Save the date for the 2nd Annual Island Hopper Songwriter Fest this fall

Award-winning, internationally-recognized singer-songwriters will entertain at the Island Hopper Songwriter Fest this fall on Captiva Island, Fort Myers Beach and downtown Fort Myers. The 2nd Annual Island Hopper Songwriter Fest begins Sept. 17-20 on Captiva Island and wraps up Sept. 25-27 on Fort Myers Beach. Historic downtown Fort Myers will feature mid-week performances Sept. 21-24. The free event takes place over 10 consecutive days and includes venues on the area's most beautiful barrier islands with a range of star-studded performers. Songwriters who have penned No. 1 hits for such artists as Garth Brooks, Brad Paisley, Lee Ann Womack, will perform at multiple venues. Some of the venues include 'Tween Water's Crow's Nest, Key Lime Bistro and Doc Ford's at South Seas Island Resort on Captiva; as well as Nervous Nellie's, The Beached Whale and Matanzas on the Bay on Fort Myers Beach.

Headliner, 2010 Rock & Roll Hall Of Fame inductee Terry Sylvester, started his musical career at the famous Cavern Club Liverpool in the early 1960s, often appearing with the Beatles with his first group, The Escorts. In 1968, he replaced Graham Nash in The Hollies. His first single with the group, "Sorry Suzanne," reached No. 3 on the U.K. charts and his first album "Hollies Sing Dylan" went to No. 1. In 1969 they recorded "He Ain't Heavy, He's My Brother," with Elton John playing piano. The song became The Hollies' biggest hit. Check <u>here</u> for a complete list of artists.

Hiking and horseback riding at Buckingham Trails Preserve

The Lee County Conservation 20/20 program opened Buckingham Trails Preserve to the public adding another site within Lee County Parks & Recreation at which people can hike and ride horses. The east Fort Myers site provides a newly built parking area and trail system totaling more than seven miles. There are 2.3 miles of hiking trails and 4.8 miles for both horseback riding and hiking. Equestrian use is prohibited on the pedestrian hiking trails to prevent damage to the historic features of the property. This 572-acre preserve features scrubby and mesic flatwoods along with several small wetland systems and cultural resources associated with the property's past military use. Wildlife species on site include the threatened gopher tortoise, Florida sandhill crane and the Cooper's hawk. www.Conservation2020.org.

Wicked Dolphin Rum and Lee Reefs partner for Special Operations Bionic Warriors

The USS Mohawk Coast Guard Cutter (CGC), a 165-foot World War II warship that is now a living reef thriving with exotic marine life, is still serving veterans and the community three years after sinking with the production of "Sunken Barrel Mohawk Reserve Rum."

For the first time in Gulf of Mexico history, a unique class of rum will be created using the atmospheric pressure in the crystal blue water of the ocean basin. This process allows the pressure of the water to squeeze rich rum syrup out of the barrel wood that will make a kind of rum unlike any other commercially produced in North America.

Five Wicked Dolphin Rum barrels filled with distilled water were sent 90 feet down to the USS Mohawk Veterans Memorial Reef recently and then raised 72 hours later. This batch will be used to craft the Florida distiller's latest offering: Sunken Barrel Mohawk Reserve.

Wicked Dolphin Rum and Lee Reefs have partnered to create the limited edition rum to benefit the Lee Reefs program and Special Operations Bionic Warriors - a foundation that ensures wounded, injured or ill U.S. Special Operations veterans/athletes receive state-of-the art adaptive sports equipment, coaching and access to cutting-edge sports science that will ensure achievement of their athletic goals.

Attractions

The historic Koreshan home in **Estero** has completed the cottage rehab where one of the "Final Four" Koreshans lived. The home of German-born Conrad Schlender, the tiny wood-frame building was likely built around 1900, then moved to the Utopian communal settlement in the 1930s. The \$50,000 restoration included leveling the foundation, repairing siding, windows and door and installing a new metal roof. A clattering stand of giant bamboo shades the little building on the grounds of the **Koreshan State Historic Site**, which offers visitors a glimpse of the lives the idealistic pioneers carved out of the subtropical scrub around the turn of the 20th century. Led by the charismatic Cyrus Teed, who renamed himself Cyrus (Hebrew for shepherd), the group planned to create the New Jerusalem. The **Edison Botanical Laboratory** became the first site in Florida to be designated by the American Chemical Society as a **National Historic Chemical Landmark**. The American Chemical Society established the National Historic Chemical Landmarks program in 1992 to recognize important achievements in the history of the chemical sciences. Achievements recognized through this program have included the discovery and development of penicillin and the work of historical figures such as George Washington Carver and Rachel Carson.

The project to restore the 1928 Edison Botanical Laboratory was led by Edison Ford staff and consultants, which included a very diverse group of university professors, scientists, industrial engineers and retired trade workers from the industrial machine shops of the past. The three-year restoration with overall funding of more than \$1 million provided building stabilization, restoration of exterior siding, windows and roof, state-of-the-art fire suppression and alarm systems, and new building access. Historical documents and photographs were used by the Edison & Ford Winter Estates research team to correctly place items in the laboratory.

The historic **Everglades Wonder Gardens** has reopened in **Bonita Springs** following a change in ownership and a renovation. Opening in 1936, the gardens offer a piece of Florida history to visitors who may tour one of Florida's original roadside attractions. Wander the newly-created paths, see pink flamingos, alligators, a swinging bridge and a butterfly garden.
