 As we begin to prepare the 1st Draft of the FY15-16 General Fund Budget, do you continue to support Continuation Budget Policies established last year?

 Are there policy changes or new policies you may want to consider as we start the FY15-16 budget season?

Continuation Budget Policies

- Same service levels unless Board directed
- General Fund reserve target of 20%
- \$5.9 million to 20/20 maintenance
- One-time major maintenance costs identified for potential funding from excess reserves

FY14-15 Budget Status

- Through 33% of the year, 31% spent in General Fund
- No significant revenue issues at this time
- \$8.9 million major maintenance from reserves:
 - Public Defender's Offices and Expanded Jury Room (\$3.75 million; both in design; construction planned for summer)
 - Brooks Park Lighting (\$420K; final completion mid-March)
 - Kelly Park Irrigation (\$450K; early design stages)
 - Sheriff's Equipment (\$4 million; 70 vehicles in process of being purchased; helicopter overhaul; replacement computers and radios; body armor replacement)

1st Draft – Transportation CIP

Fully funded within the 5-year plan as approved in FY14-15

- Homestead Rd. 4-lane FY15-16
- Estero Blvd. Improvement Segments FY14-15, FY15-16, FY17-18, FY19-20
- Alico Rd. 4-lane (Ben Hill to Airport Haul) FY17-18
- Burnt Store Rd. 4-lane FY14-15 (north segment), FY16-17 (central segment), FY18-19 (south segment)

Other project segments funded and added to 5-year plan

- Bike-Ped. \$6.1 million over five years (increased from \$3.9 million)
- Kismet/Littleton Realignment construction FY18-19 (\$1.6 million; half cost-share with Cape)
- Palomino Lane Bike Path/Turn Lanes fully funded (\$1.8 million), with construction FY16-17
- Three Oaks Extension North \$6 million ROW in five year window (added from last year)
- Ortiz 4-lane, Colonial-MLK \$1.6 million for design in FY17-18 (added from last year)

1st Draft – Transportation CIP

Partially Funded and Outside 5-year Window

- Big Carlos Pass (2021, \$45.3 million) contributing \$3.5 million a year in surplus tolls
- Cape Coral Bridge Westbound Span (2028, \$87.5 million) design starting in FY18-19;
 debt financing
- New Pass (2020, \$19.8 million) design starting FY17-18; tolls/gas tax; could pair with Little Carlos (\$3.3 million) and Big Hickory Pass (\$10 million); potential debt financing

Projects Not Funded or Partially Funded with Projected Service Level Issues

- Colonial Blvd., Summerlin Rd. to U.S. 41
- Ortiz Ave., Colonial Blvd. to MLK Blvd.
- Little Pine Island Pass Bridge
- Littleton Rd., Corbett Rd. to U.S. 41
