Portions of Fort Myers Regional Library to close temporarily for repairs

Services will be relocated to adjacent building on downtown campus

Fort Myers, FL, Feb. 24, 2025 – Portions of the Fort Myers Regional Library campus, 2450 First St., Fort Myers, will close temporarily for repairs and renovation beginning Monday, March 17, and remain closed six to eight weeks.

During this period, limited library service and programming will be provided in the meeting rooms at the library's South Building, located on the downtown campus at 1651 Lee St., Fort Myers. Services at the temporary adjacent site will include a collection of new books and children's books for check out and material returns including a 24/7 book drop and holds pick up. Wi-Fi is available on the north and south plazas. Select library programs will be held throughout the closure.
