9. Background:

The Friends of Six Mile Cypress Slough Preserve is a 501(C) 3 not for profit organization graciously donating \$85,000 from their building fund to be used for construction of the Six Mile Cypress Slough Interpretive Facility. The Friends of Six Mile Cypress Slough Preserve organization was formed to preserve, promote, and protect the Slough. They are actively soliciting contributions to assist the County in its effort to build the Interpretive Facility. WHEREAS, the Friends of Six Mile Cypress Slough Preserve is a not-for-profit advocacy and support organization committed to preserving, protecting and promoting Six Mile Cypress Slough Preserve for future generations through education and community partnerships, working together with Lee County and South Florida Water Management District.

WHEREAS, the Six Mile Cypress Slough is a 2,200 acre wetland in Fort Myers, Florida, that measures approximately 9 miles long and 1/3 mile wide. The Slough also serves as a corridor for wildlife by providing a safe route of travel.

WHEREAS, Six Mile Cypress Slough Preserve is a critical wetland system having positive value in inspiring and educating its visitors about wetlands and their roles in preserving the environment and local quality of life.

WHEREAS, Friends of Six Mile Cypress Slough Preserve is in the process of planning and raising funds for building an Interpretive Center at the Preserve. The Center will contain space for exhibits, administration, and education and interpretation to orient and educate visitors. Window viewing areas of a pond will connect visitors to the wonders of the Slough, and an outdoor teaching deck will enhance educational opportunities and aid in the visitors' transition to the boardwalk trails.

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Friends of the Six Mile Cypress Slough to make a contribution to Lee County in the amount of \$85,000 to be used to construct a new facility at the Six Mile Cypress Slough; and

WHEREAS, Lee County desires to accept the above named funds; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Parks and Recreation recommends to the Board of County Commissioners that the above named donation be accepted by Lee County; and
