ROADWATCH UPDATE

September 18, 2025 to September 24, 2025

1. Road Work/Maintenance/Improvement

Corkscrew Road Widening Project – Phase 2 Construction Project: The project constructs four, 11-foot-wide travel lanes from Bella Terra Boulevard to just east of Alico Road, and a new traffic signal at the Alico Road intersection. Also included are on-road bike lanes in each direction, a 10-foot-wide shared-use path on the south side of the road, a 6-foot sidewalk on the north side of the road, and street lighting. The 22-foot wide (varies) median includes various hardwood and palm trees as well as shrubs.

Drivers, pedestrians, and bicyclists are urged to use extra caution when traveling through the work zone.

- Motorists should expect lane closures during the nighttime/overnight hours of 8:00 PM to 5:00 AM for crews to work on storm sewer and force main crossings. Flaggers will be onsite to assist motorists.
- Motorists should drive with caution and expect intermittent daytime flagging as road crews are performing earthwork up to the shoulders of the road on Corkscrew Road and Alico Road, within the project limits. Please be aware that trucks may be entering and leaving the roadway.
- Crews will be installing drainage throughout the project area on the south side of Corkscrew Road. Motorists should expect trucks and equipment to be moving materials throughout the project.
- Crews will be installing utility conduits and light pole bases on the south side of Corkscrew Road from Wayside Lane to Alico Road.
- Sidewalks are closed in areas throughout the project as the contractor performs underground work.

The work activities above are scheduled to occur, however unforeseen underground conditions and weather may affect this schedule.

Please use caution and watch for workers and construction vehicles entering and leaving the roadway. Due to additional work required by Lee County Utilities, as well as delays in utility relocations by FPL and Lumen, the project completion is expected end of 2026. Project cost is approximately \$27 M. The contractor is Bergeron Land Development, Inc. Village of Estero Corkscrew Road Shared Use Path Project: This Village of Estero project constructs a 10-foot-wide asphalt pathway on the north side of Corkscrew Road from Ben Hill Griffin Parkway to Palermo Lake Court (eastern entrance of Grandezza), and 6-foot wide concrete sidewalk from east of Palermo Lake Court that connects to the sidewalk that runs to Midnight Blue Court (Wild Blue Vista) built by Lee County's previous widening project. The 10-foot-wide asphalt pathway will also be constructed on the south side of Corkscrew Road from Ben Hill Griffin Parkway to Bella Terra Boulevard. Roadway and pathway lighting similar to those on Estero Parkway will be installed to complement the new facilities, along with a substantial amount of landscaping and irrigation which will add to the beautification of the Corkscrew Road corridor.

Drivers, pedestrians, and bicyclists are urged to use extra caution when traveling through the work zone.

- Crews are scheduled to begin construction of the 10-foot pathway and irrigation installation on the south side of Corkscrew Road from Firehouse Lane to Wildcat Run.
- Motorists should expect daytime lane closures from 9:00 AM to 3:30 PM (both directions) for crews to install irrigation in the median and continue lighting installation.
- On the north side of Corkscrew Road from Wild Blue to the west crews are scheduled to install sod behind the newly constructed sidewalk.
- On the north side of Corkscrew Road between Palermo Lake Court and Wild Blue Boulevard crews continue earthwork in preparation for the concrete sidewalk.
- WORK BY UTILITY COMPANIES: Various utilities are performing work that requires daytime lane closures within the project area.

The work activities above are scheduled to occur, however unforeseen underground conditions and weather may affect this schedule.

Please use caution and watch for workers and construction vehicles entering and leaving the roadway. Estimated completion is Fall 2026. Project cost is approximately \$23 million, including \$4.6 million for landscaping and irrigation and \$4 million for lighting. Sanibel Causeway Emergency Restoration: The following work activities above are scheduled to occur, however unforeseen underground conditions and weather may affect this schedule.

- The Punta Rassa Boat Ramp is now open to the public with limited amenities, including the ramp, partial docks, parking and restrooms. Lighting installation and landscaping continues at the toll plaza. Crews must utilize the Punta Rassa parking area, reducing the number of boat parking spaces. Please use caution as construction vehicles and crews are present.
- The contractor continues installing signage and lighting east of the toll plaza. Motorists should expect periodic shoulder closures to perform this work.

All users are urged to be courteous and pay attention as bicyclists share the road on the Causeway and vehicles are entering and existing at public beach access points of the Causeway Islands Park. Pedestrians are not permitted on the causeway. Visitors may check www.leegov.com/parks for updates on amenities.

Big Carlos Pass Bridge Project – Construction Project: The project builds a new bridge over Big Carlos Pass, from Estrellita Drive on Fort Myers Beach to the Lovers Key State Park bayside entrance on Lovers Key. The new bridge will replace the existing moveable bridge over Big Carlos Pass with a fixed span bridge that will provide a vertical navigation clearance of 60 feet. The new bridge will be constructed on the Gulf side of the existing bridge, and will include one travel lane in each direction, bicycle lanes, a six-foot-wide sidewalk along the north side of Estero Boulevard, and a 10-foot-wide shared use path along the south side of Estero Boulevard. A parking area with access to the Lovers Key State Park will be included on the southeast side of the bridge. The project also includes relocation of existing infrastructure for Lee County Utilities and Bonita Springs Utilities.

Boaters are reminded to avoid the construction equipment and the temporary trestle that is in the water.

Please use the channel when traveling through Big Carlos Pass.

Oversize loads be aware that vertical clearance on Estero Boulevard is limited to 16 feet.

- Boaters should expect brief stoppages in the channel as crews are painting bridge piers. The channel will remain open, but please anticipate delays when traveling through the channel.
- The east entrance of Islands End is closed for crews to work on the roadway. Access will be maintained for the west entrance.
- Motorists should continue to expect intermittent daytime lane closures with flagging for crews to perform overhead bridge work.
- The contractor is scheduled to continue setting bridge deck for the new bridge.
- Suppliers are delivering concrete to the project during times that are favorable for successful pours and within permit requirements.
- Pedestrians should follow signs to use the sidewalk on the north side of the bridge.
- Crews will continue performing earthwork and drainage work throughout the project.
- Trolley stops are available at the south entrance to Black Island (Lovers Key Resort) for those
 traveling to Fort Myers Beach and across the street from Black Island (Lovers Key Resort) for
 those traveling to Lovers Key and Bonita Springs. Travelers are asked to wait behind the
 concrete barrier until ready to board the trolley.

TRESPASSING INTO THE CONSTRUCTION SITE IS DANGEROUS AND ILLEGAL. THIS INCLUDES THE BEACH AREA UNDER THE BRIDGE.

Pedestrians and boaters are reminded to please stay out of the work zone.

Drivers, pedestrians, and bicyclists are urged to use extra caution when traveling through the work zone as workers and construction vehicles are entering and leaving the roadway. Motorists should expect reduced speeds throughout the project area. Draw bridge will remain in operation during construction and motorists should be prepared to stop. Fishing from the Big Carlos Pass Bridge is restricted due to construction activities.

Estimated completion is summer 2026. Project cost is approximately \$90.8 M. The contractor is Superior Construction. Littleton Road Widening Project from Corbett Road to US 41: The project widens Littleton Road from the Corbett Road roundabout east to US 41. The new road segment will include an 11-foot-wide travel lane in each direction and a 12-foot-wide center turn lane with landscaped planting islands. The project began in January 2024 with estimated completion in fall 2025. Project cost is approximately \$20 million. The contractor is Wright Construction Group, Inc.

- Crews are currently working on roadway construction, pouring sidewalk, curb work and landscaping. Crews may be working close to the roadway. Motorists are asked to drive with caution.
- Intermittent impacts to the 7-Eleven and Sunoco driveways are possible as crews work on the new roadway. Please use extra caution while workers are present and pay attention to signage and flaggers.
- Motorists should anticipate lane closures from 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM for crews to work on roadway construction.
- Motorists are advised that as of Friday, September 5, traffic from the roundabout to just west of US 41 has shifted to the final configuration. Please use extra caution and pay attention to all signs and pavement markings.
- Motorists entering Littleton Road from the south throughout the project area should **pay close attention to the new stop locations** before proceeding to the live lanes.
- Motorists are advised that traffic may be heavy on weekdays from 8:00 AM to 9:30 AM and from 2:30 PM to 4:00 PM due to Littleton Elementary School traffic. Expect delays. Please choose an alternative route if possible. Do not pass illegally or drive into oncoming traffic under any circumstances.
- Two eastbound LeeTran bus stops on Littleton Road near Horizon Boulevard and Serendipity Boulevard are temporarily out of service. The bus stop on the corner of Littleton Road and US-41/North Cleveland Avenue near 7-Eleven is still in service.

The work activities above are scheduled to occur, however unforeseen underground conditions and weather may affect this schedule.

MOTORISTS ARE ADVISED THAT LITTLETON ROAD IS AN ACTIVE CONSTRUCTION ZONE. THE SPEED LIMIT IS 30 MPH THROUGHOUT THE WORK ZONE. SPEEDING FINES ARE DOUBLED WHEN WORKERS ARE PRESENT.

Ortiz Avenue Widening from SR 884 (Colonial Boulevard) to SR 82 (Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard): This project consists of widening of Ortiz Avenue from 2 lanes to 4 lanes and constructs a six-foot sidewalk on the east side of the road and a 10-foot paved trail on the west side of the road. An on-road bike lane on both sides of the road will also be included. New street lighting will be installed, and a grass median will separate traffic. No improvements will be made at the roundabout intersection with Hanson Street. The contractor will reconstruct the roadway with drainage improvements and stormwater management facilities. Work also includes installation of new water main and installation of new reclaimed water and sewer facilities for Lee County and the City of Fort Myers.

Drivers, pedestrians, and bicyclists are urged to use extra caution when traveling through the work zone.

- Crews will be installing drainage south of the roundabout.
- Crews will be installing watermain north and south of the roundabout.
- The contractor is identifying existing utility locations throughout the project.
- Crews will be installing conduit and fiber optic cable throughout the project limits.
- LeeTran has installed a new temporary northbound bus stop just south of the Lee County Jail driveway. The northbound stops just north of the Lee County Jail driveway and near RaceTrac are temporarily out of service.
- The contractor is scheduled to survey the project during daytime hours.

The work activities above are scheduled to occur, however unforeseen underground conditions and weather may affect this schedule.

Motorists are asked to drive with caution and watch for workers and construction vehicles entering and leaving the work zone. **Estimated completion is Fall 2026.** Project cost is approximately \$31 M. Three Oaks Parkway Extension Project Phase 2 from Indian Paint Lane to and including Daniels Parkway: This project consists of extending Three Oaks Parkway north in the vicinity of Indian Paint Lane to Daniels Parkway and constructs 4 lanes with a 5-foot-wide bicycle lane. Phase 2 includes 6-foot-wide sidewalks on both sides of the roadway. The project also includes the widening of Daniels Parkway to eight lanes from Danport Avenue to west of Powers Court.

 Daniels 9300 Access Road at Fiddlesticks Boulevard closure has been extended through mid-October, 2025. This closure has been extended for the installation of water mains across the road, and it will occur just southwest of CVS and just northwest of Tire Choice Auto Service Center.

- During this closure, access to the businesses along the 9300 Daniels Access Road will be available at the signal at Danport Boulevard and Daniels Parkway.
- The contractor will be clearing the new roadway extension in the vicinity of Indian Paint Lane and adjacent to Fiddlesticks Boulevard.
- Expect intermittent lane closures of the outside eastbound lanes nighttime/overnight from 9:00 PM to 5:00 AM.
- Expect intermittent detours of the bicycle lanes to the multiuse path during daytime hours.

Motorists are asked to drive with caution and watch for workers and construction vehicles entering and leaving the work zone.

Buckingham Road and Gunnery Road Roundabout Project Phase 2: Currently working in the second phase, Buckingham Road will be closed from Gunnery Road to Sunset Road. The second phase is anticipated to be completed Fall 2025.

Drivers, pedestrians, and bicyclists are urged to use extra caution when traveling through the work zone.

- Motorists should expect intermittent flagging operations at the intersection of Homestead Road and Buckingham Road between 9:00 AM 3:00 PM.
- Southbound Buckingham Road traffic is redirected via a detour to Gunnery Road then turn right at Sunset Road then left back onto Buckingham Road to continue south.
- Northbound Buckingham Road traffic is redirected via a detour to turn right onto Sunset Road, then left onto Gunnery Road to continue north onto Buckingham Road north.
- Additionally, temporary traffic signals have been installed at both the intersections of Buckingham Road and Sunset Road, as well as Gunnery Road and Sunset Road.
- Sidewalks will remain closed during this phase. Second Phase is anticipated to be completed Fall 2025.
- Crews will be relocating utilities along the East side of Gunnery Road.
- Crews are actively working on roadway construction along Buckingham Rd.

• As part of the construction activities for this project, sidewalk closures will be necessary. Pedestrians are encouraged to anticipate detours and make appropriate arrangements to ensure safe and efficient travel through the project site.

The work activities above are scheduled to occur; however, unforeseen underground conditions and weather may affect this schedule.

Expect large construction vehicles in the area and watch for contractors in the field. The contractors will use Variable Message Boards (VMB) to notify the public about any traffic pattern changes during construction. The contractor is V & H Construction, Inc. The project is expected to be completed in one year. Work is estimated to be complete spring of 2026. Work is expected to occur Monday through Friday from 7:00 AM to 5:30 PM; however, some night and weekend work may be necessary. Orange River Boulevard Sidewalk and Utility Improvements Project: Lee County begins construction in September 2025 on the Orange River Boulevard Sidewalk and Utility Improvements Project. Work includes water main replacement, installation of new stormwater drainage systems, addition of a new 6' sidewalk and curbs, and upgrading lighting and pedestrian signalization near SR 80 and Orange River Boulevard. These improvements will enhance water reliability, reduce flooding, and improve pedestrian and traffic safety. The project is anticipated to be completed in Fall 2026.

Please use caution and watch for workers and construction vehicles entering and leaving the roadway. Estimated completion is Fall 2026. Project cost is approximately \$3 M. The contractor is Thompkins Contracting Inc. Work is expected to occur Monday through Friday from 7:00 AM to 5:00 PM; however, some night and weekend work may be necessary. Able Canal Pathway Project: The project constructs a new 12-foot-wide, 6-mile shared use pathway along the north side of Able Canal starting at the Harns Marsh access point next to 35th Street West

and the Sailfish Canal and extending east to Joel Boulevard in Lehigh Acres. The purpose of the project is to facilitate accessible, non-motorized travel options for commuters and recreational users in the Able Canal corridor and within the Lehigh Acres community. Work includes an asphalt path with a pedestrian bridge, pavilions, landscaping and other amenities.

Please use caution near the work zone and staging area.

- Crews are beginning excavation and embankment work at the west end of the project.
- Crews are installing erosion control throughout the project.
- Flagging and staging activity should be expected at Lehigh Acres Park, but there will be no impact to park users during construction.

The work activities above are scheduled to occur, however unforeseen underground conditions and weather may affect this schedule.

Please use caution and watch for workers and construction vehicles entering and leaving the roadway. The project began in August 2025 with estimated completion in Fall 2027. Lee County will be dredging the Whiskey Creek channel entrance between Whiskey Creek Drive and Robalo Drive and anticipates increased construction traffic on McGreger Boulevard as a result. We expect to start the material removal on June 4, 2025, with a completion date of September 25, 2025. We do not anticipate any lane closures. We would ask drivers to use caution while crossing the Whiskey Creek bridge on McGreger Boulevard, watching for dump trucks exiting and entering Old Whiskey Creek Drive. Colonial Boulevard from Summerlin Road to McGregor Boulevard: Beginning May 12, 2025, and continuing through Winter of 2025, road construction and traffic signal improvements will be continuing along Colonial Boulevard at Summerlin Road and McGregor Boulevard. Construction crews will be replacing the sidewalks and pedestrian access in the areas, and detours will be in place. Expect nighttime lane closures starting September 7, 2025, to October 4, 2025, with lighted work zones between the hours of 7:00 PM to 5:00 AM. The weather may affect start times and dates. New poles installation, removal of old poles, resetting poles, and energize circuits for poles will be performed.
