These are among the final canals in Lee County to be cleared from the 2017 storm because the work requires access from within the canal banks.

Lee County has sufficient capacity, experience and fiscal reserves to manage this project, which will be coordinated by our Department of Transportation. Lee DOT staff manages 130 linear miles of canals, 142 storm water ponds and 24 weir structures.

SCOPE OF WORK

March 16, 2017

San Carlos Park-East Mulloch Drainage District Caloosa Canal/ Segment Three

SCOPE OF WORK: Lee County's Natural Resources Division is seeking a contractor to perform maintenance along 2600 lf of the canal shown in red on the attached map. The job will extend from Oriole Rd eastward to the canals intersection with a north/south conveyance. The work, covered by the following specifications, consists of furnishing all labor, materials, and equipment for the performance of the following tasks:

TASK 1- Remove nuisance vegetation and debris from approximately 2600 lf of canal. Access constraints will limit the cutting and removing of vegetation to what can be conducted by tunneling through the overgrowth. The extent of this project will be at least the width of the canal bottom and will extend vertically as far as can be safely conducted from the canal bottom. All cut invasive vegetation should include an initial herbicidal treatment. All Brazilian peppers that are trimmed but not totally removed shall be treated to kill the remaining plant in place. Any downed branches/debris in the flow way shall be removed.

Because there are powerlines in the vicinity of this project, the work is being conducted in cooperation with Florida Power & Light so that any vegetation that is in contact or has the potential to be in contact with powerlines shall be cut as needed by FPL.

TASK 2- Follow-up herbicidal treatment to be conducted no sooner than 60 days after completion of initial cleaning and requires written authorization from County Project Manager.

GENERAL SPECIFICATIONS:

1) NUISANCE VEGETATION/DEBRIS REMOVAL

- a) Trimming, treating, & removal of but not limited to Brazilian pepper (*Schinus terebinthifolius*), All shrubbery and bushy type nuisance vegetation greater than eighteen (18) inches in height shall be cut as near to the ground surface as conventional tools permit. Stumps of cut exotic vegetation are to remain in place and shall be treated with an approved herbicide within fifteen (15) minutes after cutting.
- b) Any downed trees, low hanging limbs, or debris (including non-vegetative debris) impeding the flow of water shall be removed.
- c) Remove garbage within reason that has accumulated in the canal.

2) DISPOSAL

- a) The contractor shall be responsible for the proper disposal of all debris collected (including garbage) during the project. Unless otherwise stated, all removed vegetation & debris must be removed from the site and disposed of at an appropriate disposal facility.
- b) Contractors will be required to submit documentation with estimates of the amount (cubic yards) of vegetation removed. This information is to be submitted at invoicing.

3) HERBICIDE APPLICATION:

- a) The contractor shall only use herbicides approved for use by the FDEP and Lee County. Herbicides shall be applied per the manufacturer's recommendations by a State certified applicator. The contractor shall adhere to all Federal, State and local regulations governing the application, transportation, storage, use, and disposal of products used in the performance of this contract. The contractor shall, upon request, supply Lee County with a copy of the Material Safety Data Sheet for each type of herbicide used.
 - b) All herbicides shall contain a fluorescent non-toxic dye to allow for monitoring of herbicide dispersal.
 - c) The contractor must apply herbicides in such a manner as to protect non-target organisms, the environment, and the public.
 - d) The contractor shall only use backpack hand pump type sprayers for wholesale treatment of in-place vegetation. Continuous stream sprayers cannot be used.
 - e) Only hand-held spray bottles may be used for the treatment of cut stumps.
 - f) Herbicides are **not** to be applied:
 - i. Within two (2) hours of rainfall (previous or eminent).
 - ii. If the vegetation is wet.
 - iii. In windy conditions.
- 4) The project includes removing nuisance vegetation, snags, and debris that block the flow in the waterways, and also includes treating nuisance vegetation with herbicides. The contractor shall exercise care to avoid damaging wetlands adjacent to the project area, including non-exotic and non-nuisance plants.
- 5) The Contractor shall be responsible for determining the type and amount of equipment and labor necessary to complete the work in accordance with the specifications and contract time.
- 6) The Contractor shall be solely responsible for examining the area(s) identified on maps provided by the Project Manager to arrive at an accurate cost determination for the work involved during the time period of the year for which the work will occur. **Compensation for work shall be dispersed as follows. The first payment shall be lump sum for all works associated with Task 1. The second payment shall be lump sum for the required follow-up herbicidal treatment. Each payment shall be considered full compensation for all labor, equipment, tools, materials, disposal costs, mobilization, demobilization, and other items necessary and incidental to complete the work.**
- 7) The Contractor shall exercise care to avoid damage to public or private improvements including lawns, roadways, structures, sprinklers, septic systems, and fencing. Repair, replacement, or restitution for any such damage shall be the sole responsibility of the Contractor.

- 8)** The Contract shall implement best management practices for erosion and turbidity control to prevent violations of state water quality and impacts to wetlands and surface waters. The contractor shall maintain water quality during the course of the project and employ best management practices for erosion and turbidity control, including, but not limited to, the use of turbidity barriers and silt screens. In the event that the work causes a violation of the turbidity or water quality standards in Rule 62-302, F.A.C., the contractor shall cease all work contributing to the violation, modify the work procedures that were responsible for the violation, and install more turbidity containment devices and repair any non-functioning turbidity containment devices. The contractor should notify the County project manager of the violation within eight hours.
- 9)** The Contractor shall conduct all work with adequate safety precautions so as not to present undue hazards to the public or to workers on site.
- 10)** If previously unknown historical or archaeological artifacts are uncovered at any time on the project site, the Contractor shall immediately notify the County project manager.

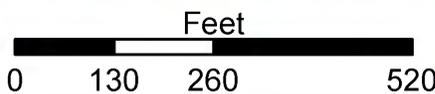
