**Aligned with the Lee County Opioid Abatement Plan**

**Addendum Number Three (3) Explanation:**

This addendum is issued to incorporate questions and answers received following the Invitation to Submit Applications on Monday, March 30, 2026, through the RFA Question deadline of April 6, 2026.

**Q1:** Are we allowed to use our Federally Negotiated Rate Agreement on the Lee County Opioid Abatement Plan budget?

**A1:** No. Federally Negotiated Indirect Cost Rate Agreement will not be accepted for projects funded under RFA #051126-OAP.

**Q2:** If awarded when would the contract begin?

**A2:** Lee County anticipates that the awarded contracts would begin by October 1, 2026. Applicants should use that timeframe for planning purposes. If there are unique circumstances that may affect implementation timelines, those can be considered on a case-by-case basis, as appropriate.

**Q3:** Do all clients served under this project have to reside in Lee County?

**A3:** Clients served under a proposed project are expected to be Lee County residents. Applicants should clearly demonstrate that the project serves Lee County residents, addresses opioid-related impacts within Lee County, and aligns with the priority areas and strategic approaches outlined in the 2025 Lee County Opioid Abatement Plan. Applicants should also clearly describe the benefit to Lee County residents and explain how Lee County participants will be identified and tracked.

**Q4:** Are we allowed to deviate at all from the pre-application proposal in terms of both dollar amount requested and the proposed program, number and type of staff?



**A4:** Applicants may refine their program design in the full application, may add elements that strengthen or support the proposed project, and may address issues identified during the Technical Assistance process, if applicable. However, applicants may not propose a fundamentally different program or materially change the core scope of services described in the pre-application. The proposed funding amount and the number and type of staff may be adjusted to better align with the project scope.

**Q5:** Are we allowed to mix populations, for example can we serve some clients that are existing child welfare clients, and also provide prevention to community clients?

**A5:** Yes, applicants may serve mixed populations within a single proposed project. However, applicants should clearly identify all target populations in their application and demonstrate how services will be tailored to meet the needs of each population served. All proposed services must align with the priority areas and strategic approaches outlined in the 2025 Lee County Opioid Abatement Plan. Projects that include prevention activities may address any substance use disorder (SUD), while intervention, treatment, and recovery activities must primarily address opioid use disorder (OUD), including individuals with other co-occurring substance use or mental health conditions, as long as OUD is the primary focus of services.
