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Lee County Community Development July 2015 Permit Report

Fort Myers, Fla., Aug. 3, 2015 — During July, contractors pulled 94 permits to build single-family houses collectively valued at more than \$24 million in unincorporated Lee County. That compares to 117 permits issued in June and 97 issued in July 2014, according to the Lee County Department of Community Development.

Also during July, 64 multi-family units collectively valued at nearly \$7 million were permitted, compared to 292 in June and 50 in July 2014. The multi-family permitting included 40 units at Estero Oaks, 9930 Estero Oaks Drive, near the intersection of Estero Parkway and Three Oaks Parkway. All of June's multi-family permitting was for Six Mile Crossing, a residential and commercial development on the northeast corner of Ben C. Pratt/Six Mile Cypress and U.S. 41 South.

General commercial activity was valued at about \$1.7 million for 11 permits, compared to \$1.9 million in June and about \$9.4 million in July 2014.

Lee County Community Development issued 3,918 permits of all kinds during July.
