Addendum Number Two (2) Explanation:

This addendum is to add Questions and Answers received after the Pre-Application workshop Wednesday, February 25, 2026.

Q1: I have a question regarding the current Opioid Abatement RFA and continued funding for WISH. I am curious if there are plans for this RFA to be a yearly funding opportunity. The reason I ask is that WISH is currently in Year 3 so requesting renewal funds to continue WISH past the current contract would not align properly with the timing of the current RFA. I want to make sure we are planning properly to ensure we can continue to provide WISH services seamlessly once the current contract is complete.

A1: The new contract terms for the currently funded opioid projects, if awarded under RFA #051126-OAP, would be as follows: Centerstone of Florida: August 1, 2028, through July 31, 2033; and Kimmie's Recovery Zone: April 1, 2028, through March 31, 2033. The period under this RFA is five years. Contracts are awarded annually, subject to the availability of funds and satisfactory performance.

Q2: I am preparing the St. Matthew's House pre-application for the Opioid Abatement RFA and had a question about whether the proposed project needs to take place within Lee County, or whether it can serve Lee County residents at a location outside of Lee County. Our women's recovery program is located in Alva, but our men's program primarily takes place in Naples. However, the men's program serves a considerable number of Lee County residents.

A2: A proposed project may still be considered eligible even if some services are delivered outside Lee County, so long as the applicant clearly demonstrates that the project serves Lee County residents, addresses opioid-related impacts within Lee County, and aligns with the priority areas and strategic approaches outlined in the 2025 Lee County Opioid Abatement Plan. Applicants should also clearly describe the benefit to Lee County residents and explain how Lee County participants will be identified and tracked.
