Whereas: A healthy and productive community is essential to the mission of Lee County's ability to

successfully promote and protect the health and safety of all of its citizens; and

Whereas: An unhealthy lifestyle by Lee County citizens can erode our most important asset - the

people in our communities; and

Whereas: More than 55% of all adults in Lee County are overweight or obese and 8% of all adults in

Lee County having been told they have diabetes. Further, 14.4% of high school students

were at risk for overweight, and an additional 8.9% were overweight in 2002; and

Whereas: Only 40.9% of adults in Lee County report engaging in regular, sustained physical activity

on all or most days of the week; and

Whereas: 37.8% of adults in Lee County report not eating the recommended five or more servings of

fruit and vegetables each day; and

Whereas: Citizens who are engaged in health promoting habits are less likely to develop the chronic

conditions of heart disease, stroke, lung cancer, chronic obstructive lung disease, and

diabetes, that account for 56.4% of all causes of death in Lee County; and

Whereas: Much of the chronic disease burden is preventable; effective prevention measures exist

today to substantially curtail the illnesses, disabilities, and unnecessary or early deaths

caused by these diseases; and

Whereas: The direct and indirect costs of obesity-related disease in 2001 nationally were

approximately \$117 billion, further obesity-related medical expenditures for adults in Florida total over \$.39 billion in 2003, with over half of the costs being financed by

Medicare and Medicaid; and

Whereas: The implementation of a wellness event can benefit residents by improving their physical

health and morale; and

Whereas: Physical activity is beneficial to the academic success of Lee County students. A recent

study has shown that higher academic achievement is associated with higher levels of fitness and students who meet minimum fitness levels in three or more fitness areas showed the

greatest gains in academic achievement.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE Board of County Commissioners of Lee County, Florida do hereby encourage all residents to set goals to improve their health and wellness as
