Subject: Babcock Ranch- Request for Sharing of Appraisal Cost

I have been in review of your correspondence with Ken Daw, Chief Appraiser with the South Florida Water Management District ("SFWMD") regarding the contracting of two independent appraisal firms to develop appraisal reports on the Babcock Ranch property located in Lee and Charlotte Counties. Thank you for your assistance and cooperation on behalf of Lee County in pursuing a cost sharing agreement with the South Florida Water Management District as a funding partner and contract manager for appraisal services connected with the proposed acquisition of the Babcock property.

This letter will serve as a formal request to Lee County from the SFWMD, seeking a 50% participation in the appraisal costs to be incurred by the District and the Florida Department of Environmental Services. The two contracts (one to SFWMD and one to FDEP) total \$160,100, resulting in a proposed cost share from Lee County of \$80,050. Lee County will transfer \$80,050, made payable to South Florida Water Management District at the time the appraisals are received, reviewed and approved by the District.

As one of the funding partners in the proposed acquisition of the Babcock property, Lee County will be given access to the reviewed appraisal reports and review documents. Additionally, both appraisers will be requested to provide a separate allocation of the value estimate for the entire Babcock Ranch property into the portions lying in Lee County and Charlotte Counties.

On behalf of the management team at South Florida Water Management District, we look forward to continuing our cooperative and productive partnership with Lee County.
