Narratives

Disaster Damage:

On September 26, 2024, Hurricane Helene made landfall in the Big Bend area as a Category 4 storm with winds reaching 140 miles per hour. Lee County experienced winds up to 65 miles per hour and had peak water levels up to 5 feet. 2 Flooding levels experienced along Lee County’s coastal communities varied by location. High water marks collected following Hurricane Helene revealed an average of 2 feet of inundation experienced by structures located within 250 feet of open water, with a recorded maximum of 4.5 feet a long the lowest-lying areas. Less than two weeks after Helene, Hurricane Milton made landfall near Siesta Key on October 9, 2024. Milton was a Category 3 storm with 120 mile per hour sustained winds. High water marks collected following Hurricane Milton revealed an average of 2 feet of inundation experienced by structures located within 800 feet of open water, with a recorded maximum of 6 feet along the lowest-lying areas. More reports of flooding were recorded within communities located further inland along the Caloosahatchee River for Hurricane Milton than what was experienced for Hurricane Helene. The County’s already battered housing and infrastructure experienced additional damage from both Helene and Milton. FEMA Individual assistance data indicates that 1,237 residential properties experienced moderate or greater damage. Damage data analyzed through the unmet needs assessment show that remaining infrastructure damage will cost approximately \$250 million to repair.

Recovery Needs:

While still recovering from Hurricane Ian, Lee County experienced significant impacts from major Hurricanes Helene and Milton. Damage data analyzed through the unmet needs assessment show that Hurricane Helene and Hurricane Milton caused more than \$607.6 million in unmet need damage Countywide. These storms are responsible for more than 546,734 cubic yards of debris in unincorporated areas alone.

Overall Progress Narrative:

This Quarterly Performance Report (QPR), due July 30, 2026, summarizes the progress of Lee County's Community Development Block Grant – Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) Program under Grant No. B-25-UU-12-0003 for the reporting period. This is Lee County's second QPR for CDBG-DR funding allocated pursuant to Federal Register 90 FR 4759, published on January 16, 2025.

The Lee County CDBG-DR Action Plan was approved by the Lee County Board of County Commissioners and submitted to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) on April 1, 2025. HUD approved the Action Plan on May 14, 2025, allowing the County to move forward with the implementation of recovery programs designed to address the unmet needs resulting from Hurricanes Helene and Milton.

Since program launch, Lee County has made substantial progress toward implementing its Hurricanes Helene and Milton's disaster recovery initiatives. Through the coordinated efforts of County staff, consultants, and contracted service providers, the County has successfully advanced housing recovery activities, continued homeowner assistance, and initiated construction on critical infrastructure improvements that will strengthen community resilience.

As of the end of the reporting period, the LeeCares Individual Housing Recovery Program had received 1,303 applications. Of these, 357 applications remained active, 313 households had been awarded assistance, and 117 homeowners had completed construction and received key turnover, representing successful completion of their recovery projects.

CDBG-DR Housing Program Milestones During the Reporting Period

- LeeCares Individual Housing Recovery Program – Housing Rehabilitation, Reconstruction, Replacement, and Elevation (HRRE): Sixty-four (64) homes were completed during the reporting period, including 9 reconstructions, 24 rehabilitations, and 31 replacement homes. Additionally, 141 homes remained under construction, demonstrating continued progress toward restoring safe, resilient housing for disaster-impacted households.
- Disaster Relief Assistance (DRA) Program: The program remained available to eligible homeowners throughout the reporting period. Although no households received assistance this quarter, the County continued program outreach and maintained readiness to assist eligible applicants as recovery needs arise.

Public Facilities and Infrastructure Milestones During the Reporting Period

- Public Facilities and Critical Infrastructure: Construction commenced on two (2) public facilities and critical infrastructure projects during the reporting period. These projects represent a significant milestone in Lee County's long-term recovery efforts and will improve the resiliency and reliability of essential public infrastructure serving disaster-impacted communities.
- Lee County remains committed to the timely and compliant expenditure of CDBGDR funds while ensuring that recovery investments continue to benefit impacted residents and strengthen the long-term resilience of the community. The County will continue advancing housing recovery, infrastructure improvements, and other eligible activities in accordance with HUD requirements and the approved Action Plan.

Fair Housing Activities

During the reporting period, in recognition of National Fair Housing Month (April), the Lee County Department worked collaboratively with the County's Social Media and Marketing Team to develop and implement a public outreach campaign promoting fair housing rights and responsibilities. Informational graphics and educational content were designed and published once per week throughout the month of April on the County's official Facebook and Instagram social media platforms.

The campaign highlighted key provisions of the Fair Housing Act (Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968), emphasizing that discrimination in the sale, rental, or financing of housing based on race, color, national origin, religion, sex, disability, or familial status is prohibited. Weekly posts educated the public on examples of unlawful housing discrimination, such as refusing to rent or sell housing, imposing different terms or conditions, steering individuals to or away from certain neighborhoods, and failing to provide reasonable accommodations for persons with disabilities.

The outreach also informed residents of their rights under federal fair housing laws and provided resources for reporting potential housing discrimination, including HUD's Fair Housing complaint process. By leveraging the County's social media platforms, the campaign increased public awareness of fair housing protections, encouraged equal access to housing opportunities, and reinforced the County's ongoing commitment to affirmatively furthering fair housing within the community.

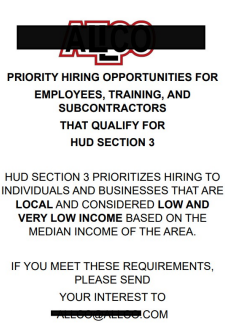
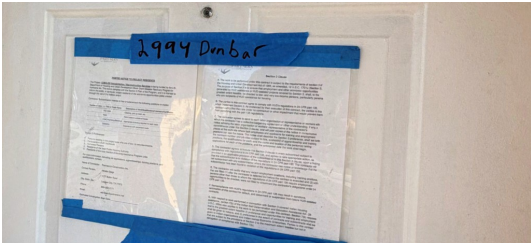
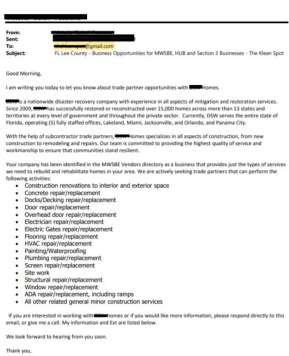

Housing Rehabilitation, Reconstruction, and Elevation (HRRE-HMP) Program
During the reporting period, the Hurricane Helene/Milton Housing Repair and Replacement Program (HRRE/HMP) served 64 households across Bonita Springs, Cape Coral, Estero, Fort Myers, Lehigh Acres, Matlacha, North Fort Myers, and St. James City. Of these cases, 41 properties were located in Flood Zone X and 23 were located in Flood Zone A. Assistance included 24 rehabilitation projects, nine reconstruction projects, and 31 manufactured housing unit replacements. A total of 15 assisted homes required elevation.

During the reporting period, the program generated 5,754 total labor hours, of which 4,360 hours, or approximately 75.8%, were performed by Section 3 workers. No Targeted Section 3 worker labor hours were reported. While the program substantially exceeded HUD's 25% Section 3 worker labor-hour benchmark, it did not meet the applicable 5% Targeted Section 3 worker benchmark.

General contractors perform and document Section 3 best-efforts activities quarterly to increase employment and contracting opportunities for Section 3 and Targeted Section 3 workers and businesses. Examples of these efforts included email communications informing businesses of trade-partner opportunities available to Section 3 businesses, on-site advertisements promoting Section 3 requirements and opportunities, and social media posts publicizing Section 3 requirements and available employment and contracting opportunities. The program will continue working with its general contractors to strengthen outreach and increase Targeted Section 3 worker participation during future reporting periods.

Activity Description:

Key sections of Pine Island Rd and Burnt Store Rd will be resurfaced. This project not only improves driving conditions but also enhances the roads’ ability to withstand heavy rainfall, flooding, and storm surge often associated with hurricanes. The work will include milling deteriorated asphalt, stabilizing the underlying road base to prevent erosion and washout, and applying a new asphalt surface designed to increase drainage efficiency and reduce long-term maintenance needs. The project will also include traffic management during construction to keep motorists safe and accommodate all Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements, reinforcing both accessibility and community preparedness.

Activity Progress Narrative:

The Notice to Proceed was issued on April 16, 2026, and construction activities commenced as scheduled within the Pine Island Road project area. Project compliance monitoring remains ongoing and includes employee interviews and the weekly submission and review of Certified Payroll Reports to ensure compliance with contract requirements. During the reporting period, the contractor expanded construction activities to the Burnt Store Road project area. A change order is currently under review to incorporate additional project scope. Concurrently, the County's Environmental Assessment is being re-evaluated to address the proposed scope modifications.

This project will repair damaged sidewalks and associated drainage as a result of Hurricanes Helene and Milton. The County will hire a contractor to remove all existing damaged sidewalks and replace with new concrete sidewalk and provide any required ADA upgrades that may be needed.

Location Description:

- Stringfellow Road on Pine Island in Lee County, Florida between Barrancas Avenue to the north and York Road to the south
- Iona Road (between Davis Road and McGregor Blvd), Davis Road (between Iona Road and McGregor Blvd), John Morris Road (between Iona Road and McGregor Blvd), and Thornton Road (between Iona Road and McGregor Blvd) in unincorporated Lee County, Florida

Activity Progress Narrative:

The construction contract was executed on May 6, 2026, with a Notice to Proceed issued for May 26, 2026.

Construction activities commenced as scheduled on May 26, 2026, within the Iona project area. Project compliance monitoring is ongoing, including employee interviews and the weekly submission and review of Certified Payroll Reports to ensure adherence to contract requirements.
