

Find My Municipality

The above link will direct you to the “Find My Flood Zone” which is a live map app. This app provides the general public and other interested parties with current Flood Zone (Flood Insurance Rate Map) information within unincorporated Lee County.

The information within this app can also be used to identify the municipality for a specific parcel of land.

Within Lee County, Florida there are 7 municipalities:

- City of Bonita Springs
- Village of Estero
- Unincorporated Lee County
- City of Sanibel
- City of Fort Myers
- Town of Fort Myers Beach
- City of Cape Coral

To find your municipality, follow the below instructions:

- Click on the above web link
- Search for a property by using the search box
- For help on search functions, go to the help icon at the bottom of the page → 
- Please be patient, it may take a few minutes for the map to load
- Once the map loads, it will auto zoom to the property and a “search result” box will appear
- Click on the actual property/structure and a detailed information message box will appear
- The municipality should automatically appear under the blue bar of the message box
- If you don't see it, click on the white triangular arrow within the blue bar until it appears
- This sample below is for a parcel that is not located within any city limit, so it's considered to be in “unincorporated” Lee County (because it's in an area that is not incorporated)
