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Lee County Community Development June 2015 Permit Report

Fort Myers, Fla., July 1, 2015 — During June, contractors pulled 117 permits to build single-family houses collectively valued at more than \$30.6 million in unincorporated Lee County. That compares to 90 permits issued in May and 95 issued in June 2014, according to the Lee County Department of Community Development.

Also during June, 292 multi-family units collectively valued at about \$14.7 million were permitted, compared to 51 in May and 83 in June 2014. All of June's multi-family permitting was for Six Mile Crossing, a residential and commercial development on the northeast corner of Ben C. Pratt/Six Mile Cypress and U.S. 41 South.

General commercial activity was valued at nearly \$1.9 million for 21 permits, compared to nearly \$15.3 million in May and more than \$5.3 million in June 2014.

Lee County Community Development issued 4,286 permits of all kinds during June.

Lee County Community Development oversees planning, zoning, development and building services, environmental review, building inspection, and code enforcement for the unincorporated areas of Lee County.
