EXHIBIT "A2"

SPECIAL PROVISIONS

Article 2.4 is hereby amended as follows:

"The COUNTY hereby agrees that it shall use other sources of funding for all work associated with the design and permitting aspects of the Statement of Work, attached hereto as Exhibit "C2". The DISTRICT agrees that DISTRICT funds may be used for the purchase of 16.61 acres of land, as described in the attached Exhibit "M2" for the purpose of construction of a stormwater conveyance to the existing Gator Slough. DISTRICT funds shall only be used for the land acquisition, capital or infrastructure costs which are required to complete the construction activities contained in Exhibit "C2" for Gator Slough improvements, Phase II and III."

EXHIBIT "C2" STATEMENT OF WORK GATOR SLOUGH IMPROVEMENTS PHASE I AND II

1.0 INTRODUCTION

The Gator Slough watershed encompasses approximately 55 square miles. This watershed runs from Matlacha Pass in Lee County, northeasterly, to the vicinity of Tuckers Grade in the Cecil Webb Wildlife Management Area in Charlotte County. A study of this watershed was completed in June 1991.

Concern has been expressed that the large volume of runoff entering Matlacha Pass is having detrimental effects on the vegetative and aquatic life. This concern, coupled with the ongoing emphasis on region-wide water conservation, indicates that methods to either divert or store excess flows should be considered.

In 1991 a study of this watershed was completed with recommendations to improve the conveyance and management of the water from the upper reaches of this watershed to the outfall. Phase I of this project was started in 1997. The first phase captures the excessive in the Gator Slough system and prevents its runoff into the Matlacha Pass preserve area. This is accomplished by diverting the water to the City of Cape Coral's fresh water canal system. This fresh water increases the supply of water for the City's dual water irrigation system and thus reduces the loss of water and the impact on the estuary's ecosystem. The project increases the storage capacity of the canal system, while the use of the dual water irrigation system reduces the draw down of the lower aquifers for residential irrigation uses.

The restrictions in the Gator Slough Canal have caused tail water conditions that have resulted in extended periods of flooding in the reaches upstream of US 41. The District has been working with representatives of the Florida Game and Freshwater Fish Commission for the past 8 to 10 years seeking solutions to decrease the long term ponding within the Cecil Webb / Babcock Wildlife Management Area. Phase II and III of this project is to continue to improve the conveyance of water from the upper reaches of this watershed to the Phase I project area that will divert this water to be stored and used at a later time.

Much of this long-term ponding is the result of downstream development pinching what was a wide historical flood plain into an unplanned connection of swales. The total project is to remove the down stream constrictions, divert stormwater flows into the City of Cape Coral Canal System and utilize the energy of local landowners to improve the unplanned swales by connecting flow ways across privately owned lands. These landowners are impacted in the same manner as the Wildlife Management Area.

2.0 SCOPE OF WORK

Phase II (FY 2002) of this project shall consist of maintenance to the existing channel from US 41 easterly to the east end of Tara Woods mobile home park approximately 4,400 linear feet. The channel shall be excavated to the neat lines of the permitted cross section. See Exhibit "M2" attached hereto and made a part of this Amendment No. 2.

Phase H (FY 2003) of this project shall consist of constructing a permissible stormwater conveyance from the east end of Tara Woods mobile home park easterly to the abandoned railroad grade approximately 5,700 linear feet.

The County shall be responsible for all site restoration and transportation of debris to appropriate disposal sites.

3.0 WORK BREAKDOWN STRUCTURE

PHASE II

- Task 2 The County shall obtain appropriate permits and approvals and shall select a site for the disposal of spoil and vegetation obtained from work required hereunder. Any excess materials shall not be deposited within the canal right-of-way and shall not constrict the canal conveyance.
- Task 3 The County shall acquire temporary easements if needed.
- Task 4 The County shall excavate approximately 4,400 linear feet of channel to the neat lines of the previously permitted cross sections.
- Task 5 The County shall stabilize the side slopes of the excavated channel.
- Task 6 The County shall provide engineering certification of project completion.
- Task 7 A site inspection shall be performed by the District's Project Manager.

PHASE III

- Task 1 The County shall mobilize equipment sufficient to perform the work required hereunder.
- Task 2 The County shall obtain appropriate permits and approvals and shall select a site for the disposal of spoil and vegetation obtained from work required hereunder. Any excess materials shall not be deposited within the canal right-of-way and shall not constrict the canal conveyance.

- Task 3 The County shall acquire temporary easements if needed.
- Task 4 The County shall excavate approximately 5,700 linear feet of a permissible stormwater conveyance. The County shall provide the District Project Manager with monthly written updates. The County shall include in the monthly updates the percent of completion and costs incurred to date on the project.
- Task 5 The County shall stabilize the side slopes of the excavated channel.
- Task 6 The County shall provide engineering certification of project completion.
- Task 7 A site inspection shall be performed by the District's Project Manager.

4.0 LOCATION OF THE PROJECT

Phase II of this project shall be performed at Gator Slough from US 41 to the easterly boundary of Tara Woods mobile home park approximately 4,400 linear feet.

Phase III of this project shall be performed at Gator Slough from the eastern boundary of Tara Woods mobile home park to the old abandoned railroad grade approximately 5,700 linear feet.

5.0 DELIVERABLES

This project will have a single deliverable for each phase: The certification by an engineer authorized on behalf of Lee County to certify that the current Phase of the project is completed.

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- Task 5 The County shall stabilize the side slopes of the excavated channel.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS

Article 2.4 is hereby amended as follows:

"The COUNTY hereby agrees that it shall use other sources of funding for all work associated with the design and permitting aspects of the Statement of Work, attached hereto as Exhibit "C2". The DISTRICT agrees that DISTRICT funds may be used for the purchase of 16.61 acres of land, as described in the attached Exhibit "M2" for the purpose of construction of a stormwater conveyance to the existing Gator Slough. DISTRICT funds shall only be used for the land acquisition, capital or infrastructure costs which are required to complete the construction activities contained in Exhibit "C2" for Gator Slough improvements, Phase II and III."

EXHIBIT "C2" STATEMENT OF WORK GATOR SLOUGH IMPROVEMENTS PHASE I AND II

1.0 INTRODUCTION

The Gator Slough watershed encompasses approximately 55 square miles. This watershed runs from Matlacha Pass in Lee County, northeasterly, to the vicinity of Tuckers Grade in the Cecil Webb Wildlife Management Area in Charlotte County. A study of this watershed was completed in June 1991.

Concern has been expressed that the large volume of runoff entering Matlacha Pass is having detrimental effects on the vegetative and aquatic life. This concern, coupled with the ongoing emphasis on region-wide water conservation, indicates that methods to either divert or store excess flows should be considered.

In 1991 a study of this watershed was completed with recommendations to improve the conveyance and management of the water from the upper reaches of this watershed to the outfall. Phase I of this project was started in 1997. The first phase captures the excessive in the Gator Slough system and prevents its runoff into the Matlacha Pass preserve area. This is accomplished by diverting the water to the City of Cape Coral's fresh water canal system. This fresh water increases the supply of water for the City's dual water irrigation system and thus reduces the loss of water and the impact on the estuary's ecosystem. The project increases the storage capacity of the canal system, while the use of the dual water irrigation system reduces the draw down of the lower aquifers for residential irrigation uses.

The restrictions in the Gator Slough Canal have caused tail water conditions that have resulted in extended periods of flooding in the reaches upstream of US 41. The District has been working with representatives of the Florida Game and Freshwater Fish Commission for the past 8 to 10 years seeking solutions to decrease the long term ponding within the Cecil Webb / Babcock Wildlife Management Area. Phase II and III of this project is to continue to improve the conveyance of water from the upper reaches of this watershed to the Phase I project area that will divert this water to be stored and used at a later time.

Much of this long-term ponding is the result of downstream development pinching what was a wide historical flood plain into an unplanned connection of swales. The total project is to remove the down stream constrictions, divert stormwater flows into the City of Cape Coral Canal System and utilize the energy of local landowners to improve the unplanned swales by connecting flow ways across privately owned lands. These landowners are impacted in the same manner as the Wildlife Management Area.

2.0 SCOPE OF WORK

Phase II (FY 2002) of this project shall consist of maintenance to the existing channel from US 41 easterly to the east end of Tara Woods mobile home park approximately 4,400 linear feet. The channel shall be excavated to the neat lines of the permitted cross section. See Exhibit "M2" attached hereto and made a part of this Amendment No. 2.

Phase M (FY 2003) of this project shall consist of constructing a permissible stormwater conveyance from the east end of Tara Woods mobile home park easterly to the abandoned railroad grade approximately 5,700 linear feet.

The County shall be responsible for all site restoration and transportation of debris to appropriate disposal sites.

3.0 WORK BREAKDOWN STRUCTURE
