7. BACKGROUND: The Florida Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) and the DOC contacted Lee County in							
July 1997 regarding forming an Invasive Exotic Plant Control Crew that would be staffed by a DOC Officer and inmates.							
They would equipped with safety gear and chainsaws supplied by DEP, transported in a 15 passenger van purchased and							
naintained by Lee County, and supplied with herbicides by the agency on whose property the crew would be working.							
The BOCC approved the original agreement December 2, 1997 with subsequent annual renewals. The van was purchased in							
1998 at a cost of \$21,169. Since its inception, the crew has worked on 31 sites in Lee, Collier and Charlotte County with a							
total estimated cost savings of \$411,320. Of this, \$122,860 represents cost savings for exotic plant control on Lee County							
conservation lands.							
\							
Lee County Fleet Management has determined that 15 passenger vans are no longer appropriate for use by county employees							
lue to safety concerns. They have been replaced with 7 passenger Ford Windstar vans. The Windstar is not appropriate for							
ise by the DOC Crew due to size and ground clearance. The State of Florida continues to buy and use 15 passenger vans. The							
pest way to continue the program and meet with needs and concerns of all involved is to donate the 15 passenger van to the							
DOC.
