

Firefighters fight for charities

More than 450 fire departments will compete here in 2003

Alan Makar is an engineer with the Fort Myers Fire Department.

During the next nine months Makar will assume a second title as co-chairman of the 3lst Florida Firefighters Games, which will come to Southwest Florida from May 1 through June 8, 2003.

More than 450 fire departments and nearly 5,000 athletes will descend on the area to compete for six weeks in 50 events at 28 different sites.

Events range from bass fishing, windsurfing, roller hockey, trap/skeet shooting to all of the traditional Olympic-style sports.

"This is a large undertaking. We put in our bid three years ago, made a great presentation with the help of a lot of local officials and were granted the 2003 Games," said Makar, who co-chairs the event with Jim Carroll of the Cape Coral Fire Department.

"We're already way ahead of the game in being organized," said Makar, who cited the help of Lee County and Cape Coral Parks and Recreation, the Fort Myers Track Club, Swim Florida and Florida Gulf Coast University.

The non-profit event, which started with just four fire departments and 10 events in 1972, will use the proceeds to benefit the local Ronald McDonald House and the New York Firefighters 9/ll Relief Fund.

The opening ceremonies will be staged in Cape Coral on Saturday, May 3, and the event will be a day-long celebration.

"Our goal is to raise \$50,000 and possibly add a new wing to the Ronald McDonald House," said Makar.

Finding local firefighters to compete in the Games will not be a problem.

"I started 12 years ago and was hooked from the very beginning," said Makar, who competes in softball, bowling



and golf. "The Games create a lot of motivation to stay in shape and be competitive."

Lee County firefighters have captured medals on an annual basis.

During the recent 2002 Games in Brevard County, Lee County softball players, ice hockey players, bowlers, swimmers and bass fishermen finished in the top three.

Two of the standouts were Chris Bevan of Cape Coral and Tony Desanto of Lehigh Acres.

Bevan is recognized as ones of the leading cyclists in Florida and won Firefighters Games gold medals in the 2and 5-mile open races three of the last four years.

Desanto won the 30-plus singles racquetball title at Tampa in 2001 and again this summer.

Bevan, an engineer with the

Cape Coral Fire Department, is a skilled racer with national experience at the highest level. The 31-year-old transplanted Californian, who moved here nine years ago when his wife, Chris, and her parents decided to relocate to Cape Coral, has competed in six national cycling championships.

"I entered a cycling program in Los Angeles right after the 1984 Olympics with money remaining from the Games and was selected three months later to race in the nationals at Allentown (Pa.)," said Bevan.

Bevan finished sixth in his first national meet and was never lower than fifth in the kilometer open class against the clock. He won the Florida state title in June at the Fort Lauderdale cycling facility in

the Over 30 Masters division.

"You need a lot of time to train if you're going to be competitive nationally and we now have two kids, so the five-hour training days are probably gone," said Bevan, who visited his native Woodland Hills, Calif., this week.

"It's so different than Florida. With the mountains, I would ride 150 miles one way to Santa Barbara when I first started, stay and have fun with friends and then return the next morning," said Beyan.

"Chris is an example of the high level of athlete we have in the department but the average person can also have just as much fun," said Makar.

"Physical fitness is important but so is sportsmanship, camaraderie and the benefit to local charity."
