- 4. Costs for these control operations shall not exceed the established Task Assignment amount, and must not jeopardize the Contractor's ability to achieve the required level of control for the primary target species. It is the responsibility of the Contractor to determine that all control operations do not exceed the established Task Assignment amount.

TASK ASSIGNMENT RESPONSIBILITIES

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE CONTRACTOR:

- 1. Upon full execution of the Task Assignment, the Contractor will coordinate with the DEP Site Manager to establish a mutually agreeable work schedule.
- 2. A Ground Crew Supervisor, employed by the Contractor, will be present at all times when work on the site is underway;
- 3. Ground Crew Supervisors will be responsible for all control activities and safety on project sites. The Ground Crew Supervisor will assure contract crews are knowledgeable of, and remain within property and treatment boundaries. Every effort shall be made by the Contractor to avoid damage to native vegetation and wildlife;
- 4. Ground Crew Supervisors will be pesticide applicators possessing current certification by the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (FDACS) in the Forestry or Right-of-Way categories. A copy of each supervisor's FDACS certification will be provided to the DEP Site Manager prior to initiation of on-site supervisory duties;
- 5. The Ground Crew Supervisor may supervise a maximum of eight (8) field employees at any given time, unless otherwise noted in the Task Assignment;
- 6. The Ground Crew Supervisor shall be responsible for the collection, recording, and timely submission of all data and reports required. At weekly intervals and at the completion of initial treatments and site reassessment, a complete report will be submitted to the Site Manager detailing sites treated, number and size of plants killed, and type of treatment used. This data will be recorded on the DEP "Daily Progress Report Form".
- 7. The Contractor will strictly adhere to all herbicide label application, precautionary, and safety statements;
- 8. All control efforts (except cogon grass treatment) shall be at least 95% effective in preventing re-sprout of treated target vegetation. If 95% kill rate is not achieved for any area of the project after two months following project completion, one additional thorough treatment of the plant species listed under "Project Goals" in the project area will be the responsibility of the Contractor at no cost to the DEP;
- 9. Cogon grass treatments shall be 100% effective in killing above ground portions (top kill) of target vegetation. If 100% top kill rate is not achieved for any area of the project after 30 days following project completion, one additional thorough treatment of the plant species listed under "Project Goals" in the project area will be the responsibility of the Contractor at no cost to the DEP;
- 10. The Contractor shall forward an original invoice along with all corresponding Daily Progress Report Forms, completed and approved, to the Bureau of Invasive Plant Management, 3915 Commonwealth Boulevard, MS 710, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-3000 within ten (10) working days of work completion;

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE DEP SITE MANAGER:

- 1. The Site Manager reserves the right to inspect, at any time, the Contractor's procedure, spray system(s), spray solution(s), and other ancillary equipment, and to approve operating personnel. Inspection, however, will not relieve the Contractor of any obligations or responsibilities nor will it transfer any liability to the lands listed under "Project Location.":
- 2. No additional work can be added to this Task Assignment without a fully executed Change Order. Additional work includes additional treatment areas or change in treatment methodology.
- 3. The site management agency authorizes Bureau of Invasive Plant Management staff to approve invoice payments of all funds encumbered under this Task Assignment. Payment will be approved only for that work approved by the Site Manager. A copy of the approved invoice will be forwarded to the site management agency.

Method of Control

Contractual Services

Project Goals

This project will control Category I plants including melalueca, Australian pine, Brazilian pepper, carrotwood, earleaf acacia and Guinea grass, which is not an EPPC plant but is invasive, found within the San Carlos Bay-Bunche Beach Preserve. This preserve is also within the boundaries of the Estero Bay State Buffer Preserve.

Project Location

The project site is located in southwestern Lee County near San Carlos Bay and the Sanibel Causeway. Access to the site is from Summerlin Road (SR 869). Please see the attached **Project Map.**

Project Description

The project site is an approximately 40 acre area within a high marsh and transitional wetlands community.

- 1. The western portion of the site consists of a stand of Australian pine which forms a canopy ranging from 100% to 25% with a understory of Brazilian pepper and scattered melalueca. Percent coverage averages approximately 50%
- 2. The eastern portion of the site has melalueca and Brazilian pepper in densities ranging from 25% to 100%. Percent coverage averages approximately 30%. There are also clumps of earleaf acacia and Guinea grass and scattered carrotwood.

Work Specifications

Work performance will include labor, equipment and supplies including herbicides and adjuvants for the control of the exotic plants listed under **Project Goals** in the areas described under **Project Description**. The contractor shall avoid damage to native vegetation and wildlife. The contractor will be responsible for the control and/or removal of all exotic plants listed including mature plants and seedlings.

The exotics in the western portion shall be removed from the site by heavy equipment that cuts, grinds, chips or piles and burns the biomass. Melaleuca stumps shall be treated with 75% Roundup Pro and 25% water immediately after cutting. Brazilian pepper and Australian pine stumps shall be treated with a 30% solution of Garlon 4 in JLB Oil Plus immediately after cutting. Herbicide will be applied using a low pressure type of spray to avoid non-target damage and waste. Work shall only occur when the site is dry. Since this is a high marsh site near a body of water that is tidally influenced it is prone to irregular flooding from storms, higher than normal tidal events, and heavy rains.


The exotics in the eastern portion shall be hand cut and chipped on site. Chips can either be removed from the site or broadcast on the site, but not left in piles. Stumps shall be treated using the same methods as described above. Carrotwood and earleaf acacia shall be handpulled or cut and treated as described above for Australian pine. Guinea grass shall be sprayed using a foliar application of 3% Roundup Pro and surfactant.


Other requirements and Provisions

It may be necessary to obtain environmental permits from regulatory agencies for heavy equipment to work within the wetlands. If so, obtaining these permits will be the responsibility of the county.

Project Time Frame

This project should be done during the dry season. However since the site is also influenced by rainfall work should only occur when the site is dry and the water table is at least several inches below the soil surface.





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
