- 1. ACTION REQUESTED/PURPOSE: Approve Project # PB060178, the utilization (piggyback) of the Florida Transit Association's (FTA) bid which was administered through the Hillsborough Area Regional Transit (HART) RFP # 2003-07-01, which has gone through their competitive bidding process, for the purchase of two buses (35 feet in length) from the Gillig Corporation at the unit price of \$305,098.00 each for a grand total price of \$610,196.00 for the two buses for the Lee County Transit Division. This purchase is 100% federally funded by the Federal Transit Administration.
- 2. WHAT ACTION ACCOMPLISHES: The purchase of these buses will replace current vehicles that have exceeded their useful life. Also by utilizing the Florida Transit Association bid, Lee County will be able to have the buses built and delivered in a timely fashion, which will allow Lee Tran to continue to provide high quality transit service.
- 3. MANAGEMENT RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends approval.

This is an Indefinite Delivery Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) contract, with specific minimum and maximum quantities for each size of transit coach as shown in PART IV.

The contract awarded hereunder shall be for the purchase of heavy duty diesel powered ADA compliant transit coaches meeting the minimum specifications contained in Part III herein.

1.6 Knowledge of Conditions

- c) The proposer must have the necessary facilities and financial resources to complete the contract in a satisfactory manner and within the required time.
- d) The proposer must certify that it has not divulged to, discussed or compared his proposal with other proposers and has not colluded with any proposer or parties to a proposal whatsoever.
- e) The proposer must certify that it and its subcontractors are not in arrears to HART and or any of the named Procuring Agencies upon debt or contract and are not a defaulter, as surety or otherwise, upon any obligation to HART and or any of the named Procuring Agencies
- f) The proposer must certify that no officer or employee or person whose salary or compensation for services is or has been payable in the past two (2) years in whole or in part from HART is or shall be or become interested directly or indirectly in this proposal or in the award or performance of the contract for the supplying of the aforesaid, and other related items, or in any portion of the profits or price therefore.

1.15 Proposal Withdrawal

Proposals must remain valid for not less than 45 days after the time/date set for proposal receipt. Prior to that time/date, proposals may be modified or withdrawn by the proposer's authorized representative in person or by written or telegraphic notices received in HART's office at 4305 East 21st Avenue, Tampa, Florida 33605. After that time/date, proposals may not be withdrawn for 45 calendar days. In the event of a protest, in no case will the running of this 45 calendar day period be tolled for more than 90 calendar days.

The price(s) of any buses or equipment ordered by the Procuring Agency after the initial ninety (90) day firm/fixed price period shall be that quoted (Base Order Prices) plus any escalation which will be calculated based on the following formula which utilizes the U.S. Department of Labor/Bureau of Labor Statistics Producer Price Index ("PPI") Category 1413, "Trucks and Bus Bodies". The escalation in this index will be used to adjust the Base Order Prices. However, in no event will the prices for any purchase order release exceed, by more than 5%, the price(s) that would have been in effect twelve (12) months prior to the date of the release if the base price of the date of the purchase order release is less than twelve (12) months after the initial contract award.

EXAMPLE:

CONSORTIUM agency awarded its contract in July 2003, and has received its initial order of buses. In August 2004, CONSORTIUM agency elects to purchase more buses for delivery in 2005. The published data for PPI-Category 1413 shows an index value of 141.1 in August 2004 (Future Award Month). The index for July 2003 (Base Award Month) was 137.6. The percentage change in the index values from July 2003 to August 2004 would be 2.54%. The buses ordered in August 2004 would be priced 2.54% higher than the base award price. This example assumes that the August 2004 order contained no significant equipment modification when compared with the original order.

Significant Equipment Modifications. 3. The Trolley Conversion specification will be determined between CCC and Lee Tran. It will be CCC's responsibility to complete the work required under their agreement with Lee Tran. Payment to Gillig by Lee Tran will not be delayed due to any fault in or delay of the work contracted through CCC

2.47 Assignability

Assignability of rights to others for purchases under this contract may be unilaterally assigned by HART. HART will not assign rights without the prior concurrence of the FPTA subject to their then existing policies, rules and procedures. Any assignee under this contract will act solely as a Procuring Agency and only as specifically authorized by HART.

2.48 Bonds

Upon receipt of an order under this contract, the contractor shall provide the Procuring Agency a performance bond or irrevocable letter of credit in the amount of 100% of the order price. The performance bond or irrevocable letter of credit shall be delivered to the Procuring Agency within ten (10) calendar days after the receipt of purchase order

2.49 Bid Protest Procedure (Authority: HART Resolution 99-08-47)

- (1) These rules provide procedures for speedy resolution of protests arising from the procurement process. Contracts not subject to competitive bidding or contracts awarded pursuant to an emergency declaration or other emergency procedure are not subject to these bid protest rules. The Authority reserves the right to waive any minor bid informalities or irregularities which do not go to the heart of the bid or prejudice other bidders, or to reject any and all bids submitted. Conditional bids or those which take exception to the specifications may be considered non-responsive and may be rejected.
- (2) PROTESTS.
- (a) Any person adversely affected by a bid solicitation shall file a notice of protest, in writing, prior to the date on which bids are to be received and shall file a formal written protest within ten days after filing the notice of protest. The formal written protest shall state with particularity the facts and law upon which the protest is based.
- (b) Any person adversely affected by the decision of the Authority or its management to award a contract or to reject all bids shall file a notice of protest, in writing, within 72 hours after the posting of the bid tabulations or within 72 hours after receipt of the notice of award is made to the participating bidders, whichever occurs first, and shall file a formal written protest within ten days after filing the notice of protest. The formal written protest shall state with particularity the facts and the law upon which the protest is based.
- (c) All notices of protest and formal protest shall be filed with the Executive Director for the Hillsborough Area Regional Transit Authority at the Authority's office located at 4305 East 21st Avenue, Tampa, FL 33605. Filing is completed upon receipt by the Executive Director.
- (d) A protest is not timely filed unless both the notice of protest and the formal protest are received by the Executive Director of the Authority within the required time limits.
