Instructions: Florida's Public Records Law, Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, provides a right of access to the records of the state and local governments. The only exceptions are those established by law or by the Florida Constitution. Section 119.071(4)(d)2., Florida Statutes, exempts the home address and telephone numbers for certain public officers and employees and their spouses and children. In most cases, the photographs and dates of birth of these individuals are also exempt from disclosure. If you meet any of the following criteria your personal information would be exempt from public record disclosure.
