

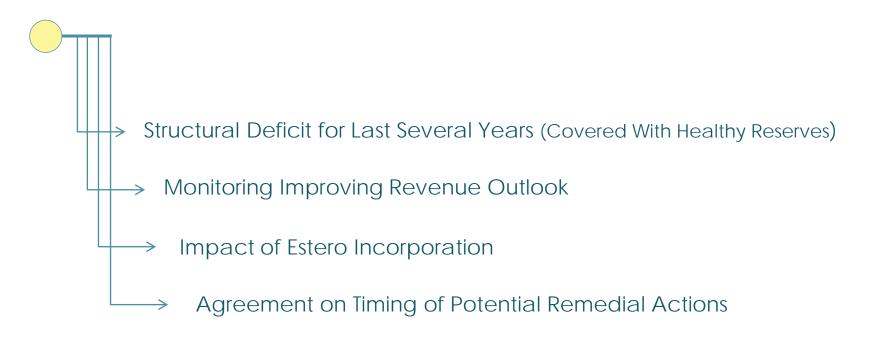

Positives / Negatives

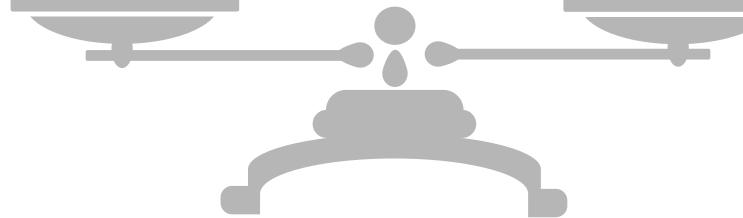


POSITIVE

- County cut MSTU budgets significantly since 2011
- Property tax base is coming back
- Building permit fund is self sustaining
- Fee revenues are increasing
- Line has been held on operating budgets
- Effectuated services agreement with Estero (September 2015; \$2.8 million)

NEGATIVE —

- Estero incorporation reduced
 Unincorporated MSTU revenues by \$5 million at a minimum
- Potential for Estero to reduce its services agreement
- Growth could increase demand and budgets

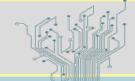
 Pays Cape Coral for Maintenance on Sections of Del Prado Blvd, Cape Coral Pkwy., and Hancock Bridge Pkwy.
