**Lee County reminds beach-goers some Bonita access points temporarily closed for beach nourishment project**  
***Resilience project at beach means access points are subject to closure***

Fort Myers, FL, Feb. 6, 2025 – Lee County is advising beach-goers in the Bonita Springs area that Parks & Recreation’s Bonita Beach Access Points will temporarily open and close in the coming weeks, while Access 10 will remain closed due to a resilience project to nourish the shoreline.

When the parking lots and pathways to the beach are closed, the beach remains open. However, the county reminds beach-goers that nourishment equipment will be present. Do not climb on or disturb pipes or other project equipment and avoid the area within 50 feet of the high-pressure pipeline.

The on-going, intermittent closures coincide with the beach nourishment project schedule. The county’s contractor will be placing and moving equipment as the project continues. Timing is dependent on weather conditions. The active construction zone is about 1,000-feet long and is always cordoned-off for safety reasons.

The county thanks beach-goers for their patience as work continues to help maintain the shoreline in the aftermath of recent hurricanes. The project has three phases: Lovers Key (completed last week and open to the public), north Bonita Beach (under construction) and south Bonita Beach (expected to start this weekend). The total cost of more than \$44 million is being funded by state grants, FEMA, Tourist Development Taxes and the City of Bonita Springs. Project completion is anticipated by the end of March.
