#### Re 2002 Grants from the Claiborne and Ned Foulds Foundation

Dear Ms. Varley:

We are pleased to advise you that after careful deliberation with the Foundation's Advisory Committee and legal counsel to the Foundation, the Trustee has awarded you a *Retained Grant* in the amount of \$5,000.00. This grant is to help with the purchase of recording, monitoring and video equipment, only to be spent in accordance with the strict terms of the application and this letter.

A retained Grant is made when, in the opinion of the Trustee a charity is not presently in a position to spend the money represented by the grant for the purposes outlined in the application. The grant money will be retained until the charity is in a position to pay or spend the money for the grant's charitable purpose.

Since your application provides for purchases of personal property, the Trustee will require some evidence of the charity obligating itself to spend the money for the charitable purposes outlined in the application. For example, a copy of the sales contract will need to be sent to the Trustee. If there is no contract, the charity will be required to first expend the funds, and then present the Trustee with copies of the cancelled checks or receipts from the persons who did the work or purchased the materials and supplies.

Retained grants should only be considered as temporary. If monies are not expended by May 1, 2003, the Trustee retains the right to review the grant and revoke it. This admonition is not meant to encourage charities to expend funds for foolish purposes, but is intended to allow the Trustee to have some control over the grant funds and the priorities of their expenditure. In May of 2003 any charity receiving a Retained Grant will be contacted by the Trustee for an update as to the current status of the project for which the grant was made. Charities will be expected to respond to these requests with





reasonable promptness. If these inquiries are not responded to, the Trustee will automatically withdraw the grant on August 1, 2003.

In the meantime, you should plan to make arrangements to evidence to the Trustee that the funds will be expended for the purposes as set forth in your application. In addition, it is most important that you plan to have an appropriate plaque or other similar form of recognition setting forth that the grant provided came from "The Claiborne and Ned Foulds Foundation."

In conclusion, it should be noted that organizations receiving grants this year might be eligible for consideration when the Foundation issues notice that applications will be considered for 2003. This notice will be published in May of 2003.





Family Connection Center is a grant program of the University of Florida Lee County Extension Service

#### 3. Give a brief history of the applicant.

The Family Connection Center provides court-ordered supervised visitation for children and their non-custodial parent(s). The Family Connection Center (FCC) began in 1994 as a grassroots effort by a group of individuals concerned about the quality of parental visitation to children in foster care. Following two years of education and development, FCC began providing services in the fall of 1996 in partnership with the University of Florida Lee County Extension Service. This partnership came about from the Florida legislation pertaining to the establishment of supervised visitation programs. In 1999 FCC became an Extension Service's grant program under the Family and Consumer Sciences Division. The average number of visits per month is 115.

Family Connection Center provides visitation and parenting education to Lee County families. Supervised visits are available for families and children in the care of the Department of Children and Families as well as to families involved in domestic violence and divorce/custody cases. Parenting education is provided to those families assessed to be in need of such services. FCC has two contracts with the Department of Children and Families for services to children under their supervision. Other families are assessed a fee based upon their ability to pay.

The Family Connection Center keeps children safe while they visit with their biological parents. Typically these children and families have been separated by abuse/neglect, divorce/custody and struggle with issues of domestic violence. In addition, as a program of the University of Florida Lee county Extension Service, we are able to provide an educational program that spans all aspects of information for building a healthy family. These educational areas include nutrition, family money management, housing, early childhood development and parenting.

Visitations are offered in a safe, comfortable environment and are observed by trained staff. Visitations and parenting classes are offered at times that are

convenient for families and keep parents on the job and children in school. The close supervision of our staff enables families to bond more quickly and the court system to make more informed decisions as to the future placement of children in a permanent home. We see children and families on a regular basis and report our observations to caseworkers, Guardian Ad Litem volunteers, judges and attorneys.

# 4. Briefly state the method of operation, e.g., how decisions are made of the applicant.

At present, FCC is part of the Lee County Extension Services. Extension Services is supported by both the University of Florida and Lee County as part of the Lee County Parks and Recreation Department. Overall county management rests with the county commissioners who are elected officials. The commissioners approve the contracts from Department of Children and Families. Parks and Recreation provide accounting services including check writing for FCC. This service is under the direction of Cindy Mitar who has extensive experience with Parks and Recreation. Susan Hedge, County Extension Director, oversees the general operations of FCC as well as other Extension programs. She has an Overall Advisory Board that assists her in an advisory capacity.

A Program Manager with responsibilities only for FCC makes daily operational and staffing decisions for Family Connection Center. She accepts new referrals, oversees scheduling, monthly reports and represents FCC in court when subpoenaed. She is also responsible for development, strategic planning, and financial management. Each family has a visitation supervisor assigned. This supervisor is responsible for seeing that the guidelines for supervision are followed and for the monthly reports to DCF and/or the family's attorney.

- · Supervised visitation and parenting education

At this time Family Connection Center conducts charitable endeavors in Lee County. However, FCC has provided consultation to Charlotte, Hendry and Collier county groups already running or interested in starting a supervised visitation program.

The Department of Children and Families refers an average of 11-13 new families monthly for visitation services. The dependency court typically orders two visits per week per family. Frequency of visitations for domestic violence and family law cases are determined on a case-by-case basis. The contract between DCF and Family Connection Center allows visitations for a minimum of 6 months for families whose goal is reunification and a maximum of 6 months for families whose goal has been changed from reunification to termination of parental rights. If all referrals were accommodated, and all visits occurred as scheduled an estimated total of 5,000 visitations would occur annually. Unfortunately, FCC,

under current funding resources, only has the capacity to conduct 80 visits per month. There is a waiting list. The purpose of the grant request is to obtain equipment so that one visitation supervisor can monitor two visits at one time. This type of visitation would be used only for those visits that do not require intense, one-on-one close supervision. Additionally, Family Connection Center would be able to support its written observations with a visual account in the event of an incident or if required by the court. Use of two one-way mirrors will also allow for the non-intrusive observation of visits by caseworkers and quardians.

The equipment will be ordered when FCC is notified that the request has been granted. FCC will be responsible for maintenance. The amount requested includes purchase and installation of the equipment (The county will be responsible for placement of the one-way mirrors. For additional equipment/costs, please refer to correspondence from Video Specialists, Inc).

# 13. State the method by which applicant will verify such use or purpose to the Trustee.

The Family Connection Center will provide Foulds Foundation with invoices and photographs of renovations and equipment installed. Additionally FCC will provide the Trustee with statistical data noting the anticipated increase in visitations provided as a result of the use of the equipment. Too, an open house to announce the new equipment is planned and the Trustee will be invited.

#### 14. State the means by which the grant will be given dignified publicity.

A plaque will be placed on the equipment denoting the donation by the Fould's Foundation. Recognition will also be made through the newsletter of the Lee County Extension Services and local media.

The Program Manager is a 26-year veteran social work professional who holds a Master's Degree. She is a member of the Academy of Certified Social Workers and a Licensed Clinical Social Worker.

The Extension Services Director, Susan Hedge, has 28 years experience with Extension and holds a Master's Degree in Family and Consumer Sciences. She is certified as a Family Life Educator and Family and Consumer Educator professional.

The members of the Board of County Commissioners are elected officials.

The Advisory Boards are comprised of appointed and elected volunteers.

16. State the amount and percentage of funds applicant raises in Lee County which are spent in Lee County on an annual basis.

The fiscal year for FCC runs 7/01 to 6/30. The budget for the fiscal year ending 6/30/02 was \$158,836. These monies were raised entirely in Lee County from the DCF contracts, court administration funds and private fees. In addition volunteer hours valued at approximately \$9,500.00.
