Household Cleaning

Maintaining a clean home can improve overall air quality, prolong the life of your carpet and furniture, and even contribute to better health.

Daily

- Pick up clutter and throw away trash, junk mail, and any other things you do not need (Do not use cardboard boxes for storage)
- Empty dirty dishes from sink
- Empty garbage bins
- Wipe down countertops

Once a week

- Dust—ceiling fans, blinds, decorative items, furniture tops, and electronic devices
- Vacuum/Mop—don't forget to change your vacuum bags and wash your mops a minimum of once a month.
- Clean out toilets and showers
- Wash all mirrors
- Scrub out all sinks

Spring Cleaning

- Wash all windows and doors
- Wipe down all walls
- Shampoo carpets (if applicable)
- Clean our closets, carport, garage—Donate unused items

Important Note: It is faster to clean as you go. If you drip something on the floor, clean it up right away to save time and energy later.

- 1 teaspoon Lemon Juice (if desired)

Tips for Water Conservation

- Check toilets, pipes and faucets for leaks
- Only run dish and clothes washers when there is a full load
- Use extra water for watering plants rather than pouring it down the drain

Indoor Air Quality

Breath easier and take the following steps to reduce indoor air contamination:

- 1. Replace HVAC filters monthly
- Prevent mold and mildew by: using bathroom fans, immediately wiping up spills, washing and drying dishes immediately after use
- Vacuum and mop on a regular basis
- Do not smoke indoors
- 5. Test for Radon

Septic and Well Maintenance

- □Pump septic tank once every 3-5 years □ Do NOT drive or park on any portion
- of the drain field or septic tank ☐Do NOT plant trees or shrubs near the drain field or septic tank
- ☐ Mark the location of your septic tank
- ☐Minimize garbage disposal use
- □ Do not use toilet bowl cleaning tablets and do not flush diapers, plastic, or other inorganic material

- ☐ Test your well water annually
- ☐ Inspect and clean your aerator monthly: Follow the guidelines at www.floridahealth.gov.
- □Keep hazardous paints, chemicals, fertilizers, and pesticides away from water system and well
- □Check well cover to ensure it is intact
- □Check softener salt levels monthly

Cawn Maintenance

During the summer months lawns grow quickly and must be mowed on a regular basis. Good mowing practice should include:

- Removing all stones and other debris from lawn prior to mowing
- Never moving wet grass
- Mowing in a different direction each time the lawn is cut
- Sharpening mower blades after every
- Keeping grass length between 1 and 4 inches (depending on the breed of grass)



Thinking of Landscaping?

Use ONLY plant life native to Florida

Planting flowers, trees, shrubs, and other plants that are native to Florida will help preserve Florida's natural environment, save water, conserve wildlife, and minimize the use of harmful pesticides.

Cleaning your garbage disposal:

Fill the drain with one cup of ice cubes and salt, run cold water and turn on garbage disposal until ice is gone. To deodorize the drain place 1/2 of a lemon or lime into the drain. Run cold water and turn on garbage disposal until fruit is

Cleaning your Range Hood Filter:

Fill the sink or a bucket with HOT water, pour in baking soda and dish soap, remove filter from range hood, and soak in soapy solution for 10 minutes, scrub with non-abrasive scrub brush, rinse, dry completely, and replace filter into range hood.

Monthly Maintenance 9tems ☐ Inspect and Replace HVAC Filter

- □Clean Kitchen Sink Disposal
- □Clean Range Hood Filter
- □Remove expired items from refrigerator and wipe down interior and exterior surfaces
- ☐Deep clean oven
- □Vacuum dryer lint trap
- □Walk around outside of home and look for items that may need repair or maintenance

Quarterly Maintenance Items

- ☐Test smoke and carbon dioxide detectors
- ☐Test garage door auto-reverse feature
- □Run water and flush toilets in unused spaces
- □Clear dead limbs, plants and shrubs throughout yard
- □Check plumbing shutoff valves to ensure they open and close properly
- □Check weather-stripping and caulking around all doors and windows to ensure there are no holes or cracks replace if necessary

Save Your Energy!

Saving energy doesn't just reduce your electric bill, it is good for the environment too.

Use these energy saving tips:

- •Keep the thermostat at 78 degrees
- •Install programmable thermostat
- •Keep windows and doors closed when running your A/C or heat

Hurricane Preparations

- ☐ Install Hurricane Shutters (if available)
- ☐Trim all trees and shrubs
- □ Secure loose gutters and downspouts, and clear of any debris
- ☐Store all outdoor furniture and lawn decorations
- □Do NOT run generators, grills, or other gas operated appliances indoors

Seasonal Maintenance Items

- □ Replace batteries in smoke and carbon dioxide detectors (every six months)
- ☐ Test water heater pressure relief valve (every six months)
- □Check gutter drainage, ensure down spouts are properly guarded to prevent erosion (Spring)
- □Clean out gutters (Spring)
- □Inspect exterior of home for chipping paint, siding damage, and holes (Spring)
- ☐ Have HVAC system serviced by a licensed and insured HVAC contractor (Spring)
