Lee County closes Multi-Agency Resource Center; assistance remains available for tornado recovery effort

Fort Myers, FL, Jan. 31, 2022 – Lee County on Tuesday will close its Multi-Agency Resource Center that was set up to aid residents impacted by the Jan. 16 tornado, but assistance from county staff and partners will remains available.

Lee County staff and partnering agencies have successfully completed about 170 needs assessments and have collaboratively developed an outreach plan for individuals that will continue.

Impacted residents who need to rebuild post-storm can contact the Lee County Department of Community Development. Each damaged home presents a unique situation. Residents are encouraged to talk with staff before beginning to rebuild and should ensure any contractors they hire are licensed and insured.

The storm destroyed 74 homes; another 61 homes incurred major damage.

The Multi-Agency Resource Center opened Jan. 22 and will close at noon Tuesday. The center was located at the Wa-Ke Hatchee Recreation Center in south Fort Myers near the impacted area.

It featured organizations such as the American Red Cross, Lee County Human & Veteran Services, the Lee County Tax Collector, the Salvation Army, Harry Chapin Food Bank, Goodwill Industries of Southwest Florida, United Way, the Florida Conference of the United Methodist Church Disaster Recovery Ministry, Catholic Charities, Area Agency on Aging, the Jewish Federation of Lee and Charlotte Counties, the Florida Department of Veteran's Affairs and the Florida Department of Financial Services.
