SECTION I - SAFETY

The Applicant agrees to provide adequate traffic and crowd control, emergency medical services and any other items, at the Applicant's expense, required by Lee County to protect the health, safety and welfare of the public. Lee County shall have the power to review the proposal and require, as necessary, detailed plans, diagrams, and explanations to clearly outline to Lee County, exactly what the Applicant is proposing.

SECTION II - INSURANCE

The Applicant, at its sole expense, agrees to procure and maintain in force during the entire term of the application, liability insurance in the amounts determined by Lee County Risk Management to protect against damages or other claims arising from use of County property by the applicant or its guests. Other limits may also be established by Lee County Risk Management for events which will be serving or consuming alcoholic beverages at approved County property. The insurance policy must also include coverage for Applicant's contingent liability on damages, claims or losses. "Lee County Board of County Commissioners" must be named as "additional insured" on the Certificate of Insurance, and the Certificate must be delivered to Lee County prior to Applicant's use of the property. The Insurance may not be canceled during the term of the event, if this occurs, the County has the right to revoke approvals related to use of the County property for the event, without recourse by the applicant.

SECTION III - INDEMNIFICATION

The Applicant agrees to indemnify, release and save harmless Lee County against any and all claims, costs, demands, damages, judgments or injuries of any nature arising from the conduct or management of, or from any work or thing whatsoever done in or about said Lee County property or any building or structure appurtenant thereto or equipment thereof during the term of this Permit, or arising during such term from any act of negligence of the Applicant, Applicant's agents, contractors, or employees, or arising from any accident, injury, or damage whatsoever, however caused, to any person or persons, or to any property of any person, persons, corporation or corporations, occurring during the term of this agreement on, in, or about said Lee County property, and from and against all costs, attorney's fees, expenses and liabilities occurring in connection with any such claim or any action or proceeding brought thereon.

For film permit applicants: The permittee shall have on-site a responsible representative empowered with authority over the filming director, filming crews, participants and filming operation. Permittee shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the county, its officers, agents and employees from and against all claims, suits, actions, damages, liabilities, expenditures or causes of action of any kind arising out of or occurring during the activities of the permittee, and resulting or occurring from any negligent act, omission or error of permittee, resulting in or relating to injuries to body, life, limb or property sustained in, about or upon the permitted permises or improvement thereto, or arising from the use of the premises.

SECTION IV - DELIVERY, ACCEPTANCE AND SURRENDER OF PREMISES

The Applicant agrees to accept the County property on possession as being in a satisfactory state of repair and in sanitary condition.

The Applicant must surrender the premises to Lee County in the same condition as when Applicant takes possession, allowing for reasonable use and wear, and damage by acts of God. Applicant agrees to remove all business signs or symbols placed on the premises by the Applicant before redelivery of the premises to Lee County, and restore the premises to the condition in which it existed before their placement. Any signs and markings created or used in connection with this event must be temporary and removable; painting roadways, trees or any other fixed object is strictly prohibited. Applicant agrees to clear the Lee County property of litter at the close of the event.

The Lee County Sheriff's Office is signing this permit application based on the events as they are outlined within this application. Any deviations from the plans after this application is signed off upon must be submitted in writing prior to the event and agreed upon between all entities involved in this process.

Parking:

There will be several areas offering off-site parking, public and paid options available with trolley service for various days/ events. All parking will be within authorized areas only and the right-of-way will not be impeded in any parking or event area. If off-site parking is going to be offered, permission letters for off-site parking areas included in the permit packet. Aside from public parking areas, these are the only areas that the event coordinator has been given permission to use. If additional off-site areas are added prior to the event, it is the responsibility of the vendor/ event coordinator to notify all entities of the additions and to supply permission letters.

Deputies (How Many?):

Thursday October 7, 2019 - Dry Pits Public Viewing

Traffic Detail: 1030a-630p

4 deputies posted at Main St and San Carlos, Salty Sam's main entrance for public parking and roving/relief to keep traffic flowing, keep the right-of-way clear, keep pedestrians crossing out of the way of oncoming traffic. Towards the end of the shift, deputies will also assist in getting parking lots cleared and assisting with getting boats lines up for boat parade as directed by IC and traffic supervisors.

Security Detail: 10a-4p

2 deputies dedicated to security and presence throughout the dry pit areas. Maintain LE presence through proactive foot patrols.

Thursday October 7, 2021 Boat Parade/Block Party

Briefing for all units will be at Shriner's parking lot 899 Buttonwood Dr.

Parade Command: 330p-10p

1 Incident Commander and 2 Traffic Supervisors on site to begin boat lineup and coordinate all units involved.

Traffic Detail: 5p-10p

12 deputies, 4 CSA's, and 6 VOICE members for traffic control along boat parade route to shut down Matanzas Pass Bridge (with FDOT approval), lead parade, shut down intersections to beach and maintain road closures throughout designated event.

Security Detail: 5p-10p

2 Supervisors and 12 deputies to cover areas throughout designated block party/boat set up area as well as Lynn Hall Park/Time's Square area for static displays. Supervisors and deputies will be given designated posts through Incident Commander with ability to adjust as necessary. FMB Open container lift requested for 10/7/21 5p-10p in areas to include, Town Square, Old San Carlos Blvd, First, Second, Third, Fourth and Fifth Street.

Friday October 8, 2021 - Test & Tune Day

Marine Unit: 9a-4p

1 Marine unit deputy to be present in test and tune area as safety precaution to ensure safety of racers as well as public. Detail times may change according to test & tune schedule. Test and Tune will run between 10a-4p. Deputy will be scheduled one hour prior to start and one hour after.

Security Detail: 6p-12a

1 supervisor and 2 deputies for increased security patrols and LE presence for areas between 1600 Estero Blvd through Time's Square and Lynn Hall Park in anticipation of increased crowds for the event. Deputies will respond to any calls for service and will proactively patrols all areas.

Saturday October 9, 2021 - Roar Offshore Boat Races

Incident Command: 6a-8p

Incident Commander and Safety Officer to work a unified command post with Lee County EMS and FMB Fire Department out of MCC1. Command Post will be set up at 2545 Estero Blvd.

Traffic Supervisors: 6a-7p

2 Traffic Supervisors to coordinate and control the movement throughout the area on and off the island. Supervisors will split up the area of responsibility and will assist detail deputies, CSA's and VOICE members with manning posts, coordinating relief and repositioning assets as needed to keep traffic from backing up and to keep pedestrians safe. Supervisors will account for everyone under them throughout the detail with radio checks and will do a final check out with each deputy at the end of the shift.

Traffic Control: 7a-7p

13 deputies, 8 CSA's, 10 VOICE members for traffic control throughout area to assist with pedestrian crossings, maintaining flow of traffic, parking issues, etc. This group will include motorcycle units that will be able to move a little more freely through traffic as well as 2 detail deputies that will be posted at Lover's Key to assist with getting trolley's in and out of the parking lot and to get pedestrians across Estero Blvd to trolley stops safely. Manning this post is also a condition of Lover's Key State park allowing Roar Offshore to utilize the park for offsite parking and trolley pickups. The Lover's Key deputies will work from 9a-7p.

Security Supervisors: 8a-8p

2 supervisors to oversee the security patrol deputies along the beachside area of Estero Blvd as well as vehicle patrols of Estero Blvd while event takes place. Supervisors will divide the areas of responsibility and deputies to post them throughout beach accesses, outlined area of race course and public areas where crowds gather to view races. The patrol areas will be further broken down and deputies will be paired up and given specific areas of responsibility at direction of supervisors. Supervisors will account for everyone under them throughout the detail with radio checks and will do a final check out with each deputy at the end of the shift.

Security Patrols: 9a-8p

Deputies will be posted in designated areas on foot, vehicle, atv/gator patrols to maintain LE presence, to assist with crowd control, answering any calls for service in the event area, assisting with public safety as needed. Deputies will be briefed by IC and supervisors prior to going to posts on any pertinent information. Patrol areas will be broken down and deputies will be paired up in the respective areas.

Marine Supervisor: 8a-6p

Supervisor will be responsible for designating patrol areas and briefing Marine Units prior to them going to their posts. Supervisor will coordinate with additional LE Marine units to move assets where they are needed. Supervisor will account for deputies under their command throughout the event and will do a final check out with each deputy at the end of the detail.

Marine Patrols: 8а-бр

5 Marine deputies to include wave runners if possible to patrol all boat spectator areas including the areas along the beachside. LCSO Marine Units will be the prevailing local LE agency for this event and will work tandem with additional Marine assets from other local agencies. LCSO VOICE Auxiliary boat may also be used for patrols during this event.

Dispatcher: 8a-6p

1 dedicated dispatcher with two dedicated radio channels to be monitored throughout the event. Dispatcher will monitor radio traffic, assist with recording calls for services, handle deputy radio requests, dispatch any calls for service that come in, etc. Dispatcher will also have the ability to be a liaison between LCSO, LCEMS, and FMBFD.

The Lee County Sheriff's Office may also have support from the LCSO Voice Unit with various positions throughout the events.

Fee:

All fees will be paid at the vendor's expense.

Special Arrangements:

On Saturday, October 9th, LCSO Marine Unit has stipulated that the event coordinators will need to create a safety fairway from Bowditch Point to the boat race track to be used by race participants only. This will be accomplished by the vendor extending the spectator buoys from Bowditch Point to the race course.

Additionally, although the Race Village will open for team arrivals beginning on Wednesday, October 6, 2021. Event coordinator has contracted with Global Security, Inc. B 1200280, for private security coverage. There will be three unarmed, Florida licensed private security officers on site for overnight security presence.

The event coordinator has partnered with the Ft Myers Beach Lions Club to run a VIP tent located beach side at the Beach Bar 1688 Estero Blvd. These groups will be responsible for ensuring that participants have shown proper identification allowing them to drink as well as ensuring that no one is over-served.

The event coordinator is filing the required permit and paperwork with the United States Coast Guard.

It has been recommended to the vendor that they use additional buoys to help section off the spectator area on the beach side.

It has been recommended to the vendor that they use all means possible to promote parking and shuttling to anyone attempting to take part in the event.

It has been recommended to the vendor that they make every effort possible to notify all residents and businesses of Ft Myers Beach of all of the arrangements they have made for this event.

It has been recommended to the vendor that they make every effort to make contact with local fisherman to ensure that everyone is aware of the race

course and routes to the race course so that arrangements can be made should there be issues with crab pots in the area.

It has been recommended to the vendor that they reach out to the Lee County Department of Natural Resources to advise them of all of the event plans.

Once the approved Florida Department of Transportation permit has been received, the approval will need to be shared with LCSO, the Town of Ft Myers Beach and any other entity that may need it.

ROAR/OPA FORT MYERS BEACH BOAT RACES: Permit Approval with Conditions

The Special Event Permit Applications for the Town of Fort Myers Beach and Lee County is approved with the following conditions:

- 1. Boat Parade: Boats are to park in designated locations only, not obstructing access, fire hydrants, and fire department connections.
- 2. Refer to the Roar Offshore Race Village/Dry Pit Plans, specifically those that show the layout of the Pit Boxes. The areas highlighted in "BLUE" are going to be designated fire lanes. These areas shall be clear to provide adequate space for a vehicle to make access throughout the site, and turnaround. Minimum width is 20' for fire lanes, vertical clearance required is 13'.
- 3. Refer to the Race Village/Dry Pit located at 2451 Main Street. Ensure adequate spacing between the Typical Team Pit Boxes, which are lined up at the rear of the property.
- 4. As required in 2019, Fire Extinguishers (minimum size 2A:10BC) with current state inspection tags from a Florida Licensed Contractor shall be required at the following locations:
 - o Each generator pit box temporary lighting
 - o The VIP Tent at The Beach Bar, shall have 2 extinguishers, independent from those located inside the business.
- 5. No Tents in the Pit Areas shall obstruct any entrances or exits to sites.
- 6. Refer to the proposed VIP Tent/The Beach Bar:
 - o Provide copy of flame certificate, PRIOR TO EVENT.
 - o Fenced area shall not restrict occupants from being able to safely exit the event in case of an emergency.
 - There is to be trained personnel tracking the occupant load inside The Beach Bar, and at the VIP Tent. Occupant Loads in each space are not exceed the posted limits. Maximum limits include all staffing.
 - o No cooking will be permitted under tent.
 - o No vehicles are to be left on I Street, or parked. Any vehicles found to be left on the street, not in a parking spot, will be removed at the owner's expense.
- 7. ROAR Offshore is not permitting any temporary fueling operations for boats. An outside contractor is working on a location, which is to be permitted the week of 9/20/21. If a site cannot be secured, a notarized letter will be required from ROAR Offshore attesting that there will not be any temporary fueling stations. Please ensure racers are aware that there will be no fuel permitted to be stored in the pit boxes.

Fire & EMS Safety Plan

The Fort Myers Beach Fire Department (FMBFD) and Lee County Emergency Medical Services (LCEMS) will join forces to provide Fire / EMS protection for all three days of the Roar Offshore Powerboat Races event. The following list identifies the level of resources determined appropriate to cover the event each day with Fire and EMS resources only. There will be additional resources required from the Life Safety Division of the Fort Myers Beach Fire Department.

Thursday

Race Village - The event begins on Thursday with the racing teams arriving at "Race Village" throughout the day. During this time, spectator attendance is expected to be fairly minimal with up to 1,000 people in the Race Village area at any one time. Therefore, no special detail Fire / EMS resources are identified. However, the Life Safety Division will likely be required to inspect the setup for fire code compliance.

The Life Safety Division of the FMBFD will be present to inspect the event for compliance to the plan approved during the permitting process.

Block Party – The block party will cover the Times Square area with anticipated crowds of approximately 5,000 people. Special detail resources will be required to cover this influx of people. All resources for this portion of the event shall be provided by FMBFD. The resources allocated to fire / EMS protection include:

- One (1) FMBFD fire engine with four (4) personnel Special Detail
- One (1) FMBFD ALS UTV with two (2) personnel Special Detail
- One (1) FMBFD Command Staff Special Detail
- One (1) FMBFD ALS Transport Rescue Unit with two (2) personnel Special Detail

These resources will be mobilized at 4:00 p.m. and will be on site from 5:00 p.m. until 10:00 p.m. or until the majority of traffic clears the area.

The Life Safety Division of the FMBFD will be present to inspect the event for compliance to the plan approved during the permitting process.

Fire & EMS Safety Plan

Friday - Testing and Tuning

Command Post - Since there will be two concurrent sites being serviced at the same time, Lee County Emergency Management will provide a mobile command post for fire and EMS command staff. Lee County Division of Emergency Management provides the Mobile Response Unit Command Post (MRU).

- One (1) Lee County Div. of Emergency Management MRU with three (3) personnel (operator and two LCEMS command staff). – Special Detail

Race Village – Friday is expected to be the busiest day at Race Village. Throughout the day, attendance is projected to reach up to 5,000 people at any one time. The following is a list of resources deemed appropriate to address this potential risk.

- One (1) LCEMS ALS Transport Ambulance with two (2) personnel Special Detail
- One (1) LCEMS ALS UTV with two (2) personnel Special Detail

These resources will be on mobilized from 9:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. The resources will be on site and in position from 9:00 p.m. until 5:00 p.m.

Fort Myers Beach (FMB Pier south to Junkanoo) – Since Friday is Test & Tune and the boats will not be racing on the course, the anticipated crowds are being estimated at 10,000 at any one time. Based on this estimate the resources being allocated include:

- One (1) LCEMS ALS UTV with two (2) personnel Special Detail (9:00 5:00)
- One (1) FMBFD ALS UTV with two (2) personnel Special Detail (9:00 5:00)
- One (1) FMBFD ALS Transport Rescue with two (2) personnel* Special Detail (9:00 a.m. - 11:00 p.m.*)

*The special detail FMBFD transport unit is being retained until 11:00 p.m. to meet the anticipated increase in call volume generated from the event. The Life Safety Division will be present to inspect the event for compliance to the plan approved during the permitting process.

Fire & EMS Safety Plan

Saturday - Race Day

Command Post - Since there will be two concurrent sites being serviced at the same time, Lee County Emergency Management will provide a mobile command post for fire and EMS command staff. Lee County Division of Emergency Management provides the Mobile Response Unit (MRU).

- One (1) Lee County Div. of Emergency Management MRU with three (3) personnel (operator and two LCEMS command staff). Special Detail
 - o MRU will be mobilized from 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. and will be in operation from 9:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m.
- Three (3) FMBFD Command Staff Special Detail

The MRU will be staffed from 9:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Race Village – The Race Village on Saturday is expected to have lighter crowds than Friday. Attendance is expected to be as high as 5,000 people in the morning and then taper off as the races begin. The following is a list of resources deemed appropriate to address this potential risk.

- One (1) LCEMS ALS Transport Ambulance with two (2) personnel Special Detail
- One (1) LCEMS ALS UTV with two (2) personnel Special Detail

These resources will be on site from 9:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m.

Fort Myers Beach (FMB Pier south to Junkanoos) — Saturday is expected to bring the largest crowds. Four (4) total UTVs will be strategically placed along Estero Blvd to provide coverage from Times Square to Junkanoos. These units are capable of transporting patients to the Treat, Triage & Transport Tent (T3) location, to a transport unit along Estero Blvd or to the heliport location for emergency transport by helicopter. Crowd sizes are being estimated at 20,000 at any one time. Based on this estimate the resources being allocated include:

- One (1) FMBFD ALS UTV with two (2) personnel Special Detail
- One (1) FMBFD ALS Transport Rescue with two (2) personnel Special Detail (9:00 a.m. – 11:00 p.m.*)
- One (1) FMBFD Fire Engine with Three (3) personnel Special Detail
- One (1) LCEMS Command Staff @ the T3 Tent- Special Detail
- Three (3) LCEMS ALS UTV with two (2) personnel Special Detail
- One (1) LCEMS ALS Transport Ambulance with two (2) personnel @ T3 Tent Special Detail
- Four (4) additional LCEMS EMTs / Paramedics @ T3 Tent Special Detail

Unless noted otherwise, all resources will be available from 9:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Questions from public on access:

Event staff and volunteers encountering the general public demanding access to the event site without paying are instructed to explain the event is fully permitted by the town, county and state, which provides us the ability to block off, secure and charge an admission fee. Event staff and volunteers are instructed to "NOT" be confrontational and immediately contact event management, who are available by cell phone or two way radio.

Medical Emergency mitigation plan

MERT is scheduled to be on-site during the the event.

Event staff is trained to immediately notify MERT and/or call 911 in case of emergency.

Fire & EMS Safety Plan

*The special detail FMBFD transport unit is being retained until 11:00 p.m. to meet the anticipated increase in call volume generated from the event. The Life Safety Division of the FMBFD will be present to inspect the event for compliance to the plan approved during the permitting process.

MERT

The Lee County fire departments work collaboratively to provide fire and EMS protection of the waterways of Lee County. Several departments maintain fire and rescue boats to respond to emergencies on the water. The MERT Team has met with the producers of Roar Offshore and have a plan to protect the racers, participants and spectators during the Saturday race event and activities.

The producers of Roar Offshore understand that this plan may require revisions as a result of each permit review process.

Mitigation plan for Severe Weather

Severe weather in Fort Myers Beach includes tropical storms, hurricanes, and thunder storms.

The event is being held during hurricane season. Due to the nature of the event Roar Offshore Powerboat National Championship (an outdoor activity) the event management is continually monitoring weather conditions. In the event of approaching severe weather the event producers/management will advise attendees they should seek shelter and/or close the event.

Lightning or dangerous conditions prior to the event — Seek safe shelter at an establishment. Roar Offshore will observe the National Weather Service 30/30 Lightning Policy (within 30 seconds you hear thunder after lightning strike is observed you wait 30 minutes). A minimum 30-minute warm-up and check in will be held prior to the start of the race. RACE CONTROL will make final call as to the start of the race based on weather and course safety, which includes all watercraft, (safety, turns, and officials) being in place.

Lightning or dangerous conditions during the event — As determined by RACE CONTROL the course will be cleared. A "CLEAR THE COURSE" call will be made with a series of 3 long blasts on air horns or whis-tles, waving of orange/red Flags as well as announced over all radios from the RACE Control. Racer and patrol boats will then proceed to the nearest safe location for docking to get off of the water and into a safe structure. Public will be notified of weather through Roar Offshore's live feed during the event.

Mitigation plan for civil or other disturbances

The following strategy is suggested to minimize the effects of Roar Offshore National Championships during a civil disturbance: Contact and rely solely on the guidance of first responders, Fire and Police personnel.

Mitigation plan for hazardous material incidents on and off the water.

On water plan establishes that Fast Response Towing & Salvage will operate in the event of a hazardous materials incident, oil spill, or other release on water. They are trained and qualified to minimize the exposure to or damage from materials that could adversely impact human health and safety or the environment. All Fast Response vessels carry spill containment kits.

. EMERGENCY SPILLS on land: While petroleum spills may be just as hazardous to individuals and/or the environment as other chemical spills, additional considerations must be taken into account.
