PHASE 1 - Storm Pre-Landfall


- Close Monitoring of Storm, Regional / State Resources
- Begin Internal Briefings and Prepare for EOC Activation
- Prepare and Draft State of Local Emergency (SoLE)
- Begin Evacuation Considerations
- Suspension of Tolls, LeeTran Fees, Closure of Some Bridges
- Board of Commissioner Roles:
 - Communicate with County Manager
 - Authorize State of Local Emergency and Mandatory Evacuation Orders



PHASE 1 - Activation

- 3 To 5 Days Prior to Landfall, Depending on Storm Track and Forecast Intensity
- Initiate Evacuation Decision-Making Process
- Transportation & Sheltering of Special Needs Clients
- Government / School Closures
- Prepare for Post-Landfall Response Operations
- Board of Commissioner Roles:
 - Continued Information Updates via County Mgr.





PHASE 2 - After the Storm

- Initiate Search and Rescue Operations
- Begin Initial Damage Assessments
- Requests for State and Federal Disaster Declarations
- Begin Debris Clearance and Removal
- Power and Utility Restoration (pre-determined priorities)
- Life Safety Damage Mitigation to Residences
- Board of Commissioner Roles:
 - Approve Debris Removal Plans



PHASE 3 - Recovery

- Initiate Re-Entry Plans and Curfews
- Support FEMA Disaster Recovery Centers
- Prioritize the Opening of Schools
- Encourage the Opening of Businesses
- Initiate Temporary Housing Plans (if necessary)
- Reconstruction Priorities Community Dev. Permitting
- Board of Commissioner Roles:
 - Public Information Support
