ACTION REQUESTED:

- A) Approve the ranking of firms by the Evaluation Committee for Request for Proposal No. RFP160330, Public Utilities Financial Rate Consultant, in the following order: 1) Public Resources Management Group, Inc. 2) Willdan Financial Services
- B) Approve award of Request for Proposal No. RFP160330, Public Utilities Financial Rate Consultant, to the top-ranked firm, Public Resources Management Group, Inc., to provide general utility financial consulting services, for an initial term of one year, as approved in the department's annual adopted budget.
- C) Authorize the Chair to execute the contract documents on behalf of the Board of County Commissioners.
- D) Authorize expenditures for additional services under the contract as needed, and as provided in Request for Proposals No. RFP160330, as approved in the department's annual adopted budget. Grant the Director of Procurement Management the authority to execute Supplemental Task Authorization documents as necessary for these additional services.
- E) Grant the Director of Procurement Management the authority to renegotiate and execute renewals of this contract, with approval from County Administration, for up to three additional, one-year terms, if doing so is in the best interest of Lee County.

WHAT ACTION ACCOMPLISHES:

Approves the ranking of firms and authorizes the execution of a contract with the top ranked firm, Public Resources Management Group, Inc., for Request for Proposal No. RFP160330 Public Utilities Financial Rate Consultant. Provides the Public Utilities Department with professional consultant services for general utility financial consulting services and assistance. The initial contract term is one year in an amount not to exceed \$78,580 for Fiscal Year 16/17 for completion of annual revenue sufficiency/rate study reviews for Utilities and Solid Waste, as well as providing annual assistance with the Capital Planning Tool. The contract also allows for additional services assistance with financial policy issues; review of municipal/Interlocal agreements; design of minor fees and charges; analysis of utility acquisitions; bond-related refinancing and rating issues as approved in the department's annual adopted
