- 1. ACTION REQUESTED/PURPOSE: Approve submittal of a FY 05/06 State Infrastructure Bank (SIB) loan application for \$4.8 million for the construction phase of the four-laning of Three Oaks Parkway between orkscrew Road and Alico Road (#4081), and authorize the Chairwoman to execute a resolution committing to repay the loan with minimal interest in FY 09/10 from District 24 road impact fees. Also approval submittal of a FY 06/07 SIB loan application for \$14,575,500 for the construction phase of the six-laning of Summerlin Road from Cypress Lake Drive to Boyscout Road (including an overpass at College Parkway #6007), and authorize the Chairwoman to execute a resolution committing to repay the loan with minimal interest in FY 09/10 from District 23 road impact fees.
- 2. WHAT ACTION ACCOMPLISHES: Authorizes pursuit of a low interest loan to fund the Three Oaks Parkway four-lane and Summerlin Road six-lane construction phases, thereby freeing up road impact fee funds to address other project needs. Execution of resolution satisfies FDOT requirements regarding repayments using local funding sources.

#### . Background:

DOT has recently announced that the deadline for submitting applications for SIB loans related to the Transportation Regional Incentive Program (TRIP) was extended to December 16, 2005, and that there was still \$40 million unallocated in that program. Projects can be awarded up to 75% of a phase cost. Lee County has already been tentatively awarded \$3.25 million under this program for the Colonial Boulevard six-laning between I-75 and SR 82. Eligible projects must meet the criteria for TRIP funding, including being on a joint regional priority list, and Lee County has two potential projects on the priority list adopted in September by the Lee and Collier MPO's. Staff is proposing to submit two on-line applications for state-funded TRIP SIB loans for a total of \$19,373,500, to help fund the Three Oaks Parkway four-lane construction phase in FY 05/06 and the Summerlin Road six-lane construction phase in FY 06/07 (as currently programmed in the County's CIP). The loans, with a proposed repayment in FY 09/10 at minimal interest, would allow the Three Oaks Widening project to proceed on schedule without robbing funds from another project as anticipated in the CIP, and would allow DOT to further advance the right-of-way and construction phases for the Ortiz Avenue project between Luckett Road and SR 80 by another year to FYs 06/07 and 07/08 respectively, providing an improved I-75 reliever sooner. The County could also pursue other project advancements in the upcoming CIP update.

The state's SIB Guidelines, Section (2)(f), say that if local funds are committed to repay the loan (such as road impact fees), then the applicant must provide proof of commitment of these funds through a BOCC resolution. The Board is asked to authorize execution of the attached resolutions committing to the repayment of the loans using District 23 and District 24 road impact fees. If the application is successful, staff will return to the Board for execution of the necessary agreements and amendments of the CIP.
