Later this month, Lee Public Safety officials will make a presentation at the International Academies of Emergency Dispatch conference in Las Vegas spotlighting the effort to use Geographic Information System (GIS) maps to make it easier and safer for first responders to reach people in need on Lee County golf courses.

The Lee County GIS Department spent more than 800 hours producing maps of Lee's public and private golf courses. The maps have each tee, fairway and green labeled so Lee County Public Safety responders will know precise locations of emergencies. Additionally, each location has a corresponding access point for the EMS units.
