bridge. They Made Sure The Edison Bridge Was Accessible. They Do Have A Safe Passage On The Bridge. There's Like A Foot And A Half Walkway People Use And Carry Their Bikes. It's Not Safe To Walk Across. So It's Always Been An Issue And They Had Never Moved Forward. When I Was With The City, To Do Anything Else Other Than Transportation. Years Ago, They Were Looking At Transportation Of A Trolley Service.

Commissioner Pendergrass, You Bring Up A Great Point. We Just Approved The Matching Dollars With The City Of Fort Myers Of The Trolley Service Going Into Season. I Would Suggest The Feasibility Of A Pilot Project Using The Trolley Or Using The Water Crossing With A Boat Through Season, Which Is Our Busiest Time. I Think We'll See The Most People Try To Walk Or Ride Their Bike Over The Bridge, Do A Limited Pilot Project And See If It's Cost Feasible And I Would Imagine The Alternative Of This Bicycle Pedestrian Facility Would Cost A Fraction Of Adding On To The Bridge Or Rebuilding.

Cecil: That's When The Trolley Would Fit In Better With The Redevelopment, The Hancock Bridge Corridor, I Don't Know If You Would Be Able To Transform It. You Get People Downtown To See What's Across The Bridge. That Would Be A Great Asset.

Frank: I Don't Have A Problem Doing That. I Would Ask That You Include Other Locations That Might End Up Being Something We'll Have To Consider, Like A Few Other Bridges. The Same Situation Exists. I Would Suggest We Take A Look At All Of The County.

I Have No Objection To That. That's Actually Really Good Thinking.

Frank: We Have Just This Bit Of Conversation This Morning, Convinces Me There May Be Unforeseen Obstacles. It Could Be More Thinking But I Don't See Any Objection For Staff Pursuing This A Bit. To Come Back If It's Feasible Or Unfeasible Or Impossible Or Possible Or Alternatives That Might Be -- Are You Reading The Man's Mind?

Pretty Easy Assessment Between The -- Taking A Look At Some Options, Alternative Locations As Well Throughout The County, Services Might Be Used, There Was A Time Some Years Ago I Recall, There Were Federal Dollars For Demonstration Of Projects And One Of Them Had --

When I Worked In A Different Location, Used For Something Similar To This. I Don't Know If It Was Dollars Used Today But We'll Take A Look And Report Back.

Frank: It's In Your Capable Hands.

Thank You Mr. Chair.

Frank: Commissioner Kiker.

Larry: I Had One Item, I'm Going To Ask For Consideration On Two Different Items. The First One, I Want To Include, Would Be For Consensus And Direction For The Board And That Is That Most Of You I Believe Are Aware Or Have Received E-Mails Regarding Florida Fish And Wild Life Conservation Commission. They're Scheduled November 12th Or 13th. They've Identified Six Different Islands In Pine Island Sound, And Just Very Globally What This Means, It's A Restriction Of Anybody Entering Or Getting Around Any Of The Islands Within A Certain I Think 100 Feet. There Are Some Hidden Concerns If You Will. In Terms Of The Implementation Of The Plan. It May Not Have Been Thought Out As Well As It Could Be. There's A Lack Of Data For How The Decision Would Be Made. And I Think The Largest Word Of Caution Would Be This Decision Is Forever. There's No Way To Come Back On It. There's No Monitoring It Or No Way To Go Back And See If It Was An Effective Decision In Terms Of Guarding The Wild Life. So, What I Would Be Looking For Is Asking Staff To Put Together Some Of The Information On This For Discussion And To See If This Board Wants To Take Some Position On This Or Not.

Frank: Astairle Bay And Pine Island Sound?

Larry: Yes, Sir. It's Extensive In Our Area. Those Are The Ones That Affect Lee County. I Would Ask Mr. Chairman, Can We Get Consensus To Ask Staff To Work Up Information To Talk About Later.

Frank: Is There A Hearing Did You Say?

Larry: November 12th And 13th They're Going To Vote On It. We Would Have To Do Something Before Then.

I Think We Have Quite A Bit Of Information Already On This Issue. This Afternoon's Work Session Is Going To Be I Think Fairly Short. We Could See How Much We Need To Gather By This Afternoon To Have A Brief Conversation With You. If That Works.

Frank: At The Very Least, I Would Like To Know How Many Islands --

Larry: Six.

Frank: And How Big They Are And Where They Are.

We Have The Map.

Frank: Are You Talking About The Workshop By This Afternoon?

Yes, Sir.

Frank: That's Too Good Of An Offer To Turn Down.

Larry: That Would Be Great. And Secondly, Beach Access Parking Discussion. It Is Specific To All Of Lee Point Includes Bonita Beach, Sanibel, Etc Cetera. By And Large What I'm Talking About Here, We Have Exceeded Our Capacity For Parking For Public Beaches. And It Was Called To My Attention By Mr. Wagner, The Chairman Of The Parks And Recreation, One Of Our Volunteer Organizations And That Includes Working With The County For That Part, For The Most Part. It's Gotten To The Point Where I Believe This Last Week Or So Bonita Springs Council Was Talking About Changing Their Development Requirements So That If You Were Within A Certain Mile, If You Will, From The Beach And You Were Going To Put In A Hotel Or Whatever, You're Talking About Requiring Businesses Like Hotels, Etc Cetera To Provide Public Parking. And So When We Started Looking Into This, My Question Was, Where Are We Going With This. And We Really Don't Even Have A Five Year Plan On Where We're Going To Go With Public Parking With Our Beaches. And Obviously That's One Of Our Mainstays And Important To All Of Us. So Again, I'm Asking For Consensus And Direction To Staff To Perhaps Come Back And Assess That Situation, Provide Us With Direction In Terms Of Whether A Five Year Plan Or Something Like That Might Be Important. And Something That We Might Be Able To Plan And Act On. I Think Now Would Be A Good Time To Just Start The Discussion, It's Not Something We Have To Have Done By Next Week.

Frank: Commissioners? Do You Have An Understanding Of --

I Do. We Only Do Two At A Meeting From The Board.

Frank: That's A New Policy.

Just Kidding. Come On. We're Happy To Take A Look.

Not Funny Roger.

That Was Funny.

Frank: Gets Cocky.

Can We Go Back?

Frank: Respond To This By The Workshop This Afternoon?

We'll Take A Look And Execute Information For You.

Larry: That's All I Have. That's Enough Abuse.

Frank: We're Easy Today. Well, That Brings Us To County Manager, Have We Beat Up On You Enough. For Your Pay Raise, Do You Have More To Say?

Thank You.

Frank: You're Welcome On Behalf Of The Entire Commission. Are You Through For County?

Yes, Sir. The Work Session This Afternoon Is I'm The Conservation 2020 And Oil Gas And Mineral Rights That We Need Policy Direction On. Getting Rid Of The Rights Or Not When Purchasing 2020 Property.

Frank: See You There At 1:30. I Have A Luncheon Meeting At Lehigh And I'm Going To Rush To That And Back, If I'm A Few Minutes Late, Go Ahead And Begin. Councillor?

Board Members For The Record, The County Attorney's Office Does Not Have A Two New Item Limit At Any Meeting You Might Be Convened At. What Happened To The Team Work?

We're Endangering The Second 6%.

I Would Like To Say Thank You As Well And By Way Of Information, As Many Recall, We Were Set To Argue The River Hall Issue On October 4th, That Meeting Was Cancelled Due To Hurricane Matthew And Now Set To Make The Argument October 25th In Tallahassee. We Have Nothing Further Other Than A Thank You.

Frank: That Brings Us To Public Presentation By Citizens. I Have A Gang Of Happy Lehigh Residents. Chuck, You Want To Start It Off? Charles Edwards.

All Right. Thank You Guys For Listening To Me Again. I Know You're Getting Tired Of Seeing Me. I'm Taking A Different Tack On You This Time. As Far As The Chickens Go, In Order To Get It On The Agenda, Here's Something I Suggest We Try, Or I Suggest You Would Try For Us, Bonita Springs Did A Trial Program, It Lasted A Year, It Was Temporary. They Allowed A Limited Number Of Permits For People To Try This To See If They Were Going To Have Problems Or Issues With It. Why Can't The Commissioners Set Up -- Put It On The Agenda And Have An Open Discussion, Public Discussion On Whether Or Not We Want To Try A Trial Program. That Way All Of The Opposition That Mr. Pendergrass Says He's Getting Can Be Here And Talk And Hear From Both Sides. If It's On The Agenda, People Get A Chance To Talk. I Think The Trial Program Is The Way To Go, So You Satisfy Both Sides. The Against And The For If The Trial Program Doesn't Work Out. That's All I'm Asking Is Just Put It On The Agenda And See If We Can Give It A Try. I Appreciate Your Time.

Frank: Thank You For All Your Energy Devoted To Chickens. Teresa Park.

I Know You Guys Are Getting Tired Of Hearing From Us About The Chickens, But Honestly, It's Just A Way For Families To Feed Themselves, Knowing What's Going Into Their Bodies And Basically Knowing What's Going Into The Animals That Are Providing For Them. It's Not A Full Fledge Farm. It Takes Less Maintenance Than You Know, Basically A Dog. So I Know There's A Lot Of People In Lee County That Have An Opinion About Chickens And My Pastor Used To Say, Opinions Are Like Arm Pits, Everyone Has One And They All Stink. But It's Not Based On Factual Evidence. I Wish

We Could Hold A Public Hearing, We're Here Pretty Much Every Time You're Here Asking To Put It On The Agenda. We Know There's Opposition But We Don't Hear From The Opposition. Unless There's A Public Hearing Regarding The Chicken Issue, It Is Us Coming To The Meeting Talking To You Guys And Asking To Put It On The Agenda And You Guys Saying We're Kind Of Going To Wait For You Guys To Go Away. There's Never Public Discussion. If The Public Needs To Be Educated, We're Willing To Do That. There Are A Lot Of People Willing To Educate The Public About The Nuisance Violations And Comments About They Stink Or They're Going To Be Running Loose, It's Nothing Like That. Most Of People Who Have Chickens Or Want Chickens Are Responsible Human Beings. They Just Want A Way To Feed Their Families In A Way That's Responsible And In A Way That Saves Money Where They Don't Have To Leech Off The System. We Ask For A Public Hearing Where Everyone Can Be Heard. I'm Not Hearing From A Lot Of Opposition. I'm Hearing From A Lot Of People Supporting It. I'm Very Open To Discussion With People Not For It. Without That, We Can't Come To A Conclusion And Beating Our Heads Against The Wall. I Would Appreciate That.

Frank: Is It Hernandez?

I Just Moved Here To Lehigh. Like Everybody Is Saying, I Want A Facility To Express Our Like Everybody Is Saying.

Frank: Is It Your Sister?

Yes.

Frank: Yvonne. (Speaking Spanish)

Good Morning Everyone. I Support It Because I Have Two Chickens In My House. I Enjoy It. The Chickens Not Bother Nobody, No Complaint For The Chicken. Thanks.

Frank: You're Going To Have To Help With The First Name. Yahiya.

We Want For Them To Open An Agenda To Hear Our Opinion And Like We Said Chicken Same As A Dog, The Chickens Doesn't Bother And We Feed Our Kids And Know What We're Feeding Our Kids. We're Here To Support The Chicken. Thank You.

Frank: I Have Another Member Of The Hernandez Family. Okay. Would You Help With Your First Name.

I'm Dollya Hernandez. I'm Here To Support The Chicken. We're Very Concerned About The Matter. Like We Have Pets And We Have Other Types Of Animal S And Some People Use It Even Not Only For Pets But They're Support, They Use It Like A Therapy. Some People Have Pets As Therapy And Some People Use Chicken Like My Sister. She Loved To Take Care Of The Chicken. Everybody Deserves An Opportunity In This Life To Have Their Own Pet And Do What They Want. We Just Have To Follow The Rules And Everything. I Appreciate It If We Have The Opportunity.

Frank: Thank You. Oscar.

Good Morning. I've Been Here Before. I See No Resort What We Asking For, The Way That They Say I Use Like A Therapy, Helping Me In My Condition And Helping Better Than The Medicine, Which I Spend Almost \$400 A Month And I Have Spent Maybe \$30, \$40 Feeding My Chicken. I Buy 68 For \$5 Or Less. And It Lasts Two Months. I'm Looking For Something That Relax Me And Bring Me Peace. I Got -- Each One Has A Name And I Call It By Name. And I Take It In My Hand And I Say Good, You're My Passion. People Got Pigs, They're A Farm Animal. It's Okay For Me. They Love It, Fine. [Indiscernible] 40 Year Work. 40 Year Work. And Now They Say Remove Your Chicken Or We'll Take Over Your House. What? 40 Year On My Work And Now They Can Take Away From Me? Chicken In My Land. I Don't Say Get Out, I Say Modify, You Know. The Way That We Get The Opportunity To Get Chickens On Our Property, In Our Backyard. Go To My House. And Pet My Chicken, My Chicken Coop. I Agree With That. You Don't Have To Tell Me, Just Go. That's My Therapy For My Condition. I Like To Have The Opportunity For Me And Other People To Have It. They Love It. You Have To Understand. Citizens, Thank You.

Frank: Thank You Oscar. Carmon. Are There Others To Speak On The Issue? That's The Last Card I Have From Lehigh Folks.

Good Morning. This Is My Third Time I Come. Last Weekend I Talked To Some People About The Chickens, And We Want A Meeting. We Want To Discuss. Because Some People Complain And Some People Not. We Are Here, Never Complain About The Chickens. I Don't See Anybody Here Complaining About The Chickens. We Support The Chickens. My Daughter Loves Chickens. The Last Time I Talked To Somebody Over Here, They Said Not Allowed. I Understand The Law. But I Know Over Here Not Asking For Money. We're Asking For To Keep The Chickens. I Here Every Time, We Don't Ask About Money, I Hear That Every Time. Money, Money, Money. We Just Ask About Keeping Our Chicken. There's No Farm. These My Babies. I Call, They Come To Me. My Daughter's Friends Come In The House And Play With The Chickens. They Love The Chickens. 15 Or 16 Years-Old. You See Play With It. I Thought Keep Things, Not Allowed To Do It. These Kids Who Come In My House Love Chickens. They Love Playing With The Chickens And We Don't Use It For Nothing Else. There's More Danger To Have A Dog Who Gets Out Of The House And Bites Somebody. There's A Lot Of Dogs Who Do It. My Chickens Never Do That, And I Don't Hear Complaints From My Neighbors About My Chickens. I Live In The Middle Of Nothing. Please Give A Chance To Get Meeting With Whole Lehigh. I Promise To You, Nobody Complain Of Chickens In This Town. Thank You.

Frank: Last Call For The Chicken Issue?

Mr. Chairman, I Have A Question For The County Attorney's Office, Maybe You Can Get Questions Back To The Whole Board Or Me. Could We In A Very, Very Limited Number Actually Try -- So We Have 700,000 People In Lee County, Could You Do Like A Limited Number Of 250 Permits? Can You Limit The Number You Would Give?

No, Sir, Not Under That Context. The Animal Schedules Incorporated With The Land Development Contract And Based On Land Use Classification Which Was The Usual Concern We Voiced To The Board When The Issue Originated. We Would Have To Seek To Amend The Land Development Code To Allow For This Type Of Activity In Certain Districts.

You Couldn't Limit The Number Of Permits After That?

No, Sir, It's A Land Use Regulation As Opposed To Permitting Application.

Could You Limit It Based On Lot Size So You Can't Do This Unless You Have A Lot Bigger Than An Acre?

Yes. Yes. If That Was The Direction From The Board, We Would Look At The Appropriate Land Use Classification And Then Lot Size Criteria. If You're Interested In A Pilot Program, Ordinance Of Limited Duration. These Are Some Of The Other Factors Jurisdictions Have Looked At Previously.

I Could Conceive Of An Opportunity Where Somebody Lives On An Acre Or Larger Lot, Where They Could Possibly Have A Limited Number Of Hens, No Roosters And Not Be A Nuisance To Their Neighbors. So I Just Wanted To Share That As My Thought. Thank You Mr. County Attorney.

Conversation With Friends At The Feed Store A Couple Weeks Ago On This Topic. It Came Up, They Sell Feed To People In The Community. And That's How It Came Up Commissioner Hamman, About The Size. One Of The People There, A Customer With Chickens Says They've Had Them For Years Because They're In Compliance With Age Land. If You Live Off, You Have Chickens. If You're On Designated Land For Aeg. You Can Buy A Lot Knowing It's Residential And You Have The Knowledge Before Then. Same Thing In A Gated Community, You're Buying Within That Community. Knowing What The Laws And Regulations Are. If You Have The Home On A Residential Lot Knowing The Regulations, That's Why People With Chickens, They Just Don't Buy It In A Gated Community Or Where It's Not Permitted. We Buy Aeg Land To Have Chicken And Goats And That. If You Purchase And Want To Change The Land Development Code For The Whole County, That's Where There's A Conflict And That's What's Happening.

It's My District And I've Been Listening To These Folks. You Can't Talk Again, You've Had Your Thing Several Times Before. You Know The Rules. I Have Listened To At The Community Council Meetings Out There, At Least Five Meetings Now The Issues And At Least Three Occasions Discussed Here. It's My Understanding That -- And I Appreciate Your Willingness To Explore Possible Alternatives Just To See If There's Any Chance Of Helping Some Folks, The Lot Size, The People I Have Heard Speak, I Would Guess -- I Don't Know For An Absolute Fact, I Would Guess And I'm Probably Right, In Most Every Case They Live In A Single Family Home And 4-6 Units Per Acre. I Don't Think The One Acre Lot Size Is Going To Satisfy Even If We Could Pull It Off. I Don't Think It's Going To Satisfy The Vast Majority Of People Interested In This. Let Me Say This Folks, We've Been Fairly Open As Far As Listening Every Time You Have Come. I've Gone So Far As To Try To Suggest We Blue Sheet The Item To Have Full Input From Both Sides And Every Point Of View. These Commissioners In Addition To Myself, Have All Heard From Citizens, Mostly In Lehigh

And They've At Least From The Last Time We Had The Subject Up For Possible Action Seem To Have Formed Their Own Opinions On This And As You Know, And I've Said A Number Of Times, You Need Three Votes Up Here To Move Toward Any Change In The Ordinances We Have Today. And Unless I Hear A Motion And A Second Today, I Don't Have -- I Don't Want This To Be A Continual Issue That Just Brings Heartache And Disappointment To Folks When There Doesn't Seem To Be A Willingness On The Part Of The Commission To Take The Issue Up. I'm Being As Candid As I Can Be. I Think You Know I've Been As Patient And Helpful As I Could Be. At This Point I'm Going To Ask For A Motion To Pursue This In Some Form Or Another Or I'm Going To Take Up The Next Issue. Hearing No Motion, Thank You Very Much For Your Input, Just Not Only Today But In The Past. Maybe Some Way Down The Road Somewhere Down The Road We'll Find A Way To Deal With It. Apparently Not At This Time. Andy Rossman, You're Here To Speak On Smoke?

Good Morning. Andy Rossman Live In Lake Arrowhead In Fort Myers. I'm On The Civic Association, I Addressed The Board Several Weeks Ago About Burning And Awkward Smells Almost Every Evening In North Fort Myers. The Board Had Asked The Staff If The Staff Could Possibly Look Into It. Haven't Heard Anything From Anyone. This Weekend Was Particularly Bad. Sometimes You're Forced To Stay Indoors It's So Bad. I Would Appreciate Any Help Anybody Has. Thank You.

Frank: Any Comments On This? Has There Been A Staff Review Or Anybody Riding Around Out There With A Smoke Detector.

There's Smoke On The Water.

Mr. Chair? Forgive Me Right This Moment, Doug And I Are Talking, We Can't Recall What We Did, But We'll Review And Report Back. Usually Burning Is Just -- It's The Permits That Are Given By The Fire Districts And They Have The Authority And State Of Forestry And They're Controlled Burn Circumstances. People Are Supposed To Have A Permit To Do That. Most Of Which Is Outside Your Jurisdiction. We'll Take A Closer Look And Report Back.

Frank: Andy, Roger Desjarlais Is Going To Pursue This More For You.

And It Could Be Coming Down From A Neighboring County.

Frank: Our Great Staff Is Going To Find Out And Report Back. Are There Other Members Of The Public Who Want To Speak Of Any Issue Near Dear To Their Heart? Hearing None, Let's Have A Quick Work Session Update And Don't Anybody Leave, We Need To Hire An Airport Manager Before We Get Out Of Here. Roger?

Mentioning Earlier, 1:30 Workshop On 2020 Land Purchases In Oil And Gas And Subsurface Rights.

Frank: With That, We Are Adjourned In Our Regular Meeting. We Reconvene -- Sorry. Brad, I Didn't See You Show Up. You're Supposed To Whistle When You Get In. One Last Member Of The Public To Speak On Something Important. The Work Session Comment. I'm Sorry.

Brad Cornell. I'm Speaking On The Work Session Because --

Frank: Go For It.

So If I Understand Correctly, You're Going To Talk About Two Things, The One Is Oil, Gas And Mineral Rights And The Critical Wild Life Area. Two Issues For The Work Session? Correct. Okay. First, Thank You. You Directed Your County Land Staff To Get Appraisals Without The Rights, Which Was The Right Thing To Do In The Large Parcel, Very Critical In That Part Of Southeast Lee County. Thank You For Doing That. And My Understanding Is That They Have Just About Completed That Appraisal Process And About Ready To Move Into Negotiations And As I Understand, The Land Owner Is Very Interested In Continuing The Negotiations. So Thank You For That Pro Active Direction. On The Issue Itself, To Me, It Seems Like A Pretty Straightforward Issue. Get The Oil And Gas And Mineral Rights If You Can. But If You Can't, Our Concern Is We Not Pass By Important Conservation Land Opportunities Like This Farm And Other Properties And Other Land In Other Parts Of The County That Would Be Important Acquisitions, But For The Fact That We Can't Obtain The Oil, Gas And Mineral Rights Which Is Increasingly The Case For Whatever Reason, The Owners Have Been Hanging On To Those And Not Willing To Give Those Up. I'm Interested To Hear Your Discussion And Hope You Can Come Up With A Reasonable Outcome In Term Office Direction. And Lastly On The Critical Wild Life Area, This Is Something We Have Studied Closely. It Is An Important Issue, There Is A Great Deal Of Data And Analysis That Supports The Policies. We Have Lost More Than 90% Of The Wading Birds In South Florida Since The 30s. The Fact They're Congregating In Big Numbers Is Significant. That's Why It's Critical To Avoid Flushing, It Kills Babies And The Eggs In The Nest Both Pine Island And Sterile Bay. And I Will Note These Are Not Permanent Designations. If The Birds Move And No Longer Are Needed They Can Rescind Them. I Have Checked With Staff, It Is Rescindable And They Have In The Past. I Would Recommend Considering In The Suggestion Writing A Better Of Support In Lee County. There Are 50 Other Islands, 20 Others In The Sterile Bay. This Is A Miniscule Portion Of That.

Frank: Thank You Mr. Cornell. And Thank You For This. We Have Designated Commissioner Manning To Be The Liaison On This Selection Process For The New Airport Manager. He's Done A Great Job So Far And We Read The Information Provided Us And We Each Met With The Applicants Yesterday And Commissioner Manning, How Do You Suggest We Move Forward From This Point?

John: Thank You. I Had The Privilege Of Meeting With All Three Of The Finalists For This Position. The Limit That I Had Was Picking Out A Ranking Of One, Two And Three. I Have A One, One-A And One-B. My First Choice Is Mr. Muller He Comes With The Potential To Take Over A Vibrant Rsw. And I Would Suggest That Victor Right Was Close Behind As Well As Mr. Vanlow. However, If

The Board Has No Objections, Negotiate A Contract With The Ultimate Person And I Would Say Jeff Mulder And Fall Back To The Second Position If It Falls Through.

Frank: We May Be Making Up Our Rules As We Go Along Here. But I Think It's Going To Ultimately Possibly Require A -- I Don't Know. There May Be -- Quick Comment But Airport Staff Seems To Have A Suggestion On Procedure Perhaps. Could You Identify Your Very Active Self Here This Morning.

I Have Ranking Forms I Want To Distribute To Rank One, Two And Three On The Candidates.

Frank: If We Don't Have A Majority On His Motion, But We're Also In The Possible And We've Seen This Happen Here Before, If For Some Reason The Number One Person Decides Not To Come Or Something Falls Apart Or We Can't Negotiate An Understanding, We'll Need A Fall Back Number Two. We're Going To Need A Ranking Here No Matter What. Let's Look At What She Has That We Might Use. I Was Just Creating My Own.

No Choice On That One.

Frank: Commissioner Manning, Back To You. And What Do You All Think? Would It Be Best For Us To Fill One Of These Out And See What They Conclude?

That's Fine.

John: That Is Fine Now Mr. Chairman. I've Got Mine Filled Out. Where Do I Pass It In?

Frank: Now, John, Let Me Ask That You Get With Her And Tally These And Bring A Report Back. Can You Do That?

That Has To Take Place In An Open Meeting.

Frank: Can You Just Take The Mic Again Please And Read The Numbers Out To Us? Thank You Councillor. .

You Want Read One At A Time?

Frank: Yes. She's Way Ahead Of Me On This Folks. Okay. Now, I Didn't Sign Mine. You Don't Know Which One Is Mine.

If You're The Only One Who Didn't Sign She'll Know.

Frank: Am I The Only Vacant One?

Bob, You Look Good In That Seat There. Did You Kick Roger Out?

Frank: We Love To Hear From You If You Have Suggestions. [Indiscernible].

Consultant For Bringing Forth The Finest Candidates.

Frank: Folks Know --

For You All.

Frank: And Very Capable Wife This Morning. And Look, Let Me Say, I Know I Speak Before We Tally At All, I Bet Every One Of You Said This To Somebody Over The Past 24-Hours, This Is A Difficult Ranking. You Have Brought Great Applicants Here Doug. There Is No Possibility From My Perspective Of Us Making A Poor Decision Here. These Three Were Very Capable People And I Thank Them For Being Willing To Put Their Names Forward And I Wish Them All Well No Matter What. Now, Back --

Okay. I Have Mr. Mann With Mulder One, Vanlow Two And Wright Three. John Manning, Mulder One, Write Two And Vanlow Three. Cecil Pendergrass Jeff Mulder Two. Vanlow One And White Three.

I Have Brian Hamman Mulder Two, Vanlow Three And White One. And Mr. Kiker Victor White Three, Mulder One.

Frank: I Breathe A Sigh Of Relief. We Have Three For Mr. Mulder Ranked Number One.

Let Me Make A Motion, I Negotiate The Contract As By The Board Mr. Chairman.

Frank: Second By -- Then We'll -- Whatever Happens Here, The Negotiations Will Begin With Mr. Mulder. That's The Motion. Seconded. Further Discussion, Show Adopted Without Objection. Who Is The Mathematician To Tell Me Who Came Second And Third?

Mr. Chairman, I Think We Need To Rank The Next Two. They're Pretty Much The Same.

Frank: You Want To Do This Again?

Well, One Has 11 And The Other One Is 12. I Would Think You Would Want To Go After Who Is The Second Since We're Going To Be I'm Assuming Second Place For Negotiations If The First One Breaks Through. I Think We Should Find That Out.

Frank: So You're Suggesting We Take The Two Remaining Applicants And Vote On Those Alone For One And Two.

Yes, Sir.

My Understanding Mr. Chairman, One Of The Gentleman Has One More Point Than The Other One. That Would Be The Second One I Would Negotiate The Contract With If The First One Falls For Any Reason.

Frank: We Have To Negotiate Now.

I'm Falling Back To The Number Two Decision.

Frank: You're Trying To Determine How We Determine The Number Two Position And I'm Saying It's Not Clear. Any Suggestions From -- Other Commissioners? You Want To Take However The Numbers, And I Haven't Talled Them. Do You Want To Take Number Two Or Vote?

Point Of Order --

Frank: No Point Of Order Needed Here. We're Just Having A Discussion.

But Talking To Mr. Manning If That's What You Want In The Form Of A Motion, Whether Or Not We Want To Support That Or Not.

Frank: Make That Motion.

Second.

Frank: Is There Objection To The Motion? You Have Created The Rules And Your Motion Has Passed. Now Somebody Tell Me Who Is Second And Third.

Mr. Vanlow.

Frank: Does Everybody Agree On That? I Have Not Tried To Tally It. It Comes Out The Way The Sheet Came Out. Mulder, Vanlow And White. All Three Outstanding Candidates. Mr. Manning Do Your Thing On Your Schedule. Mr. Ball, This Isn't Your Going Away Party Yet, Thank You For Your Involvement And Fatherly Advices Moving Through This Process. We Would Probably Be Dragging Our Feet Until June.

Needs To Put Something On The Record.

Just For Airport Lawyer Wants To Put Something On The Record.

Point Of Clarification, As We Tally The Points This Is One Where Low Points Wins. Because Mr. Mulder Had A Total Of Seven Points. Three First Place Votes And Two Second Place Votes For A Total Of 7. He Was Number One.

Frank: I'm With You So Far.

The Second Place Finisher With A Total Of 11 Points Was Mr. White --

12 For The Second And 11 For --

Vanlow Had 11.

But The Lower Number Is The Winner. Mr. White Had 12.

Frank: I Just Added Them For The First Time.

Because Of The Placement.

You Add Them Up And There You Go.

Frank: That's What I Just Done And That's What You Understand. You Understand --

It's Not By The Calculation Of Numbers, It's By The Placement Of First, Second And Third. The Lower Number Is Second.

Frank: Yeah. We're Looking For -- Trying To Shoot Low Here. Just For The Record, Mr. Mulder Had Seven Points, Mr. Vanlow Had 11 And Mr. White Has 12. Mulder And Vanlow Were Number One And Two. Further To Be Said?
