Lee County Community Development June 2016 Permit Report

Fort Myers, Fla., July 1, 2016 — During June, contractors pulled 116 permits to build single-family houses collectively valued at about \$23.7 million in unincorporated Lee County. That compares to 98 permits issued in May 2016 and 117 issued in June 2015, according to the Lee County Department of Community Development. Data for 2015 includes permits for the Village of Estero.

Also during June, 93 multi-family units valued at about \$14.5 million were permitted, compared to 26 units in May 2016 and 292 units in June 2015. The total includes 48 units in Creekside Preserve north of Estero.

General commercial activity was valued at about \$22.3 million for 22 permits, compared to about \$2.1 million in May 2016 and about \$1.9 million in June 2015.

Lee County Community Development issued 4,307 permits of all kinds in June.

Lee County Community Development oversees planning, zoning, development and building services, environmental review, building inspection, and code enforcement for the unincorporated areas of Lee County.
