OrganicLee[®] COMPOST NAMED RECIPIENT OF THE URBAN LAND INSTITUTE'S SUSTAINABILITY IMPACT AWARD

FORT MYERS, Fla. (October 5, 2012) – During the 5th Annual Sustainability Symposium held today by the Urban Land Institute (ULI) in Fort Myers, the Lee County Solid Waste Division received the ULI's prestigious Sustainability Impact Award for the production of its OrganicLee[®] Compost.

OrganicLee[®] is produced by composting yard waste and biosolids. These waste products are processed to create a value added product that is beneficial to agricultural and residential gardening needs. Processing of these wastes decreases the dependence on landfills and reduces the community's carbon footprint. Given the sandy characteristic of SW Florida soils, amending the soil with compost provides long term benefits to the areas landscaping and agriculture practices. OrganicLee[®] Compost is approved for use during the fertilizer block-out periods by both Lee County and the City of Cape Coral fertilizer ordinance.

OrganicLee[®] Compost has supported over a dozen of local community gardens and has provided educational outreach about the benefits of compost which includes responsible nutrient management, soil and water conservation, and recycling.
