### Purpose of Presentation

<u>Purpose of Presentation</u>: Provide status of Solid Waste Master Plan Project as approved by the BoCC on April 5, 2016

- County population and waste volume projected to increase
- Existing system capacity will be exceeded soon
- Need long-term planning for permitting, financing, property acquisition, and system changes

Outcome of Project: Assist BoCC establish policies for solid waste management and financial planning through 2030



### Project is Approximately 50% Complete

Project includes 15 Tasks that are data and technology driven and build on one another to support alternatives for phased system improvements to meet projected demands.

### Preliminary Observations

#### Waste Characterization Study identified opportunities:

- For targeted education and outreach to businesses and residents
- To reduce Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) flow by diverting cardboard, plastic, bulky waste (such as furniture or appliances)
- For organics diversion

#### **Comparing Lee County to Others:**

- Mature system efficient, but needs to grow to meet future demand
- Will require step increases to manage growth once maximum capacity needs are identified

# Neighboring County Opportunities:

- Limited opportunities for mutual support with Charlotte County (dispose of Lee Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) / process Charlotte County recyclables)
- No opportunities for significant regional partnerships were identified



### Growth Trends Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) vs. Population

Year	Growth Rate	
	Municipal Solid Waste	County Population*
2016 – 2019	4.4%	2.7%
2020 – 2023	3.2%	2.6%
2024 – 2036	2.1%	2.3%

- Addressing short term trends in waste growth with continued business cases for good management practices
- Exceed reliable capacity FY19
- Typically requires 8 10 years to plan, permit, build significant capital assets
