1. SUBMISSION OF LETTERS OF INTEREST:

- c. **RESPONSES RECEIVED LATE:** The delivery of Letter of Interest to Lee County Procurement Management prior to or on the time and date as stated is solely and strictly the responsibility of the Consultant. Lee County Procurement Management shall not be responsible for delays caused by the E-mail System(s), United States Postal Service, Overnight Express Mail Services, or for delays caused by any other occurrence. The County expressly reserves the sole and exclusive right to accept or reject a late Letter of Interest when the lateness is due to matters beyond the control of any third party delivery service. Late Letters of Interest may be returned to the Consultant with the notation: “This Letter of Interest was received after the specified deadline time”.

- d. **COUNTY RESERVES THE RIGHT:** The County reserves the right to exercise its discretion, to waive minor informalities in any response; to reject any or all responses with or without cause; and/or to accept the response that in its judgment will be in the best interest of the County of Lee.
- e. **EXECUTION OF SOLICITATION:** All responses shall contain the signature of an authorized representative of the vendor in the space provided on the anti-collusion page. All responses shall be typed or printed in ink. The bidder may not use erasable ink. All corrections made to the response shall be initialed.
- f. **ADDITIONS/REVISIONS/DELETIONS:** Additions, revisions or deletions to the general conditions, specifications that change the intent of the solicitation will cause the solicitation to be non-responsive and the response will not be considered. The Procurement Director shall be the sole judge as to whether or not any addition, revision, or deletion changes the intent of the solicitation.

2. **ACCEPTANCE**

The materials and/or services delivered under the solicitation **shall** remain the property of the consultant until a physical inspection and actual usage of these materials and/or services is accepted by the County and is deemed to be in compliance with the terms herein, fully in accord with the specifications and of the highest quality. In the event the materials and/or services supplied to the County are found to be defective or do not conform to specifications, the County reserves the right to cancel the contract upon written notice to the consultant and return such product to the consultant at the consultants expense.

3. **RULES, REGULATIONS, LAWS, ORDINANCES & LICENSES**

The awarded consultant shall observe and obey all laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations, of the federal, state, and local government, which may be applicable to the supply of this product or service. The awarded vendor has attested to compliance with the applicable immigration laws of the United States in the attached affidavit. Violations of the immigration laws of the United States shall be grounds for unilateral termination of the awarded agreement.

- a. Local Business Tax –consultant shall submit within 10 calendar days after request.
- b. Specialty License(s) – Consultant shall possess at the time of the opening of the quote all necessary permits and/or licenses required for the sale of this product and/or service and upon the request of the County will provide copies of licenses and/or permits within 10 calendar days after request.
- c. The geographic preference established in the Local Vendor Preference ordinance is applicable to all Lee County procurement activities unless otherwise specifically noted in the solicitation package. Provided, however, the Local Vendor Preference ordinance is not applicable to procurement activity or solicitations involving Federal Transit Administration grant funds.
- d. Florida Statutes Section 607.1501 (1) states: A foreign corporation may not transact business in this state until it obtains a certificate of authority from the Department of State.

4. **LEE COUNTY PAYMENT PROCEDURES**

All vendors are requested to mail an original invoice to:

All invoices will be paid as directed by the Lee County payment procedure unless otherwise differently stated in the detailed specification portion of this project.

Lee County will not be liable for requests for payment deriving from aid, assistance, or help by any individual, vendor, quoter, or bidder for the preparation of these specifications. Lee County is generally a tax-exempt entity subject to the provisions of the 1987 legislation regarding sales tax on services. Lee County will pay those taxes for which it is obligated, or it will provide a Certificate of Exemption furnished by the Department of Revenue. All contractors or quoters should include in their quote all sales or use taxes, which they will pay when making purchases of material or subcontractor's services.

5. **PUBLIC ENTITY CRIME**

Any person or affiliate as defined by statute who has been placed on the convicted vendor list following a conviction for a public entity crime may not submit a bid or a contract to provide any goods or services to the County; may not submit a bid on a contract with the County for the construction or repair of a public building or a public work; may not submit bids or leases of real property to the County; may not be awarded or perform works as a contractor, supplier, subcontractor, or consultant under a contract with the County, and may not transact business with the County in excess of \$25,000.00 for a period of 36 months from the date of being placed on the convicted vendor list.

6. **MISCELLANEOUS**

If a conflict exists between the General Conditions and the detailed specifications, then the detailed specifications shall prevail.

7. **WAIVER OF CLAIMS**

Once this contract expires, or final payment has been requested and made, the awarded contractor shall have no more than 30 days to present or file any claims against the County concerning this contract. After that period, the County will consider the Contractor to have waived any right to claims against the County concerning this agreement.

8. **AUTHORITY TO PIGGYBACK**

It is hereby made a precondition of any proposal and a part of these specifications that the submission of any proposal in response to this request constitutes a proposal made under the same conditions, for the same price, and for the same effective period as this proposal, to any other governmental entity.

9. **COOPERATIVE PURCHASING**

The Lee County Board of County Commissioners participates in cooperative purchasing agreements; it is hereby made a part of this proposal that the submission of any proposal in response to this request constitutes a proposal made under the same conditions, for the same contract price, to the other governmental entities.

10. **COUNTY RESERVES THE RIGHT**

a) **Any Single Large Project**

The County, in its sole discretion, reserves the right to separately quote any project that is outside the scope of this solicitation, whether through size, complexity, or dollar value.

b) **Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBE's)**

The County, in its sole discretion, reserves the right to purchase any of the items in this solicitation from a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise vendor if the prices are determined to be in the best interest of the County, to assist the County in the fulfillment of any of the County's grant commitments to federal or state agencies.

The County further reserves the right to purchase any of the items in this solicitation from DBE's to fulfill the County's stated policy toward DBE's.

c) **Anti-Discrimination**

The vendor for itself, its successors in interest, and assignees, as part of the consideration there of covenant and agree that:

In the furnishing of services to the County hereunder, no person on the grounds of race, religion, color, age, sex, national origin, handicap or marital status shall be excluded from participation in, denied the benefits of, or otherwise be subjected to discrimination.

The vendor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, age, sex, national origin, handicap or marital status. The vendor will make affirmative efforts to ensure that applicants are employed and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, religion, color, age, sex, national origin, handicap or marital status. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, acts of employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer; recruitment advertising; layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation and selection for training, including apprenticeship.

Vendor agrees to post in a conspicuous place, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth the provisions of this anti-discrimination clause.

Vendor will provide all information and reports required by relevant regulations and/or applicable directives. In addition, the vendor shall permit access to its books, records, accounts, other sources of information, and its facilities as may be determined by the County to be pertinent to ascertain compliance.

The vendor shall maintain and make available relevant data showing the extent to which members of minority groups are beneficiaries under these contracts.

Where any information required of the vendor is in the exclusive possession of another who fails or refuses to furnish this information, the vendor shall so certify to the County its effort made toward obtaining said information. The vendor shall remain obligated under this paragraph until the expiration of three (3) years after the termination of this contract.

In the event of breach of any of the above anti-discrimination covenants, the County shall have the right to impose sanctions as it may determine to be appropriate, including withholding payment to the vendor or canceling, terminating, or suspending this contract, in whole or in part.

Additionally, the vendor may be declared ineligible for further County contracts by rule, regulation or order of the Board of County Commissioners of Lee County, or as otherwise provided by law.

The vendor will send to each union, or representative of workers with which the vendor has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract of understanding, a notice informing the labor union of worker's representative of the vendor's commitments under this assurance, and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to the employees and the applicants for employment.

The vendor will include the provisions of this section in every subcontract under this contract to ensure its provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor. The vendor will take such actions with respect to any subcontractor, as the contracting agency may direct, as a means of enforcing such provisions, including sanctions for non-compliance.

11. **DRUG FREE WORKPLACE**

Whenever two or more proposals, which are equal with respect to price, quality and service, are received for the procurement of commodities or contractual services, a proposal received from a business that certifies that it has implemented a drug-free workplace program shall be given preference in the award process. In order to have a drug-free workplace program, a business shall comply with the requirements of Florida Statutes 287.087.

12. **AUDITABLE RECORDS**

The awarded vendor shall maintain auditable records concerning the procurement adequate to account for all receipts and expenditures, and to document compliance with the specifications. These records shall be kept in accordance with generally accepted accounting methods, and Lee County reserves the right to determine the record-keeping method required in the event of non-conformity. These records shall be maintained for two years after completion of the project and shall be readily available to County personnel with reasonable notice, and to other persons in accordance with the Florida Public Disclosure Statutes.

14. **REQUIRED SUBMITTALS**

Any submittals requested should be returned with the solicitation response. This information may be accepted after opening, but no later than 10 calendar days after request.

15. **TERMINATION**

Any agreement as a result of this solicitation may be terminated by either party giving thirty (30) calendar days advance written notice. The County reserves the right to accept or not accept a termination notice submitted by the vendor, and no such termination notice submitted by the vendor shall become effective unless and until the vendor is notified in writing by the County of its acceptance.

The Procurement Management Director may immediately terminate any agreement as a result of this solicitation for emergency purposes, as defined by the Lee County Purchasing and Payment Procedure Manual.

Any vendor who has voluntarily withdrawn from a solicitation without the County's mutual consent during the contract period shall be barred from further County procurement for a period of 180 days. The vendor may apply to the Board of Lee County Commissioners for waiver of this debarment. Such application for waiver of debarment must be coordinated with and processed by Procurement Management.

16. **CONFIDENTIALITY**

Vendors should be aware that all submittals (including financial statements) provided with a solicitation are subject to public disclosure and will **not** be afforded confidentiality.

17. **ANTI-LOBBYING CLAUSE**

All firms are hereby placed on formal notice that neither the County Commissioners nor candidates for County Commission, nor any employees from the Lee County Government, Lee County staff members, nor any members of the Qualification/Evaluation Review Committee are to be lobbied, either individually or collectively, concerning this project. Firms and their agents who intend to submit qualifications, or have submitted qualifications, for this project are hereby placed on *formal notice* that they are ***not*** to contact County personnel for such purposes as holding meetings of introduction, meals, or meetings relating to the selection process outside of those specifically scheduled by the County for negotiations. Any such lobbying activities may cause immediate disqualification for this project.

18. **INSURANCE (AS APPLICABLE)**

Insurance shall be provided, per the attached insurance guide. Upon request, an insurance certificate complying with the attached guide may be required prior to award.

19. **CONFLICT OF INTEREST**

All firms are hereby placed on formal notice that per Section 3 of Lee County Ordinance No. 92-22:

The County is prohibited from soliciting a professional services firm to perform project design and/or construction services if the firm has or had been retained to perform the project feasibility or study analysis.

And:

A professional services firm who has performed or participated in the project feasibility planning, study analysis, development of a program for future implementation or drafting of solicitation documents directly related to this County project, as the primary contractor/consultant or a prominent member of the team, cannot be selected or retained, as the primary contractor/consultant or a named member of the contracting/consulting team, to perform project design, engineering, or construction services for subsequent phases or scopes of work for this project. Pursuant to FS. S. 287.057(17) the firm will be deemed to have a prohibited conflict of interest that creates an unfair competitive advantage.

Should your response be found in violation of the above stated provisions; the County will consider this previous involvement in the project to be a conflict of interest, which will be cause for immediate disqualification of the submittal from consideration for this project.

DETAILED SPECIFICATIONS
FOR
ENGINEERING CONSULTANT FOR THE WASTE TO ENERGY FACILITY**

SCOPE

The Lee County Board of County Commissioners is seeking professional services to provide Lee County with engineering consulting services primarily related to the operation and maintenance of its waste to energy facility. The selected consultant will be required to provide the following services for the County during the term of the contract. The scope of services summarized herein is expected to be a general outline of the work required and may be modified, reduced, and/or expanded and may also include other solid waste system components. Work performed by the consultant will be on a negotiated written task basis and will include an estimate budget amount for each task. The County's Solid Waste Division Director may authorize, in writing, changes to the scope and the transfer of funds between and among the several tasks if necessary and appropriate, as determined by the County.

Task 1. Operations Monitoring

Provide the County with the consulting and engineering services required to properly monitor and report on the operations and maintenance of the WTE facility. Attend monthly coordination meetings with the County and Covanta. Perform review of key plant operational metrics regarding performance and environmental compliance and discuss any areas of concern at the Coordination Meetings. Provide inspections of the WTE Facility during major maintenance activities and review pertinent equipment performance and over-haul reports provided by Covanta or the county.

Task 2. O&M Punch List Development and Maintenance

Provide O&M inspections and punch lists to enable enforcement of Standards of Maintenance in accordance with Section 3.03 of the Amended and Restated Service Agreement (ARSA) between Lee county and Covanta Lee, Inc. Provide monthly walkdowns of facility to identify items requiring repairs, refurbishments, or replacements; document completion status of previously identified deficiencies. Issue monthly reports to the County and Covanta with photographic and written descriptions of deficient items. Provide monthly reports in electronic editable format approved by County. Provide estimated costs and establish completion schedules for items not completed in a timely manner, or disputed by Covanta.

Task 3. Regulatory and Permit Items

The Consultant will monitor all related regulatory and permit items associated with the WTE facility and advise the County of any items requiring County's attention. Consultant will prepare (and submit as appropriate) the annual Title V Fee documentation and the Title V Annual Operating Report. Consultant will also prepare the renewal application for the Title V Permit. Consultant will perform work related to the County's efforts to ensure compliance with all necessary regulatory permit requirements.

Task 4. FRCC/NERC/FERC Assistance

Consultant will provide services necessary to determine that the County and Covanta comply with regulations that have been established under federal law related to the North American Electric Reliability Corporation and the Florida Reliability Coordinating Council.

Task 5. Facility Inventory Lists

Maintain oversight of the Plant Inventory List provided by Covanta in accordance with Section 3 of the ARSA, using baseline equipment lists for the original and expanded facility. Add process and Instrumentation Diagrams, spare parts, chemicals and supplies as appropriate. This list was prepared following acceptance of Unit 3 and is used to memorialize County owned property for use at the end of the contract term and for comparisons. Inventory lists and punch lists shall be provided in electronic editable format approved by County.

Task 6. Electric Power Sales and Environmental Attributes, RFP's and Contracts

Consultant will provide services to the County related to existing or potential future power purchase agreements and Environmental Attribute Qualifications/Sales, including, but not limited to, responses to RFPs issued by other entities.

Task 7. Reports

Provide an Annual Report for each fiscal year (ending September) beginning with FY14 with each report to be completed no later than December 31. The report will address operation, maintenance, environmental and production performance of the facility and will include appropriate graphs and tables to facilitate the identification of performance trends. The Annual report shall be provided to County with 10 hard copies and 1 electronic copy.

Task 8. Project Reimbursable Expenses

This task is used to capture Consultant's allowable reimbursable expenses for travel associated with any of the open tasks. The intent of the task is to facilitate the capture of expenses associated with staff performing multiple tasks during the same trip.

Task 9. Additional Services

Consultant will provide additional facility or solid waste system related assistance as requested by the County. Work associated with this task will require a County approved written scope and not-to-exceed pricing prior to initiation of work.

Consideration will be given to only those firms that are qualified pursuant to law.

Proposer is required to indicate whether the Firm and/or any proposed sub-consultants are Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBE). Lee County encourages the utilization and participation of DBEs in procurements, and evaluation proceedings will be conducted within the established guidelines regarding equal employment opportunity and nondiscriminatory action based upon the grounds of race, color, sex or national origin. Interested certified Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) firms as well as other minority-owned and women-owned firms are encouraged to respond.

SELECTION PROCEDURE:

The selection of the Consultant will be made in accordance with Lee County Procurement Policy and Chapter 287.055 Florida Statutes. Some or all of the responding firms may be requested to provide telephone interviews or written or oral technical proposals (or both), for the ranking process. After ranking of the consultants by the Board of County Commissioners, the contract fee will be negotiated in accordance with Section 287.055, Florida Statutes.

NOTE: Proposed short-list and final selection meeting dates are posted on the Procurement Management web page at www.lee-county.com/procurementmanagement .

TERM OF AWARD

If awarded, the term of this solicitation is anticipated to be in effect for five years. The County reserves the right to renew this quote (or any portion thereof) and to negotiate lower pricing as a condition for each renewal, for up to one additional three-year period, upon mutual agreement of both parties and, except as to lower pricing, under the same terms and conditions.

DESIGNATED CONTACT

The awarded vendor shall appoint a person or persons to act as a primary contact for all County departments. This person or back-up shall be readily available during normal work hours by phone or in person, and shall be knowledgeable of the terms and procedures involved.

AFFIDAVIT CERTIFICATION IMMIGRATION LAWS

The attached document, Affidavit Certification Immigration Laws, is required and should be submitted with your solicitation package. It must be signed and notarized. Failure to include this affidavit with your response will delay the consideration and review of your submission; and could result in your response being disqualified.

AGREEMENTS/CONTRACTS

PROJECT GUIDELINES AND CRITERIA

The County has established the following Guidelines, Criteria, Goals, Objectives, Constraints, Schedule, Budget and/or Requirements which shall serve as a guide to the CONSULTANT in performing the professional services and work to be provided pursuant to this Agreement:

Any governmental entity may utilize the provisions of this contract for their specific needs.

No amount of work is guaranteed upon the execution of a Professional Services Agreement.

Hourly rates and all other negotiated expenses will remain in effect throughout the duration of the contract period, including the renewal unless modified by change orders.

This contract does not entitle any firm to exclusive rights to County contracts. The County reserves the right to perform any and all available required work in-house or by any other means it so desires.

In reference to Exhibit B of the Professional Service Agreement, local (Lee County) vehicle travel mileage is considered incidental to the work and not an extra expense. Also, man-hours spent in travel time to and from work or the job site(s), are not compensable.

County reserves the right to add or delete, at any time, any or all tasks or services associated with this agreement

Immigration Laws: Lee County will not intentionally award County contracts to any Consultant who knowingly employs unauthorized alien workers, constituting a violation of the employment provisions contained in 8 U.S.C. Section 1324 a(e), Section 274A(e) of the Immigration and Nationality Act ("INA).

Lee County shall consider the employment by any Consultant of unauthorized aliens a violation of Section 274A(e) of the INA. Such violation by the recipient of the employment provisions contained in Section 274A(e) of the INA shall be grounds for unilateral cancellation of the contract by Lee County.

EVALUATION CRITERIA

The firms offering the best interview and presentation, in the opinion of the County will be awarded a contract. Only top three proposal firms achieving the most points will be invited to participate in a telephone interview/presentation after submission of letter of Interest. Firms must comply with the minimum requirement stated above, under submission of letters of interest (page 1), with no more than 15 pages, excluding attachments, to comply with the criteria listed herein.

In addition to the requested information listed under Submission of Letter of Interest, Section b (page 1), firms should address the following in their submittal.

CRITERIA 1: Introductory Statement (maximum points 30) (Maximum of 1 Page)

Consultant should providing general information about firm and indicating specific strengths that the consultant can provide for Lee County. List any relationships that might be construed as potential conflicts of interest, for example, if the consultant works for any landfill develops and/or WTE developers or operators, etc. Including relationships that could be beneficial to the County.

CRITERIA 2: EXPERIENCE (maximum points 40)

- Provide the firm's relevant experience in consulting services to governmental agencies for similar projects with in the last 7 years. Include locations, summary of scope of services, dates when work was performed, client's name, address, and telephone number and name of contact person for reference.
- Provide the firm's experience with air quality regulatory requirements including experience with 'advanced' SNCR control systems relating to waste to energy facilities and particularly has recent and direct experience with Florida DEP staff, regulations, and rules. Does the consultant have direct experience working with WTE facilities that consistently emit less than 120 ppm NoX?
- Describe the consultants in-house support staff having demonstrated experience in solid waste and WTE financial analysis, feasibility studies and title V permits.
- Describe the consultants in-house support staff with demonstrated experience in the negotiations and financial analysis of waste to energy facility operations and maintenance agreements and power purchase agreements.

CRITERIA 3: KEY PERSONNEL (maximum points 20)
