WHAT ACTION ACCOMPLISHES: Increases the purchasing level, which will allow the Department of Human Services to work within limited time constraints for the acquisition of appropriate vacant properties for rehabilitation. 2. The increase in the purchasing level will allow the Human Services, Housing Program to be competitive in purchasing existing structures for rehabilitation. Structures below \$50,000.00 usually require extensive rehabilitation. Funding will be provided by the Department of Housing and Urban Development, CDBG Revolving Fund, HOPE III Sales Proceeds, or HOME program funds. All recipients of the program will be required to meet the Federal income guidelines. This action will provide the Department the ability to increase supportive housing stock more timely. 8. - 3. The provisions of this Resolution are severable, and it is the intention to confer to the whole or any part of this Resolution, the powers herein provided for. If any of the provisions of this Resolution shall be held unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, the decision of such court shall not affect or impair any of the other remaining provisions of this Resolution. It is hereby declared to be the Board's legislative intent that this Resolution would have been adopted had such an unconstitutional provision not been included herein.

"EXHIBIT A"

Amend the Lee County Purchasing Manual, Section 11, entitled "Exempt Purchases" to create an exemption for the Lee County Human Services, Housing Program, to increase the formal purchasing level for the purchase of homes for rehabilitation from \$50,000 to \$75,000.

11.0.4.15 Purchases of housing units made by the Lee County Department of Human Services from funds provided by the Department of Housing and Urban Development, CDBG Revolving Fund, HOPE III Sales Proceeds or HOME program may not exceed \$75,000 without requiring Board of County Commissioner approval. Such purchases are solely for rehabilitation of the houses for use by the elderly or disabled or low income families and for revitalization in targeted neighborhoods.
