Calusa Blueway Paddling Festival offers eco-fun and inexpensive adventure

"The Calusa Blueway Paddling Festival is now the premier ecotourism festival here in Southwest Florida," says John Kiseda, executive director of the Florida Society for Ethical Ecotourism.
